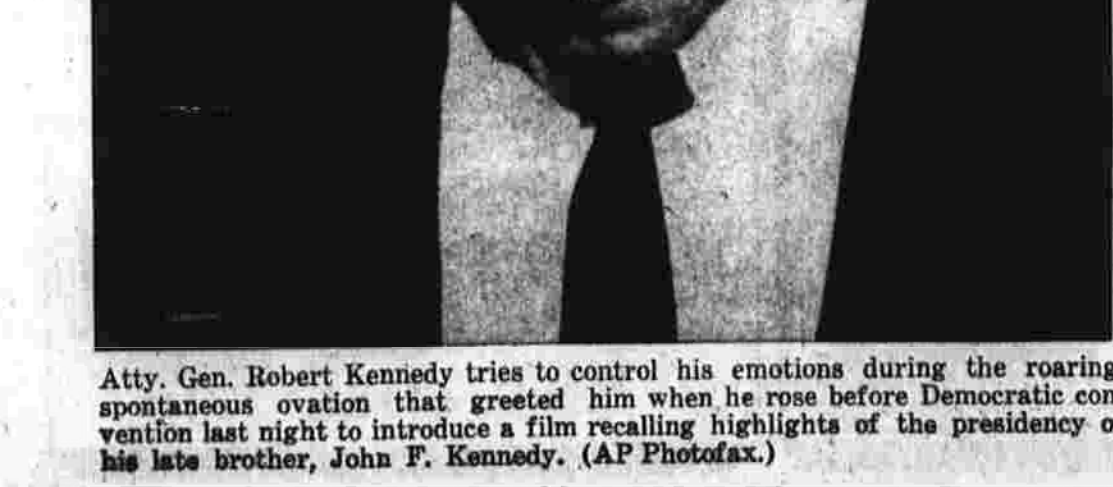
# LBJ and Humphrey Forging Campaign

The Big Top Issue. Our transition to the word "corn" provides a fitting and graceful way into the "live" part of last night's program. The redoubtable candidate for vice president, Senator Hubert Humphrey, is the most obvious corn and ham man of the lot; even on those many occasions when he deals in what might be some non-partisan truth, he cannot resist implementing such truth with the added grandeur of the soap box.

From Senator Humphrey up to President Johnson himself was a gentle step upward, from the uninhibited glories of the soap box to the greater dignity of the resounding platitude. Never in the history of the American Presidency have so many platitudes received such loving utterance from one single individual.

Yet here again, back with the living, the observer of last night's convention had, in the end, to shove aside some portion of the usual cynicism. For a platitude can be a truth, and the fact that a truth ought to be self-evident does not disgrace the truth. And sometimes the strident confusions of a time or an era make some simple statement and application of what ought to be an obvious truth a valuable and important thing.

So, last night, President Johnson, in one passage of his speech, transposed all the issues of the year into one dominating issue more important than liberal or conservative, Democratic or Republican, Johnson or Goldwater—the issue of whether the forces and concepts of common decency are to hold top and deciding position in American life or yield to the tensions and cheapness and poison so besetting a part of our time. The President himself, as he plays his role in the campaign to come, and as he exercises his duties at Washington, will have much to say about just how big and free he chooses the concepts and forces of decency get, and about the direction in which such concepts and forces will turn for their final decision at the polls in November. But that is the great dominating issue high above everything else in the campaign there is no doubt. The self-respect as a people and as a nation. 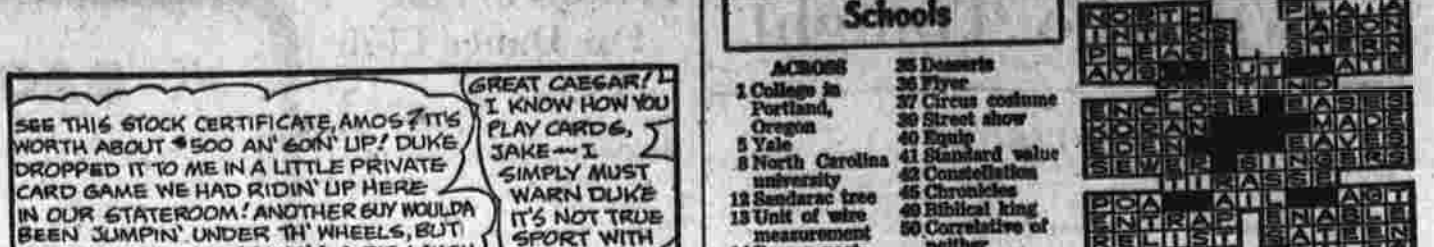

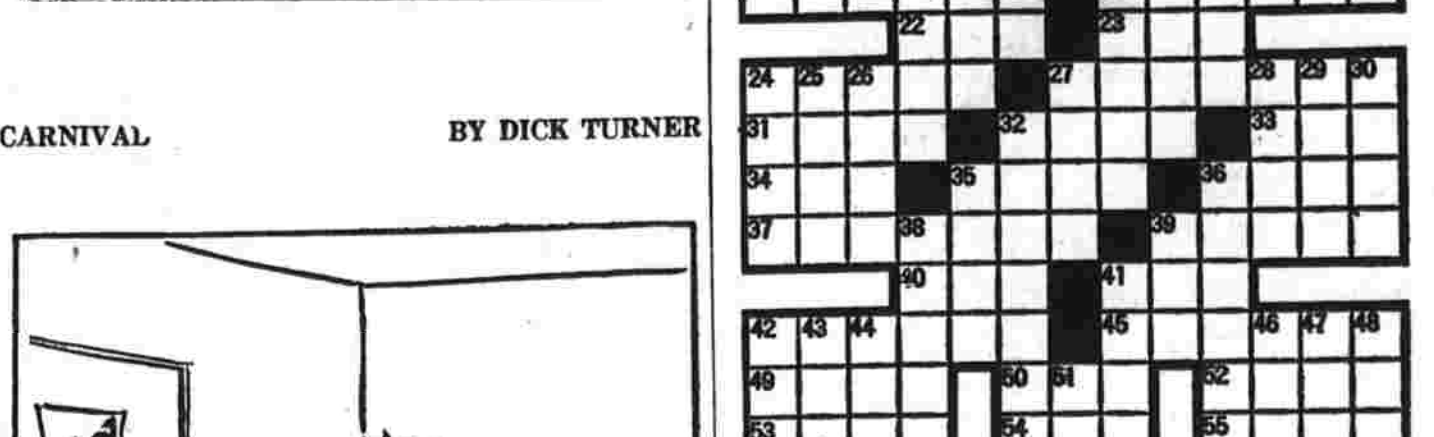

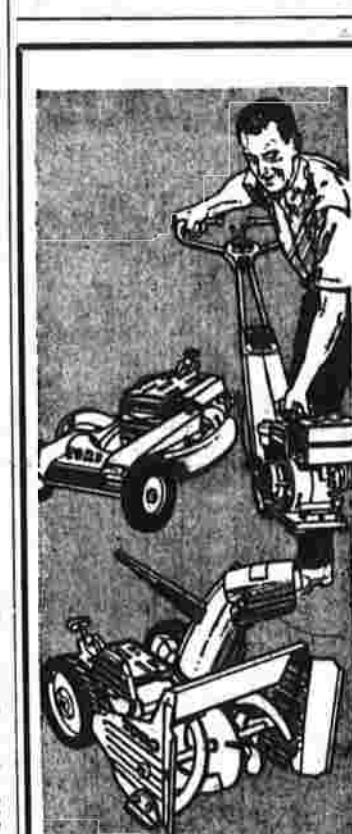
