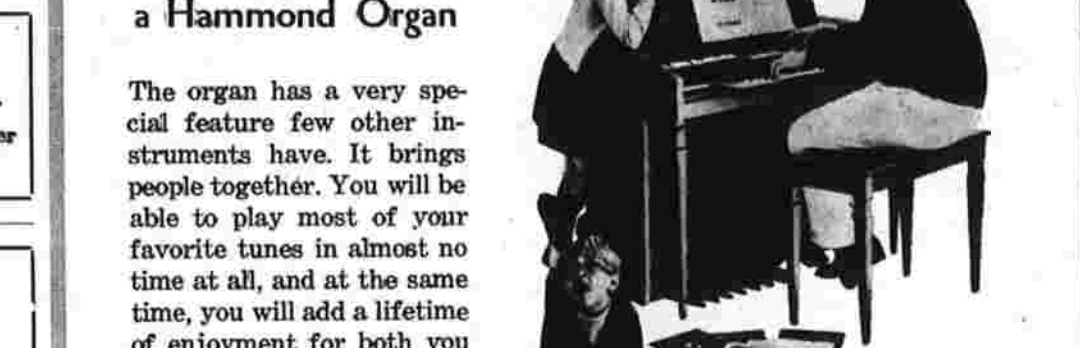

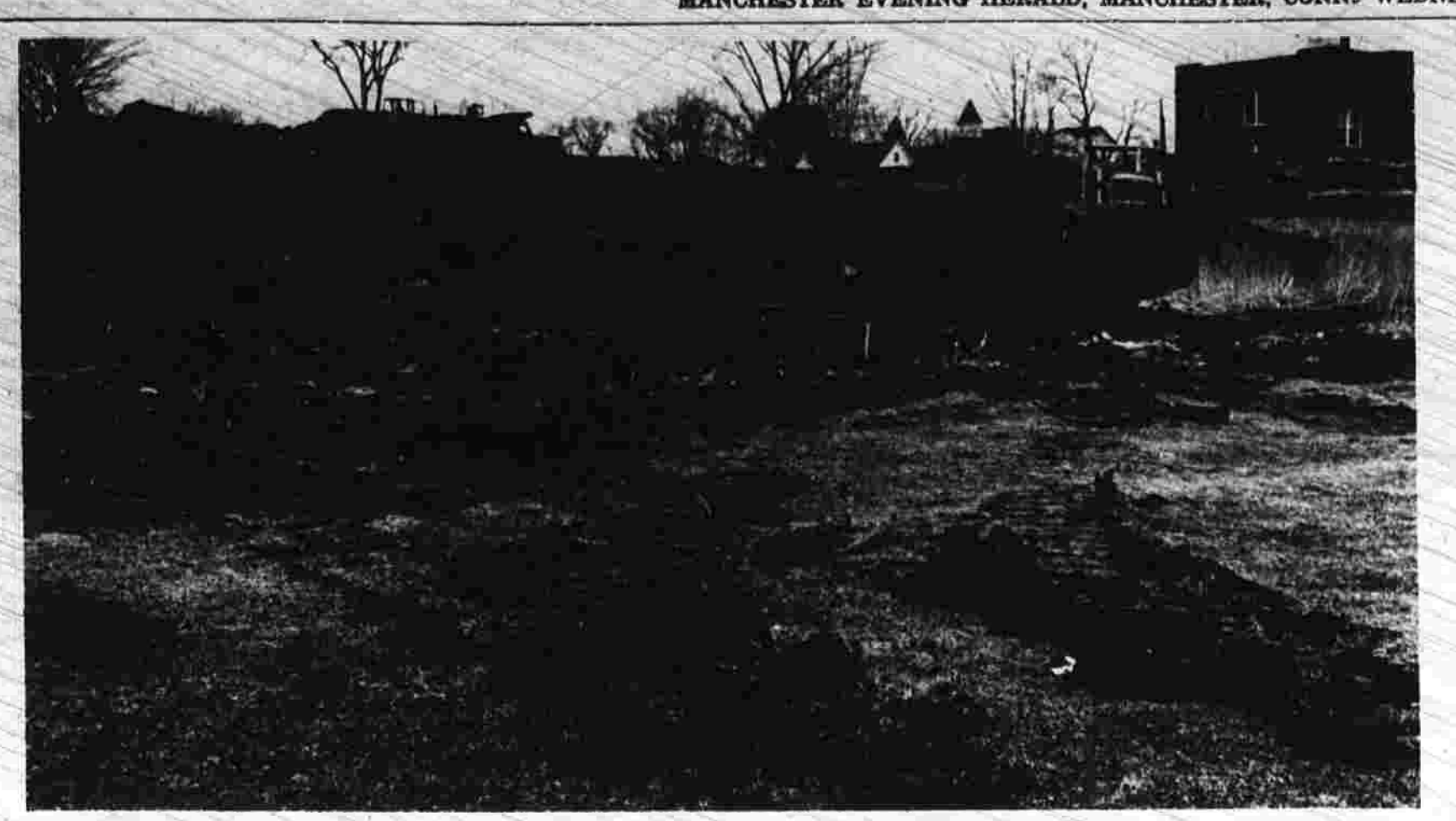

Riot Report Big Problem Seen If Society Unchanged

WASHINGTON—The ap-
palling thing about the White
House study on civil disorders
is not just what it tells about
last summer or this year or
the next year. What is almost over-
powering is the problem it fore-

example, the Negro population
in the central cities of the United
States will increase by 72 per cent.
More than half the population
of Washington, D. C., and
Newark, N. J., is now Negro.
By 1984, if present trends con-
tinue, Negroes also will consti-
tute the majority of citizens in
New Orleans, Richmond, Va.,
Baltimore, Jacksonville, Fla.,
Cary, Ind., Cleveland, St. Louis,
Detroit, Philadelphia, Oakland
and Chicago, in that order of
time.
Despite the recent anguish of
Newark, Newark and Watts,
the underlying forces that have
produced riots continue to gain
momentum," according to the

To avert an American tragedy
in the next generation the bi-

forward toward open housing
or higher taxes.
Indeed the federal govern-
ment has just lost one of its
most officials, John W. Con-
ner, secretary of Health, Educa-
tion and Welfare, because he
resigned of the nation's vio-
lence.
Even as the commission's re-
port urging racial integration
was being distributed to the
press Thursday, Sen. Everett M.
Dirksen (R-Ill.), the Senate mi-
nority leader, moved under
pressure to weaken a compro-
mise on legislation dealing with
open housing. The gap between
political reality and the ideal of
reform could hardly be better
illustrated than by the juxtapo-
sition of Thursday's events.
At about the same time,
furthermore, President Johnson
was making a decision on how
many additional troops he would
send to Vietnam. The war al-
ready costing the United States
to the billion dollars a year. Each
degree of escalation, of course,
will increase the cost.
While the problems of the Ne-
gro masses in the central cities
intensify, federal funds that
might help ease them are being
siphoned off by the war.
True, a good deal has been
done to alleviate the plight of
the Negro. But reforms of the
magnitude proposed by the com-
mission cannot be accomplished
while the country is at war, or
while the commission members be-
lieve.
Meanwhile, as their report
grimly points out, the problems
in California are about 4,500 years
old.
"Why are the underlying forces

