See Premier Pressing War Against Reds

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States welcomed today the quick collapse of the antigovernment military uprising in South Viet Nam and officials said Premier Nguyen Khanh should now be able to get on rapidly with plans to press the war against Communist guerrillas.

Secretary of State Dean Rusk summed up official reaction here, saying "I am pleased that the trouble is over and that the government can now get on with its main tasks."

Officials said Khanh faces two urgent tasks in the immediate future. One is to launch a military, political and economic offensive against Red Viet Cong. The other is to set up within the next two months a provisional government charged with responsibility for giving South Viet Nam a new constitutional order.

Rusk signaled the belief that the crisis is eased by leaving Washington on a speechmaking trip to Detroit, a long-scheduled date that the accident, events in Saigon had shifted to tentative status. He spoke briefly with newsmen at the airport.

While Rusk was in Detroit, the State Department announced that on his return he would have a news conference. Rusk evidently wanted an opportunity to discuss U.S.-Vietnamese policy and answer questions raised by the short-lived uprising.

Rusk had his last news conference last Thursday. His normal pattern has been to have a full-scale, on the record meeting with reporters Monday.

The attempted coup came so suddenly that it caught American policy makers, including Ambassador Maxwell D. Taylor, by surprise. Startled officials hastened to their departments Sunday morning to find out what was happening.

Nothing like this had been foreshadowed during a Friday review of the Vietnamese situation which Taylor held with President Johnson, Secretary of State Dean Rusk, Defense Secretary Robert S. McNamara and other authorities.
