### Rham District Work on \$842,000 Budget Finished by School Board

The estimated increases in revenues from the federal and state governments is \$3,586 for a total of \$84,000. This, reflected in the proposed budget, makes the total budget \$758,488.

### Steel Foundry Sinking

CALCUTTA, India (AP) — Red-faced officials admitted today that India's third biggest steel foundry, closed Monday after it started sinking, may have been built over abandoned coal mines.

The ground has sunk as much as two feet in some places since Saturday night, tilting heavy machinery and twisting girders in the foundry of the Indian Iron and Steel Co. at Kulti, 125 miles northwest of Calcutta. The plant occupies one acre and employs 6,000 persons.

Company officials first denied there were abandoned mines under the foundry, opened in 1968 as a showpiece. But the visiting director of mines said today his department's documents show workings 200 feet below the foundry, abandoned in about 1900 and flooded. He said the whole area was unsafe.




