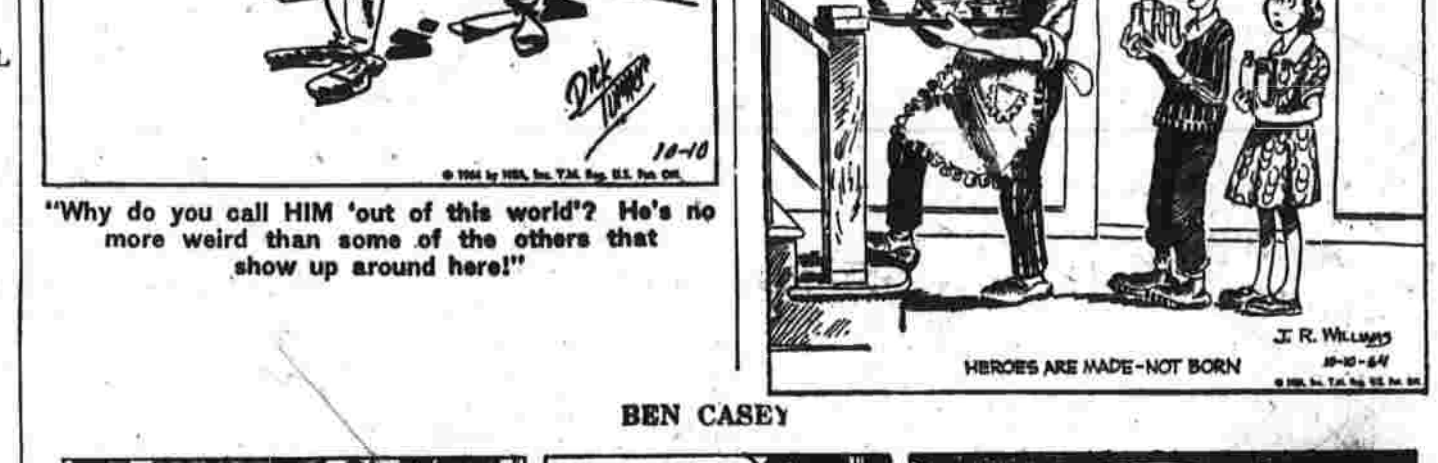
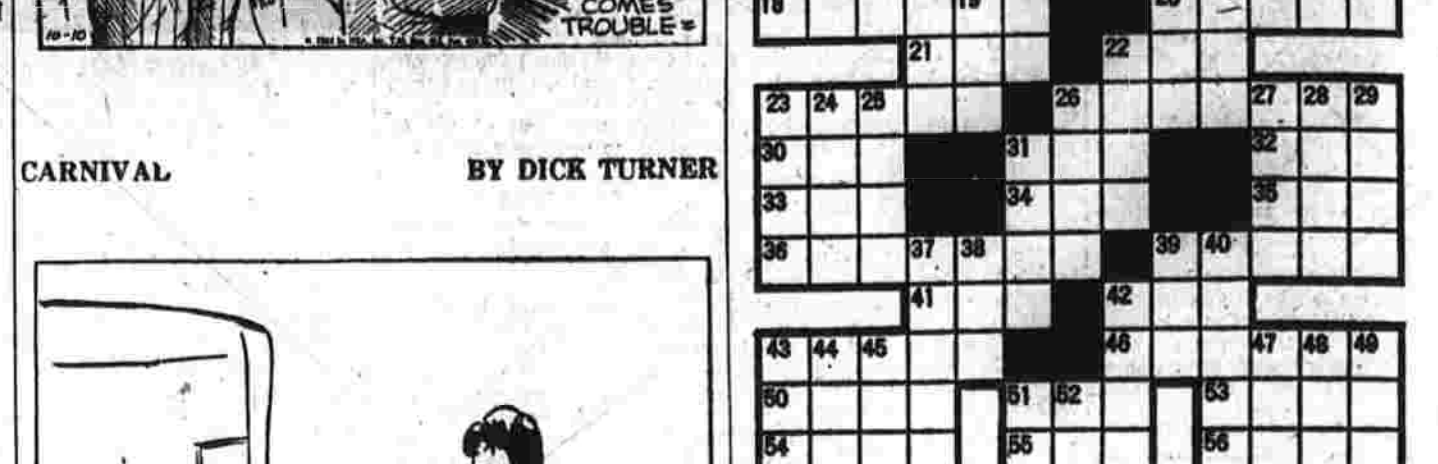
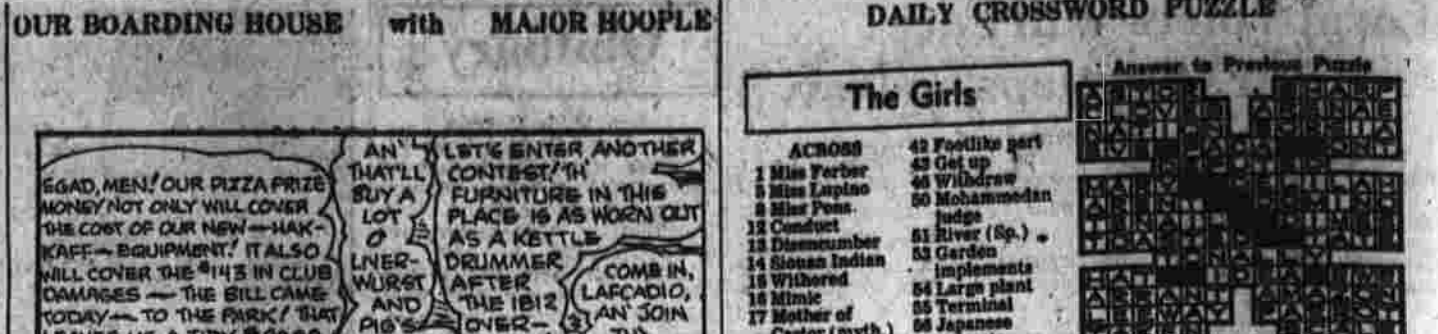

