Talking Replaces Tear Gas On Cambridge, Md. Streets

CAMBRIDGE, Md. (AP)—Citizens to Baltimore, where friendly persuasion has replaced tear gas on the streets of Cambridge, where racial tensions kept National Guard troops on duty for more than a year.

The Guard still is represented by a detachment composed solely of Capt. William A. Harris.

The work of the 44-year-old Negro has been so impressive his tour of duty has been extended twice, and Harris now is to remain until after the November elections.

Gov. J. Millard Tawes agreed in the latest extension, requested by Democratic County State Attorney Andrew C. Thompson and by Charles W. Miles, who heads a special commission named by Tawes to promote interracial harmony in the community of 12,000.

Harris was relieved as deputy U.S. marshal at the request of Maryland Atty. Gen. Thomas B. Finan and sent to Cambridge May 19 as a member of Gen. George Odium's staff. His assignment: Work with the Negro community to find out their chief desires and needs.

When the last troops were removed July 11, one week after the federal civil rights law was enacted, Miles asked the governor to keep Harris in Cambridge as a liaison man between the white and Negro communities.

"Capt. Harris is like a chemical catalyst," says Maurice Rimpso, editor of the Cambridge Banner.

"If someone like him had been here two years ago to keep open the lines of communication, we may never had had serious racial trouble in Cambridge. He speaks the language of both sides."

During the day, Harris literally lives in the streets, where he can reach more people. He has a budding acquaintance with many residents. Some call him by name; others wave as he passes.

Harris organized Boy Scout troops and recreational activities last summer to keep Negro youths off the streets. They were active in demonstrations last year. He also conducted trips to Baltimore and Washington, and attended by integrated groups of high school football players from Cambridge.

But his work hasn't been confined to the youngsters. Harris took a group of Negro senior

