A Nation Fears Its President Various dispatches and reports from Washington underline what is getting to be this nation's number one fear. It is the fear of what President Lyn-

don Johnson may do next.

The Evans and Novak "Inside Report" on this page the other day offered a picture of a President who seemed about to end all restraints on his search for a crushing military victory in Vietnam, and to stop even pretending to consider alternatives.

The same day the Wall Street Journal, in a special report on "The War President," drew the conclusion that henceforth Mr. Johnson would have no time for visits to the Pope, but would be frankly and openly busy doing nothing but fighting the war harder and harder. the Journal article speculated on some of the things he might be found doing, from this time on, it uncovered some of the elements in this nation's growing fear of what it may expect from its own President.

He is considered likely to ask for more money, and more men, and to demand a tax increase, not to cope with inflation. but to finance a much larger and more

He is believed to be considering, in the event the enemy wins a victory at Khesanh, or renews attack on the cities, asking Congress for a declaration of war, in the hope that that would at last stience his critics and pull his nation together and enable him to impose a full ensorship so that the ugly side of the war wouldn't get quite so much public-

It is cited that the President himself has already given full advance signal of his determination, his fierce resolve, by his prompt dispatch of the first 10,500 nforcements for General Westmoreland, by his personal authorization of new bombing targets in North Vietnam's cities, and by his heavier-than-ever use, down at Dallas of the theme in which he has been trying to wrap himself for many months: "No falling of our fighting sons. No betrayal of those who fight beside us. No breaking of our trusted commitments. No weakening of will that would encourage the enemy and prolong

The summing up of this prospect says that the President who has never hitherto failed to act in the direction of escalation at every moment of choice and decision in the long Vietnam conflict, but who has hitherto always sought to preserve the appearance of reluctance and comparative restraint, has exhausted his own patience with appearances of restraint, and is now out to give a more dynamic performance than ever, in personal mien at home and in persona push for the battles abroad.

And millions more can say no just by a certain tingle which comes into their own skin whenever they come near some specific contact of their own with the great universal integration the Commission says has to take place, now or

From all the no-saying that almost immediately proved itself still possible, it might be assumed that the Commission had studied and concluded and reported in vain. This would be too great an interpreta

tive leap in the other direction.

This all or nothing, now or never jeremiad from the Commission has not of itself produced its own results. But even if, at first, it merely stands as the instantly available measure of the continuing degree of all our failure, it remains one of the most powerful blows ever struck in the cause of this America's survival as a free America. Of those who still say no to it, both in principle and particular, there are perhaps some who say no more flercely than ever. But among the great majority of no-sayers there is, we would sense, considerable less confidence that it is going to be either right or possible for them to keep on trying to say no. The "yes" that is ultimately to be required of us all is going to tear some of us apart inside surselves; it is going to seem for some of us a breaking down and abandonment of values; it is going to seem something wild and revolutionary for people like us to be doing and saying. But through the angulah and doubt and torture of it we are also going to think

We do not know whether it is now militarily feasible to seek to withdraw from Khesanh's exposed position. But we find much merit in the suggestion, reportedly being urged by some Pentagon officers, that American troops be pulled back from such isolated, underpopulated areas and concentrated in the more heavily dwelt-in parts of the country. This would have the threefold advantage of (a) lengthening the enemy's lines of communication, (b) bunching allied fighting-power rather than spread ing it thin, and (c) giving greater pro-tection to those populated areas which, in the end, will decide the future of

South Vietnam. ly difficult to defend. The allies must work their way through forests and over mountains and into regions where the enemy, at his leisure, can concentrate large opposing forces. Indeed, so strategically unfavorable is the Khesanh location that, for the first time, there have been vague discussions of the possibility of using tactical nuclear weapons on its defense. Such a step would

be a tragic mistake and should be scrupulously avoided. Meanwhile, and given the patently vorsened situation in Vietnam, we again urge Washington to test the results of a halt in the bombing of North Vietnam. United Nations Secretary-General U Thant has grown increasingly insistent that such a halt would quickly result in negotiations on the war. The French Government has now announced that it has "specific information" confirming the Secretary-General's position. Prestdent de Gaulle personally supervised the wording of Paris's statement, which

seems to reflect French feeling that a further step-up in the war would hold creat peril for the world.
