Rescuers Find Bodies Of 16 Trapped Miners

CALUMET, La. (AP) — Sixteen of 21 coal miners trapped for more than two days 1,200 feet below earth when fire raged through a mine here were found dead Friday. There was no word on whether the other five were alive. The mine is located in a marshy area on the edge of the Gulf of Mexico, accessible only by boat. A large area behind the building covering the shaft was roped off to land helicopters. Officials did not say when any rescues would be made to screens and means from the mine. A rescue crew had gone down the fire-torn mine shaft earlier in the morning, but found no rescue effort.

Heavy Fighting at DMZ; Army General Named

SAIGON (AP) — The U.S. Command today reported savage fighting below the eastern end of the demilitarized zone and announced the appointment of a U.S. Army general to command the Marines and other defenders of the critical northern frontier. U.S. spokesmen also reported the heaviest air strikes against North Vietnam in more than a month. A task force of U.S. Marines and South Vietnamese infantrymen battled 800 Communist troops for seven hours Thursday near Dong Ha, the forward Marine base supplying other allied outposts along the DMZ.

Spellman Successor Named

VATICAN CITY (AP) — Pope Paul VI today named a 67-year-old New Yorker, Auxiliary Bishop Terence James Cooke, to succeed the late Francis Cardinal Spellman as Roman Catholic Archbishop of New York. Archbishop Cooke had been one of Cardinal Spellman's auxiliaries in New York since Sept. 16, 1965. His appointment was a surprise to observers at the Vatican, since his name had not been among those mentioned as a likely successor to Cardinal Spellman. Vatican circles consider him unusually young to be given the richest and most powerful archdiocese in America. Cardinal Spellman died on Dec. 2 at the age of 78. The Most Rev. John J. Maguire, archbishop of Baltimore, was named a successor to the cardinal.

2 Ponder Appeal in Plot Case

NEW HAVEN (AP) — Two men convicted of conspiring to injure policemen and blow up police headquarters and other public buildings here are considering today whether to appeal. A Superior Court jury found Ronald Johnson, 25, and Harry Bonner, 29, guilty Thursday of plotting a reign of terror, which was discovered last year by local authorities. After deliberating for 4 1/2 hours, the panel of ten men and two women also acquitted two other New Haven men charged with plotting the plot. They are Curtis Belton, 22, and Willis Brooks, 31. Two undercover agents posing as underworld figures were credited with penetrating the conspiracy ring. Five arrests came Dec. 23 in a local motel, where the police were also arrested 43 members of the Bonner, picked up eight days later. He was the only member of the Catholic hierarchy. Atomic World is Subject of AEC Program

"This Atomic World" as presented by Mr. Roger Perkins will surely be the name for the future. The atom and its use will be more and more important to human life in the coming years.

During the first two periods on Monday, February 26, Mr. Perkins spoke to two assemblies about atomic energy. His use and its importance, after a brief summary of the atom itself, he explained the fission of uranium. He showed how it occurs and what happens afterward.

Atomic energy is used not only for war purposes now. With a model of a nuclear reactor, Mr. Perkins explained how in many ways it is used in the home. He also explained how it is used in the industry and in the space program.

Many aspects of radiation and its uses were pointed out by Mr. Perkins. First, he showed how radioactivity is carried through plants. When a radioactive substance is placed at the base of the plant, about 90 per cent remains there. However, when a leaf of the plant is sprayed with a radioactive substance 60 per cent is used by the plant. Second, with the use of vertical half-life and volatility, Mr. Perkins showed that radiation in unconfined forms is harmless. It is when this radiation is concentrated that it becomes a hazard.

Mr. Perkins concluded his demonstration by saying that for the past several years, many advances have been made in the field of atomic energy and that more are being made every day. He noted, however, that it may be a hundred years before some of the problems facing the scientist of today are solved.

Vernon School Grant Of \$125,000 Announced

The State Board of Education gave its official blessing Wednesday to a \$125,000 grant for a four-year addition to the Tolandville School for Retarded Children.

The grant is payable to the town immediately upon completion of the school. The Board of Education gave the project a green light last week, informing Mayor John Grant of the need for immediate action on the school addition.

Town officials are considering two possible means of financing the addition. This can be done by budgeting the expense as anticipated income and outlay, or by calling a referendum to add the amount to the town budget. Grant expects the referendum procedure would add an anticipated one mill to the tax rate.

The amount could be budgeted if the addition could be completed early in the year, when town spending is flexible. If construction was held up until the end of the fiscal year, in May or June, the town would run the risk of deficit spending. The school has an enrollment of about 42 trainable pupils, some of whom attend on a tuition basis from other towns.

A Voter Registration session will be held March 29 from 8 to 8 p.m. at the Memorial Building, 14 Park Place, for all eligible residents of the town of at least six months duration.

Vocational Follow-Up Shows Graduates' Progress

Does a vocational program in high school help prepare young adults for a higher paying job in today's society of highly-skilled laborers? Mr. Sidney Cohen, vocational coordinator did a survey on 100 students of Manchester High who were contacted either by mail or telephone for a 97 per cent return on the first Vocational Follow-Up. The graduate study is mandatory for all participating schools as Manchester High School receives partial reimbursement from the Connecticut State Department of Education.

