Since January 1962 there have been some 75 bombings and set fires in Chicago business firms.
New York City fire officials investigated 589 fires during 1963 that they termed suspicious and another 485 known incendiany cases including many for ary cases including many for motives other than profit — revenge, mischief, pyromania.

But it is a clue to the effectiveness of the professional torch that, of all the investigations there were only six contons, there were only six con-victions of persons for setting fires to collect insurance. Also, say the investigators, the number of fires they know or suspect of being arson for profit is probably only a fraction of the actual total. The reason is that the professional torch knows how to set a fire so that it looks accidental, and fire tends to destroy the evidence of its origin.

January 1963, fires known to have been set caused more than \$144 million if property losses, a little more than 3 per cent of total losses. A big chunk of the figure was arson for profit—perhaps the greatest part.

Many South American capitals are modern and bustling, but because of a lack of roads the countries' interiors usually are a backward and forgotten. Inaccessible regions hold tremendous wealth both above and below the surface.

A new road between Quito, the inland capital, and Guaya-quil, the big banana river port on the Pacific, reduces travel time from 18 to seven hours.

Officials estimate that each new mile of all-weather road built in Ecuador means 380 justices of land that can be lated to be a surface.






