Could Nixon End The War? There is no easier remark open to Senator McCarthy than the charge that here is little for the American people o choose between former Vice Presiient Richard Nixon and President Lynion Johnson on the issue of Vietnam. The position Nixon has always drifted toward because of his own chromosomes and natural character instincts is essenially the same position President Johnson has allowed his own natural instincts to be talked into by the Bundy-Rostow-

Nixon wanted us to fight in Vietnam in 1954, to help the French stay there, but Eisenhower and the American generals of the time refused. At that time Lyndon Johnson would probably have been classified as a dove on Vietnam. He has since allowed himself to be sold the theory that it is the solemn obligation of a nation which possesses as much power as we do to use that power maintaining order anywhere and everywhere. and purpose being so easily visible, Nixon, as the potential Republican challenzer, feels it incumbent upon him to begin to establish some differences. As he moved, in his New Hampshire speech the other day, to his most direct iscussion of Vietnam to date, Nixon set

himself and President Johnson. First, by the charge that President Johnson could have achieved better results for less cost in Vietnam if he had struck with all our force at once, instead of following a policy of military gradualism. Nixon invites the conclu sion that he would have ended the war before this, in a clear victory for us, if he had been President. Actually, under Johnson, American power has been applied just about as fast as we have been able to get it there.

Second, Nixon promises to end the war "If in November this war is not over," he said in New Hampshire the other day, "after all of this power has been at their disposal, then I say that the American people will be justified to elect new leadership. And I pledge to you the new leadership will end the war and win

the peace in the Pacific - and that is what America wants." Nixon, in this speech, did not disclose just how he would accomplish this. He said he was promising no "push-button technique" for ending it,, and he said he was not suggesting "withdrawal from

He insisted, however, that the war could be ended if "we mobilize our economic and political and diplomatic lead-

Nixon can hardly be blamed if, in such declarations, he is trying to suggest that his election might produce results comparable to those which followed the election of Eisenhower in 1952. Then Eisenhower campaigned with a dramatic pledge to 'go to Korea" himself. After he had gone to Korea he came home and eventually accepted the same peace conditions his predecessor in office, Harry Truman, had been frightened to accept because he was afraid of being attacked for being soft on Communists But, although Nixon may be willing to reate a general suggestion that he will emulate the Eisenhower capacity to make peace in a war the Democrats can't end, there still seems some difference between his own instinctive hawkishness and Eisenhower's 1952 campaign use of a hawk-like slogan a campaign

strategist had created for him. Eisenhower opted not only for peace in Korea, but for peace in Vietnam and for peace in Suez.

If Nixon were to be elected and were to follow, with Vietnam, the Elisenhower parallel with regard to Korea, he would have to accept the North Vietnamese offer of negotiations which President Johnson and his advisers have repeatedly rejected. That we do not expect. If the war continues in its present basic conditions until the election, it will

be very obvious that any Republican candidate, no matter who he might be, would probably have a better chance ofending the war in Vietnam than President Johnson, simply because he would not stand as firmly committed and fet-

tered as Johnson stands. But Nixon still nas to be rated, because of his own instinctive and consistently tough past commitments and advices, as the one Republican possibility least likely to succeed in the peace task.

The New York State Legislature, opersting on a hair of the dog theory, has just decided that the way to improve the appetite of New Yorkers for their state lottery is to throw a lot more lottery at them.

Previous restrictions on where the lot tery tickets could be sold have now been abolished so that only two kinds of es tablishments, bars and churches, are forbidden to handle them. Just about every other enterprise in the state can be licensed to sell lottery tickets, under the new law. Not all of this will be net gain. There is a nasty new federal law going into effect April 1, which will make chaste and virtuous again the 2,500 New York state banks which have been selling gambles along with thrift.

Another provision of the new law authorizes an increase in the number of drawings that can be held in a year Where the lottery began, and has failed on a basis of monthly drawings, or 12 year, it will now be possible to hole drawings semi-monthly, or weekly, if the tickets can be printed fast enough. the good Governor of New York are seeking to correct is one in which the good people of New York have been singularly unresponsive to the magnifi cent gamble offered them. They were expected to gamble \$30,000,000 every month, and they have averaged only \$5,000,000, the pikers. And the result of this has been that instead of providing a fat profit of \$198,000,000 a year for edu cation in New York, the lottery has been helping education only at the rate of a paltry \$33,000,000 a year, leaving official budgets in a very sad state.

What might be next, if this new lav doesn't rescue the lottery? Well why not a state law making the purchase of a ticket a week compulsory, financed through an automatic payroll deduction?