The vacancies that occur on the other boards and agencies will be filled to retain Democratic control. The GOP will only nominate whatever appointments are necessary to guarantee minority representation.

ern whistle-stop tour. "I have done all that I know how to treat all Americans equally, just and fair," he said.

His second reference was in his text, which he read, at the fund-raising dinner: "Prosperity must know no Mason-Dixon line and opportunity must know no color line."

That brought prolonged applause.

A bit later, having finished with his text, Johnson ad-libbed: "Whatever your views are, we have a Constitution, and we have a Bill of Rights, and we have the law of the land. And two-thirds of the Democrats in the Senate voted for it, and three-fourths of the Republicans. I signed it, and I am going to enforce it, and I am going to observe it. And I think any man that is worthy of the high office of president is going to do the same thing."

Aiming his remarks directly at Southerners, Johnson went on: "There is only one real big problem that faces you. It is not an economic problem, and it is not the Negro problem. The only problem that faces you is whether you are going to live or die and whether your family is going to live or die."

He said a nuclear war would cost 300 million lives "in a matter of moments."

Early Sunday he will fly to Phoenix, Ariz., home town of Barry Goldwater, to attend Presbyterian Church services. He'll fly then on to Long Beach and San Francisco, Calif., and Las Vegas, Nev., for speech making.

Monday will see him visiting Reno, Nev., Butte, Mont., Casper, Wyo., Denver, and Boise, Idaho before returning to Washington.

Fickleness May Be Ruin For 'Peyton'

NEW YORK (AP) — Television's most daring experiment these days is on ABC and is called "Peyton Place" after a book of the same name. The daring, however, is not in the subject matter nor in the format, which is good, gray soap. It is the fact that "Peyton Place" must have a completely faithful audience to survive — and the night-time television audience is notoriously fickle.

The series had its premiere Sept. 16. Other pressing television-viewing chores kept me away from that emotion-tossed New England community for three weeks. But when I returned Tuesday night, it was obvious that I was a stranger in town.

Why had Constance MacKenzie, who had been showing signs of being neurotically possessive about her daughter Allison, suddenly become so reconciled to her daughter's interest in handsome Rod, who acts like a spoiled bouncer? Where did Constance meet Dr. Rossi and is it a romance? Why is Betty trying so frantically to tell something important to Rod? Why does he ignore her?

It was all completely incomprehensible to one who had not been curled up with ABC every Tuesday and Thursday for the past three weeks.

The soap opera pace — leisurely and slow — is unusual in evening television, whose shows usually move right into the post-tell-it-fast-and-wind-it-up-before-the-last-commercial. In "Peyton Place" the characters amble along by way of long, introspective conversations and meaningful looks.

