Because of his opportunities and responsibilities as the first of his race to break into big league baseball, the former Dodger hero has devoted much of his career to civic causes, and especially to efforts to give helpful, inspiring stimulation to the young people of the

There will now be no denying, nor cancellation of the good work and the good effect that may have resulted from Jackie Robinson's work among the vouth of America.

But everyone has to be brought up short by the anguish of his own question to himself, in the light of his experience with his own son.

"How," he asked, "can I assume that I have been of help to others when I haven't been able to help my own son?"

He dropped out and enlisted in the Army, and served a year in Vietnam, which may have been where he picked the drug habit. He was wounded When he finished his service, he would have none of his parents and their luxurious home in Stamford. His father's last previous near contact with him had been to leave a message for him at a pool hall he was believed to frequent, asking him to call home, which he didn't do. He had said, according to his father, that "he had to stay away from us and figure it all out."

All of this will be quite familiar to all professional students of the curren American scene-the police, the social workers, the psychiatrists, the proba tion officers, the judges.

It is different only when it comes home to some particular home. Jackie Robinson's humble, anguished confession of his own inadequacy becomes him. So, likewise, does his intention to "stick by him" now, not to deliver him from consequences, but to try to make sure he knows there is still love and hope for him in the world. There ought to be some measure of comfort and reassurance for the father, too. This sort of thing seems to happen for the best-intentioned as well as for the least-intentioned parents. It is an experience shared in some degree of actuality or in some degree of fear by millions of American parents. It is easy to lose one's way when one is trying to lead a child

Play That Is Hard Work

The new weekend behavior of President Johnson indicates that he himself is aware of a national phenomenon discussed in this space the other day-a fear of the leader and what he may be about to do. The President seems to sense that

people are beginning to be afraid that he may be heading into still more desperate policies as a cure for the failure of past policies which have risked too much too desperately, and so he has contrived a pattern of behavior which is designed to reassure us. Suddenly, the most serious and duty-

obsessed man in the world has become a devotee of weekend golf. He likes the game so much he will fly to California for his golf one weekend, and to Puerto Rico the next. Where he once seemed to be preaching that no American, in these tense and trying times, had a right to be lying in the sun while our soldiers were thrashing about in the swamps of Vietnam, now the President makes spectacular proclamation of his own intention of taking a holiday, in which he, theoretically, spends a whole day in the sun doing nothing.

This past weekend he assembled an impressive amount of family for the act, ncluding a photogenic grandson. Of this performance, and its intended esults, one might make two observa-

First, we suspect that this simulated day of play and relaxation is actually, for him as well as for his staff, the hardest work of the Presidential week.

Second, we are not sure how reassuring to a nation which is worried about als poise and balance such a suddenly unbalanced absorption in new weekend routines is going to prove. The sad thing about a leader in Mr.

Johnson's present position commandern-chief of a war which can't be won and which is unpopular anyway-is that it becomes hard for him to do anything right. Whatever he does, there are un friendly analysts to pick it apart. Nor is his playing of various roles, and his shifting from one role to another, anything to be classified with the greatest acting of our time. The one thing that really applies to him consistently is that he tries desperately hard with everything, even his new idea that he must seem capable of play on his weekends in order to prove himself a normal fel-

The American Burden

An important article by Senator J. W Fulbright appeared recently in the "In ternational Herald Tribune." Entitled "Of 'Destiny' and Choice," it can be read as a manifesto for the new isola

Since their nation was born in rebellion against the imperial power of England it has been an article of faith with most Americans that empires are by definition bad. The old isolationists were able to denounce the empire-building of others without a tremor of moral uneasiness. It never occurred to them that the U.S. itself could be suspected of im perial tendencies. The huge expansion of their own heartland, even the acquisition of territory remote from the American continent, could be justified they felt, either as part of the natura order of things or as a necessary conse quence of the Monroe Doctrine.

In attacking the idea that strong nations are fated to become empires. Senator Fulbright has fallen into a determinist trap of his own-that of assuming that empires are fated to be barmful to themselves. The truth is more complex. Sheer exploitation is bad, and so is the maintenance of alien rule for its own sake, or when a majority on the subject population clearly resents it. But there have been, and are, imperial situations of which history can approve and nations, like individual people, are

not always corrupted by power. Common to both the old and the new isolationism is an oversimplified, indiscriminate, rejection of the imperial idea. Senator Fulbright refers with cynicism to the pious phrases that nations have used to justify the exercise of power beyond their own frontiers. But those phrases, even when used hypocritically, have often had some basis in objective truth. The Roman Empire was a major civilizing force whose benefits are still very widely felt, and the same will prob-

> ish and French empires - and of the American. Moreover, the Senator is on doubtful ground when he suggests that great nations have necessarily lost their virtue after taking to empire building. Sometimes it has been the other way round. Athens, Spain, and the Netherlands, for instance, were at their cultural best while their power was most imperial. Elizabethan England was hardly a nation turned in upon itself, yet it achieved a level of all-round creativeness seldom

Seeds from China Developed The Bradford Pear in U.S.

In 1918 the late Frank Meyer, a United States Department of Agriculture plant explorer, collected 100 pounds of seed from pear trees he found growing in the mountains near Ichang, China. He was searching for something that would provide better root-stocks for commercial pear varietites in North America. Meyer died in China. Those seeds which he sent back were used to develop a beautiful flowering shade tree, the Bradford Pear, Pyrus Calleryana Bradford.







An unqualified no was placed upon the storm drainage plan for the 70-acre tract located adjacent to Vernon St., by William O'Neill, town engineer, during executive session of the town planning commission last night. The big issue, according to O'Neill, is that the Bayers have planned only to resolve the runplanned only to resolve the run-off from their own project, leav-ing a danger of flooding from 300 adjacent acres, when they are developed in the future.

O'Neill wants the developers to install larger pipes than the 15" size presently programmed. Atty. Philip Bayer, speaking for the developers, categorically stated to O'Neill and the com-

mission that they would not spend the estimated \$23,000 to do this. Town Planner Joseph Tamsky reported to the commission that the subdivision regulations are not clear as to whether the developer must pay for such a change, but that the commis-sion is bound by the regulation to accept the engineer's disap-proval of the sewer design, hav-ing no choice, but to disapprove the entire subdivision unless matter is resolved. At this time commission chairman, Adler Dobkin, who

PORTALES, N.M. (AP) -A. vate war. His adversary is beargrass and cactus. And he's been fighting for 60 years. "Beargrass and cacti were put here on earth for a curse and the Lord meant for them to be hard to get rid of," Burkett says. "But I think it can be done if a person will stay on the job long enough."

Burkett farms, ranches and runs a dairy herd. With other members of his family, he operates on 640 acres. Burkett sais that beargrass, a plant with spearlike spines,

takes up moisture and crowds out grass in pasture land. He claims that he has seen cows with badly damaged eyes from encounters with the needle-like tried digging, chopping, grub-bing and plowing—with little success. The beargrass thrived when he poured three or four ounces of salt on the major

patches. Kerosene was ineffec-The situation began to change when commercial chemicals powder and liquid form came on the market. He found chemical sprays that would kill cactus

Now he finds that dead cactus in a pasture is about as bad as "The best way to get rid of cacti is to dig them up by the roots and haul them to a place where they can be burned when they get dry," he said. "The best place to pile them is on a rock hill where they can't take root. They surely will if piled on the ground.
"Don't think when you have

killed all the old crop of beargrass and cacti plants that you have finished the job, for you will likely miss a few. And, a new crop of plants will come up next year to further plague