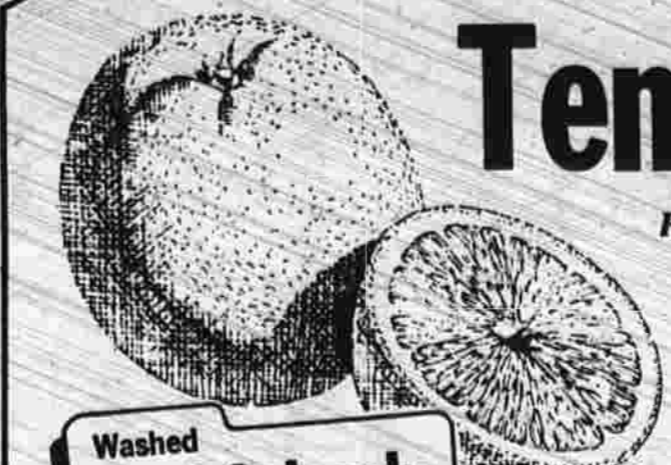

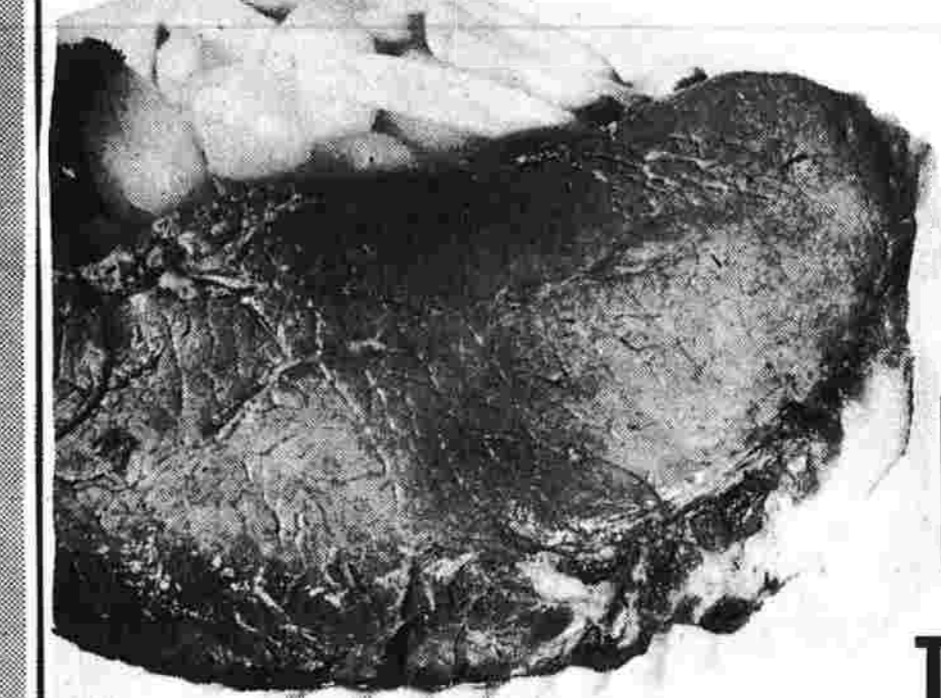

New Hilton Hotel Opens on Kona, Hawaiian Island

By JERRY HULAE The Los Angeles Times KONA, HAWAII—The certain sign of Paradise Lost has cropped up on Hawaii's Kona coast. A Hilton hotel. Paradise. Hawaiian shake their heads sadly. Rising from one corner of Kona—the not-so-peaceful village famed for its marlin fishing—is the huge concrete pillars. One writer said it resembles an island warrior's hat. A Honolulu newspaperman said it is shaped like Diamond Head. Both must have been gulping too many Mai Tais, the island liquid which turns tourists tipsy. The truth is that it looks like a big, airy, one-story hotel, the maximum height limit on this particular island. Douglasville plants flower along the balconies. One day they will grow and spill like a waterfall, the maximum height limit on the balcony of the walls. South of the hotel, by a narrow cove, stands a Hawaiian shack. It is red with a metal roof, and it rests on a pedestal of lava, just as it flowered there more than 1,000 years ago, palm trees grown up around it and Mr. Hilton grown up beside it. It is an incongruous scene—this picture of old Hawaii reflecting a passing day and the new hotel, a modern Hawaii of room service and elevators, cool rum drinks and king-size beds. If indeed this particular paradise truly is lost, it is lost in the comfort of luxuriously appointed rooms, all with a view that can be described, even with reprinted, as utterly spectacular. There is no beach—only the blackness of lava. The lava is framed by the incredible greenness of heavy trees and coconut palms and the boiling whiteness of waves, stirred up as they crash headlong into the lava cliffs. No matter if it is sunrise or sunset, it is a scene to be held and to look away in memory for revival at some distant time when you're stuck bumper-to-bumper in some freeway jam back on the mainland. Alfred Lord Tennyson said, "This better have loved and lost than never to have loved," but I'm not so sure. If you've never known the beauty of Hawaii how can you mourn the separation after your return to the questionable civilization of the city? For his hotel Mr. Hilton has created his own waterfall. Not one but two. They wash down a wall near the Hale Mele and flow into a pool. Tropical fish swim beside the pool that contains the tourists' memories for revival at some distant time when you're stuck bumper-to-bumper in some freeway jam back on the mainland. Alfred Lord Tennyson said, "This better have loved and lost than never to have loved," but I'm not so sure. If you've never known the beauty of Hawaii how can you mourn the separation after your return to the questionable civilization of the city? Hanging in the lobby is a picture of Mr. Hilton. Anyone who travels knows his picture hangs in his hotel. But at Kona he is a youngish Conrad Hilton. Before posing he dyed his fringe and doffed a toupee. He is 10 years younger in the new hotel than in the older one. If the coming of the Kona Hilton is a sign of Paradise Lost, this is just a beginning. Plans are being made for the launching of a series of hotels along a 25-mile plot of coastline. In all there will be 3,200 rooms. A 64 million dollar deal. Another 116 million dollars will be spent on shops and other tourist developments. And although the Hilton monument is barely open, already ground breaking has taken place for another 128 rooms. The 180 rooms in the present building are up for bids ranging from 21 dollars a day double to 55 dollars for suites with mountain and ocean views. Meals are included for another \$13 a person. In an effort to woo the Polynesian Gods, a Hawaiian Kahuna sprinkled the driveway with coconut juice, gin and water. It soothed the Gods, maybe, but it irritated certain guests. They thought the gin would have been put to better use in a martini. With so many hotels coming to Kona the question pops up again: is another Waikiki in the offing? Something which Waikiki hasn't got will be the world's most exclusive tennis club with 200 rental cottages—30 dollars a day and tutors to teach the children the social graces while parents develop a tricky backhand. Add to this a cluster of 400 condominium apartments bearing 25,000 dollar price tags and 100 new homes in the 100,000 - 150,000 dollar class and there you have it, Paradise Lost. I nearly forgot the new golf course which opened recently plus plans for a 5 million dollar small boat harbor and a modern jet airport. Kona's white kids have in mind direct flights from the mainland. Add it all up. Argue anyway you wish, it comes out the same: Paradise Lost, but lost in a splash of luxury.