Tuesday night, for instance, Rod the bouncer took Allison out to a local lovers' lane where, they started talking about nature and the meaning of life. It was pretty boring for a stranger in town.

Low-budget serials seen on daytime television are necessarily short on action and long on dialogue because it is less expensive that way.

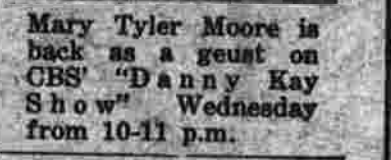

Hopes High (By Backer) For Pay TV
BOLLYWOOD (AP) — How does Subscription Television? Not well, reports the Wall Street Journal.
Results are encouraging, says Sylvester (Pat) Weaver, president of the pay-television venture.
Subscription Television launched its ambitious California program two months ago by hooking up patrons in Santa Monica — and later, San Francisco — for shows of big league baseball, culture, Broadway plays and year-old movies.
The Wall Street Journal reported last week that the firm had topped off 142 of its 190 sales people, that orders were lagging, and that subscribers weren't spending as much on programming as anticipated.
Caught in his Santa Monica office between plane trips, last-moving, big-thinking Pat Weaver appeared far from discouraged. He explained that his company had leaped into operation prematurely in order to combat the anti-pay-television forces that are sponsoring proposition 13 on the Nov. 3 California ballot. It would make pay-television "contrary to public policy."
"It's easy to make people afraid of something that doesn't exist," argued Weaver. "That's why we had to get in operation."
Admittedly, he has had disappointments. His star attraction, the San Francisco Giants, ran out of steam. He was not able to acquire brand-new movies, as he hoped. The subscribers in the average income Santa Monica area have not spent as much for shows as expected.
"Pat" that is partly our own doing," said Weaver. "On the one hand we have not had the programming we expected. And we have not promoted the programming as much as we could."
"We would much rather take in less and have a record of no cancellations. So far no installation has been cancelled except for death or moving away."
Weaver said the total of 25,000 sales have been made in the major areas, and 40,000 orders have been received. The cutback in sales personnel was to allow the installations to catch up with sales, he said, as well as to await the outcome of the November election.
He is hopeful that the measure will be defeated, but added he is ready to move \$10 million to \$11 million in hardware to other areas if the vote goes against him. He said numerous cities are interested.

Robert Vaughn Awaits Fame As 'Bonded' Napoleon Solo

AP Movie-TV Writer HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Says Robert Vaughn: "The only advice my mother ever gave me was to be a big star or else get out of the acting business. It wasn't worth it otherwise."

Vaughn just might make it. At least he's off to a good start as the super-spy-super-lover on NBC's "The Man From U.N.C.L.E." This is not Uncle Sam, but a super-national agency designed to stamp out nefarious designs by international troublemakers.

Many critics pointed out the series seemed bottled in bond, and there are indeed similarities to the Ian Fleming novels; outrageous plots, susceptible beauties, a super-evil agency named Thrush (James Bond's nemesis is Smerch). But then, Bond borrowed from Sam Spade, Spade from Sherlock Holmes, etc. And the late Fleming had a hand in shaping the series.

The similarity doesn't bother Vaughn, the intrepid Napoleon Solo of U.N.C.L.E. "I never read the Fleming novels," he says, "but I did see the two movies ('Dr. No,' 'From Russia With Love') and I hope we are compared to them."

Nor does Vaughn seem dissuaded from fulfilling the positive side of his mother's advice. His hopes for the series: "To make me the biggest star in the business."

He figures this is his best chance. He started acting when he was 11; both his parents were in the business — "but working actors who had to work about where the next job was coming from."

That has never been a concern of Vaughn's.

"I got my first contract with Hecht-Lancaster and Columbia two months after I got out of college," he says. "I've been under contract or working ever since. He's now 31. The parts have grown better and the pay higher. So except for that first two months, I haven't really suffered."

But he nearly got sidetracked from his aim. He drew an Academy award nomination for his drunk in "The Young Philadelphians" and that seemed to type him as a character actor. Then he spent a miserable season last year as second banana

to Gary Lockwood's "Lieutenant," escaping when the show was dropped. "The part of Solo is just what I wanted," Vaughn enthuses. "It puts me right in the leading-man category, which is there I want to be."