The vocational courses involved in this study are: General clerical-typing, data processing, bookkeeping, stenography, distributive education, electronics assembly, mechanical inspection, and food service. A typical report on one of these schools, including handwriting, accounting, and executive secretarial training. Many of the students are attending four-year colleges, and the balance of the graduates went into a wide variety of jobs. Some have indicated that their school training was helpful in some way. 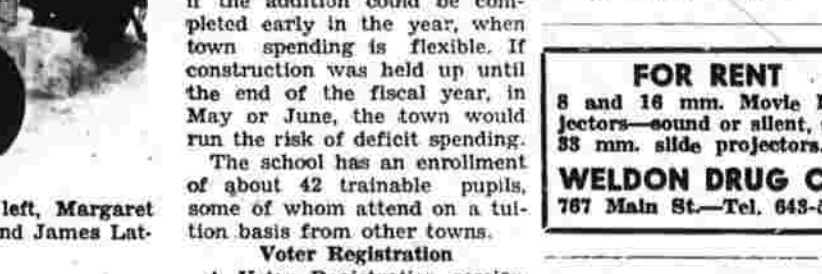

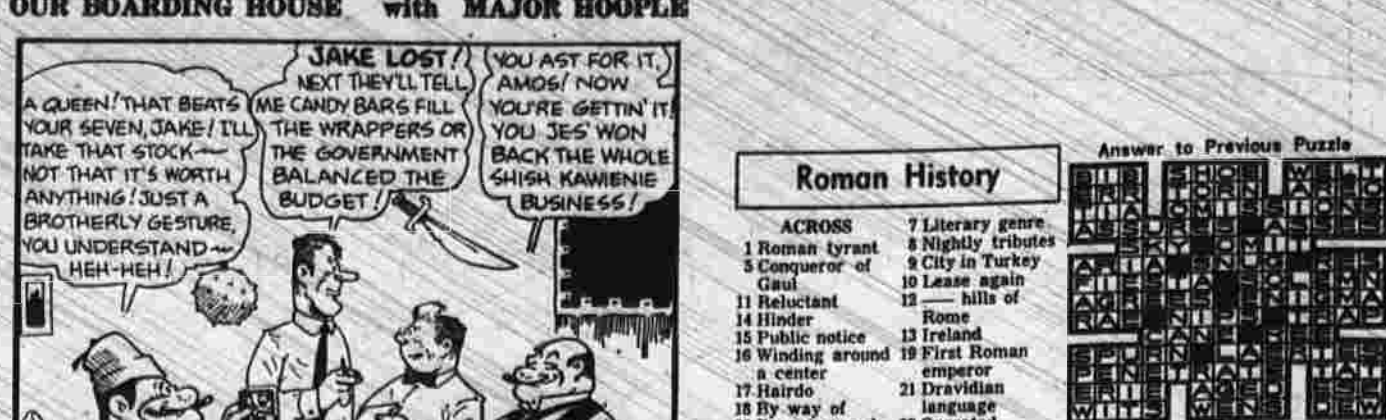
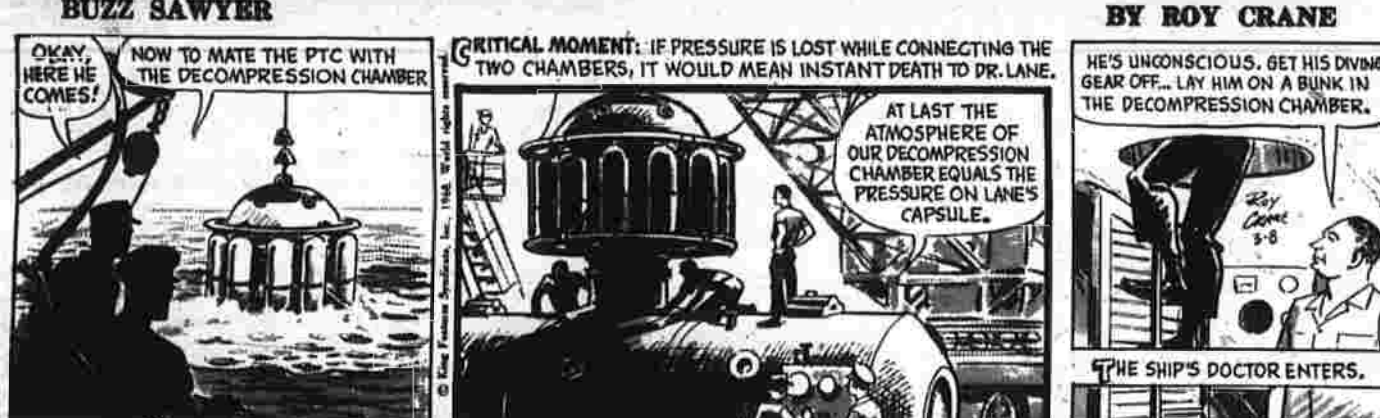
