





As Faces Change

Nobody has yet been able to devise any standard system for establishing the uccession to an absolutist dictator. sometimes the dictator is deposed and assassinated by those who have been gathering up his power. Sometimes he dies, and his death is the signal for a scramble. But since a dictatorship, unlike an absolutist monarchy, has no sucpession legally predetermined by a blood elationship, history has almost no intances of a dictator himself deciding he should give up the reins of power and pens them on to another.

Yesterday's events in Moscow apparsaily did not provide any such instance, either: Nikita Khrushchev was apparently pushed. And as Kremlin history, or any history of an absolutist regime goes, It can be many months before we know precisely what forces pushed Khrushchev and why. And it can be years before we know what forces and what individual ave emerged holding the power Khrushchev himself once held.

Even the most skilled analysts, then, ake their marks and their appeals tolay because they are interesting, or besuse they seem to attain a cartain consistency in their reasoning and selection of detail to be emphasized.

But we will not trust even the best of om when they theorize that there is much significance in the identity of the two individuals who have succeeded Khrushchev in his two posts.
