The culmination came Tuesday when, according to Walsh, the real estate agent who sold him the house evicted the pair and rented the apartment to two white men.

But Walsh, who admits he purchased the house to integrate the neighborhood, said he would go to court and ask that the white tenants be evicted.

"We don't want them. They have their own neighborhood. Let them stay there," one man said. Demonstrators expressed their resentment freely, but were hostile to newsmen and declined to be identified.

Residents of the area are primarily of Lithuanian, Polish and Irish extraction. They say they resent what they feel is an organized attempt to force integration on them.

The Federal Reserve system has been one of the suppliers of the money and credit that has been readily available during the long business upturn. And, Alfred Hayes, president of the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, says this has made a valuable contribution to the economic expansion.

But he adds: "The question could be raised whether continued increases on the scale of recent years might not be a little too generous even from a domestic point of view," let alone the still unsolved problem of the international payments deficit.

"Efforts to reduce the United States payments deficit have made notable progress in some directions, but we still have a considerable way to go before reach equilibrium," Hayes says today in the bank's October Re-





"I have served in many as-pects of the government in town," the mayor said, "and I have observed that it is almost impossible to accomplish anything under the present setup."

Mayor Flaherty charged that if consolidation had been passed when it was first brought up, fusing government and the mul-tiple taxes of the three town

explain the contents of the charter and to answer questions about it.

Mayor Flaherty said that the one single important point of consolidation is that it would

"get rid of three governments which will enable us to attract business and industry." Earlier, Nat N. Schwedel, treasurer of Amerbell Corp., the town's largest employer, noted that all the taxes col-lected from homeowners in the town is not enough to pay for the public school systems in Wernon.

Mayor Flaherty said that, under the present tri-government setup, people "keep coming to the city seeking services are the town. They are ing to the city seeking services provided by the town. They are usually confused." He said that people trying to obtain services are often shuffled between town hall and city hall because they often start at the wrong place. Mayor Flaherty admitted he is disturbed by the "tremendous ground swell against consolidation" in the city and predicted that consolidation would lose "by about three to one." He noted that during one

of the two previous consolida-tion efforts, city residents ap-proved consolidation by about 10 to one. proved consolidation by about 10 to one.

The mayor said that banks, which often pay taxes of mortgaged homes, "are not too happy with the prospect of having to pay taxes quarterly in Vernon because of bookkeeping costs," but he said he was sure that the transitional tax burden and tax collections generally would be made due in quarterly payments by the board of representatives "because of the needs and pressures of the taxpayers."

Selectman Daigle noted that without consolidation the area would continue to struggle with the same problems they now have, "and they'll get worse in the future," he predicted. "With consolidation, there would be a way to solve these problems. Daigle also noted that the charter contains provisions so that it may be changed if it becomes necessary.

Meyors Elaberty stressed that

Mayor Flaherty stressed that consolidation would enable the city to maintain its same form of government.

"We would retain all the "We would retain all the things we have, and obtain some things we don't have," he said, "taxes would be reduced, and we would have a more responsive government."

In discussing the opposition by some aldermen to consolidation, Mayor Flaherty said that in the past, the aldermen have never "been strong" for consolidation.

"The people they represent are satisfied with the present government and don't want to change when they're not sure of what is going to happen," the mayor said "Aldermen do not have as much contact with the overall problems of government or as much contact between governments as I have
