We Expect No Courtesies

"The best than can immediately be oped for in Vietnam," solemnly sugrests the Christian Science Monitor, "is hat the situation there can be contained until after the presidential election in the United States."

This is indeed a thoughtful suggestion and we hope it commends itself to the students, to the generals, and to the ommunist guerrillas over in South

the courtesies the normalities of the American political process can expect from people abroad.

We can remember that Britain and France, our best friends, handed President Eisenhower the hot potato of the Bues orisis just a few days before we went to the polls in 1956. Before that, we can remember that the Chinese Communists were rude enough to cross the Yalu River into North Korea just in time to give American voters something to think about on their way to the polls in 1950. After that, we can remember that the Russians were rude enough to shoot down an American spy plane just before the political conventions of 1960. And, for that matter, the students in Saigon didn't seem very anxious to cooperate with the fact that the administration in Washington wanted a week off in order the City.

So, although one might think or hope that events abroad would somehow prove onsiderate enough to simmer down and be quiet while we get through with our own necessary domestic political chores, we have small basis for really expecting such cooperation.

And even if there should be such cooperation abroad, it is part of our own political process not to accept it. Whoever is out of power has to find a power struggle or a war which is being dismally lost, an enemy who is growing perpetually and threateningly stronger, a erisis which demands some unspecified but instant solution. So if all the foreign situations of an election year should quiet down, one of the candidates at home would still have to try to stir something up, and make us all feel threatened by some immediate emergency. If 'the students of South Vietnam hadn't been cooperating last week to provide drama and tension to rival our own domestic political news, one of our candidates stood ready to take up the slack. He was warning that, if we gotiated peace in Vietnam. What could even the guerrillas threaten that would be worse than that?

A Real Toughie

While everybody, including Senator ldwater himself, seems urgently concerned over the possibility of rather explosive interchange of ideas and principles between Goldwater and some of the more dangerous elements surviving in German national life, along comes a French general and makes everybody

else look relatively tame. It is General Charles Ailleret, President de Gaulle's chairman of the French Chiefs of Staff who, in a lecture to the staff college of NATO, who provides the kind of stuff on which real red blood everywhere can feed its fancy. General Ailleret was lecturing on a

reneral's dream problem, that of what do in the event the Russians should uddenly attack Western Europe. And what General Ailleret offered as the product of his own military science applied to such a problem was forthright and definite.

Rather than try to parry the Russian ffensive and stake everything on stoping its forward progress somewhere on the continent of Europe, the French general would answer the Russian attack by ching a complete nuclear smash at werything in Russia.

This would be the massive reprisal designed not only to make Russia sorry, but to destroy Russia's capacity to keep on functioning as a nation.

Thus President de Gaulle's general

Dulles used to talk when he first became Secretary of State.

Mr. Dulles later came to indulge himself in all kinds of uncertainties. General Ailleret, at the moment, has only two, only one of which he concedes. The French geenral concedes it might be something of a delicate problem, defining just how much of a Russian

movement could be judged adequate provocation for the nuclear blast on Mos-The other uncertainty is one no French general could ever be expected to admit, or any secretary of state, or even any commentator, for that matter, It is the uncertainty over whether Russia really wants, or has ever really wanted, in all this cold war phase of history, to launch an attack on Western Europe. The presumption has always been, in every quarter, by every analysis, that of course Russia has been dying to attack Western Europe, so much so that only the atomic bomb has stopped her. Just about everything everybody does or thinks is based on the assumption that Russia would attack if Russia could, and our whole Western scheme of life and thought would collapse if we ever

As for the French general says, it is probably going to be impossible to halt the first phases of the Russian attack by meeting it out in the field. The way to fight this kind of war, in the war colleges, is thus and so.


