364 Voters Join Lists

The results and effects of Saturday's all-day, voter-making session drew opposite comments this morning from the chairmen of Manchester's two town committees; jubilation from the Democrats, unconcern from the Republicans.

Of the total of 364 new voters signed up in a 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. session, 173 became Democrats, 84 became Republicans, and 107 were unaffiliated.

Democratic Town Chairman Ted Cummings said, "The results were most gratifying, not only because of the great effort that we put into it, but also because it seems to prove that the national Goldwater-Miller ticket is our greatest ally."

"Since even the Independents outregistered the Republicans, we can see proof that their own people are not rushing out to enroll and to vote for the kind of leadership the Republican Party displays at every level."

GOP Chairman Francis Dellapera said, "I see nothing significant about the figures. They merely cut our registration margin of approximately 1,400 to about 1,300."

"We will continue to work hard to gain voter registration, and we can see proof that their own people are not rushing out to enroll and to vote for the kind of leadership the Republican Party displays at every level."

The latest town registration totals show that the unaffiliated voters will be the deciding factors in the coming elections.

Their 4,284 votes are more than triple the 1,281 lead now held by the Republicans, the smallest lead in Manchester's history.