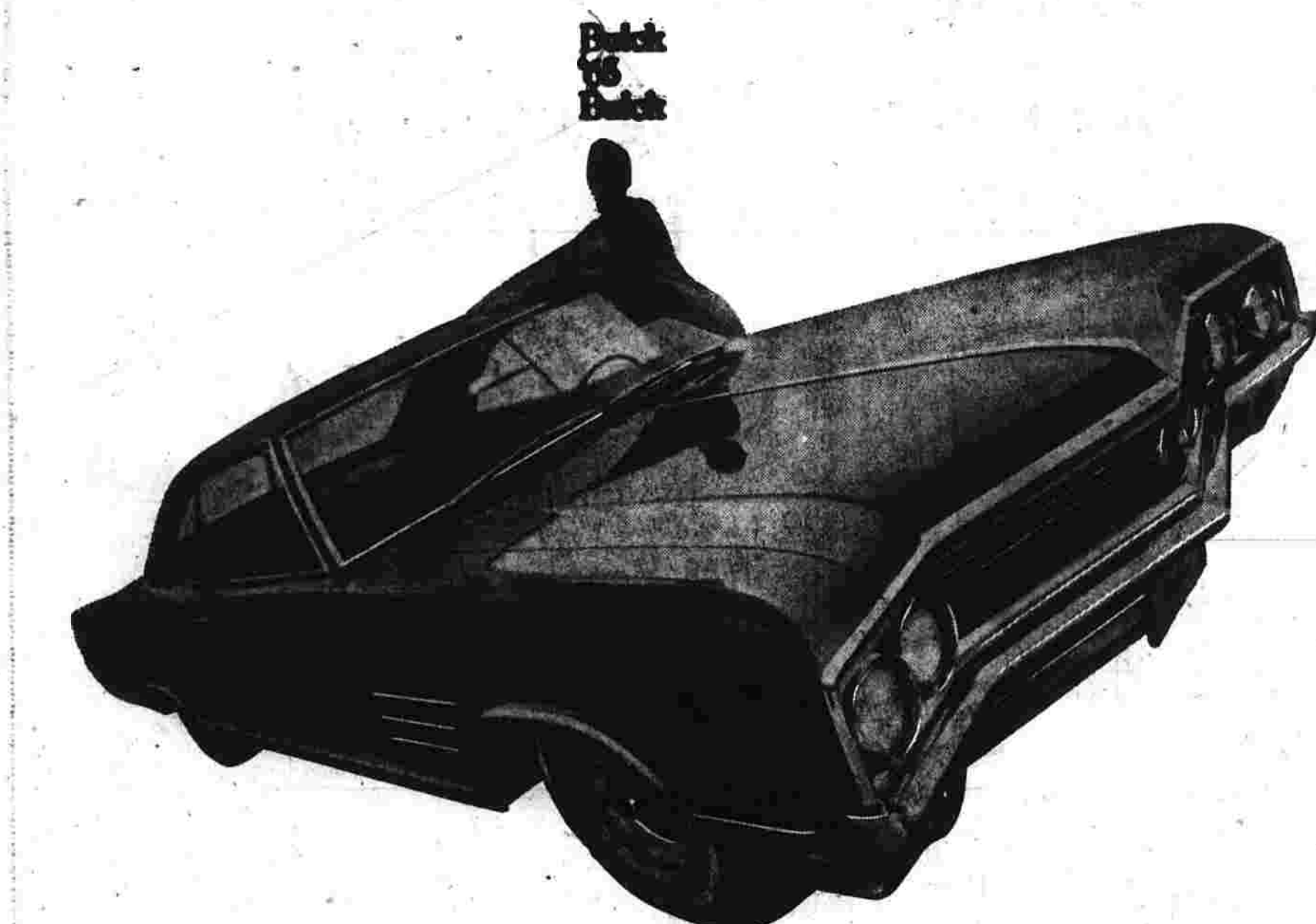

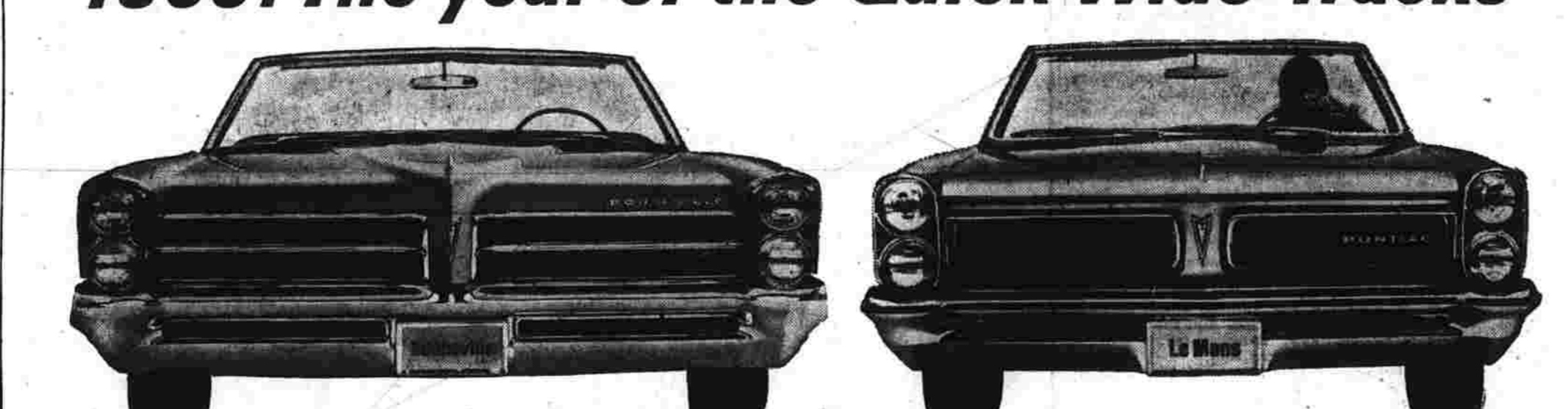

Four-Country Road System To Open Peru's Jungle Land

LIMA, Peru (AP) — A pre-emptive network of highways penetrating the heart of South America is expected to open up thousands of square miles of rich, unsettled jungle land to modern pioneers.

The roads, part of the South American highway system, are under construction or in the final planning stages in Colombia, Ecuador, Peru and Bolivia.

They will connect the four countries and cross the Andes to fertile, undeveloped lands on the eastern slopes of the Continental Divide.

When the 15-year project is completed, vehicles can go in a matter of hours to points that today require days of strenuous and dangerous travel.

Many South American capitals are modern and bustling, but because of a lack of roads the countries' interiors usually are backward and forgotten.

Inaccessible regions hold tremendous wealth both above and below the surface.

One American engineer compares the road project with the extension of the railroads in the U.S. West a century ago.

Helping the countries finance the roads are the U.S. government, the Export-Import Bank and the Inter-American Development Bank.

Here is a rundown: Colombia — A preliminary study is under way for a 1,800-mile highway are paved.

Peru — Construction is expected to start within a few months on the first paved highway across the Andes in the northern part of the country.

Bolivia — The 250-mile road is expected to cost \$47 million.

Only 20 per cent of Peru's 23,000 miles of highway are paved.

Officials predict the new roads will help integrate six million Indians into the national life.

The Indians are more than 50 per cent of the nation's 11 million population.

Bolivia — The marginal jungle highway project for this undeveloped country is still under study.

The Bolivia section will be approximately 1,200 miles long and will start at Cochabamba in the northwest corner of the country.

It will extend southward to Tapacalpa in the center of the nation, and from there it will branch out.

Of Bolivia's 12,000 miles of roads, only 20 are paved.

Some road construction is well under way and will help develop regions suitable for bananas, citrus fruits, yucca, rice, coconuts, avocados and peanuts, as well as truck farming, livestock breeding and lumber.