Oldest Train Still Makes Historic Run

LEEDS, England (AP) — A 210-year-old railroad is still doing the work for which it was built in 1758—hauling freight for local industries over a rusty mile of track past old-fashioned factories, scrapyards and clay pits.

The Middleton Colliery Railway, which local buffs claim is the world's oldest, pioneered a system which revolutionized travel and the movement of freight.

On Aug. 12, 1812, two steam locomotives, the Salamanca and the Prince Regent, went into regular service with a top speed of 10 miles per hour. The rack-and-pinion wheel railway designed by John Blenkinsop is still employed in different form on some mountain railways with very steep grades.

Despite its trail-blazing, the Middleton was not preserved as an ancient monument. In fact, historians had hunted it into the sidings of history, giving George Stevenson's "rocker" all the glory.

Shortly before its bicentenary, the line, which had carried millions of tons of coal, lay derelict and abandoned. Rusty, broken and overgrown with weeds, it was in danger of disappearing without trace.

Local railroad buffs, however, got together and in 1960 formed the Middleton Railway Trust. Their aim was to preserve the ancient line by operating it on a commercial basis.

The Middleton celebrated its reopening in June 1960, by carrying 7,500 passengers, mostly children. Profits were donated to a Leeds University charity drive. Since then, the train, operated solely by amateurs in their spare time, has carried an average of 10,000 tons of scrap iron, steel girders and general freight each year. It carries the freight one mile, then links up with British Railways.

Dr. Fred Youell, a physicist at Leeds University and chairman of the trust, explained, "We had a lot of knowledge about running railways when we first started. And we have learned a lot as we have gone along. If we ever really get stuck, we can fall back on British Railways for expert advice."

"The railway runs for about a mile, but with sidings we have about four miles of track. We operate strictly according to the British Railway book of rules. Safety is the prime consideration. If anyone breaks one of the 211 rules, he can be suspended. After all, with engines like the Great Marquess, which weighs 68 tons, we can't afford to take chances."

Mrs. Youell, who drove her first steam locomotive at age 17, is known as the "Mother of the railways."

Today the Middleton appears to have an assured future. The Trust has eight locomotives and a diesel—the 21-ton John Hancock, 34 years old and the first diesel ever used on a British main line railway. Members of the Trust who are qualified as engineers and firemen after passing rigorous British Railway examinations, work a rota system, reporting for duty when there is freight to move.

"The maximum amount of freight we have moved in any one year is 12,600 tons," said Dr. Youell. We charge 24 cents per ton, which is competitive and covers our costs.

"Nothing can now threaten the Middleton Railway. It is here to stay."

Brazil's Own Peace Corps Uses Students

RIO DE JANEIRO (AP) — Brazilian university students are being scattered through the jungle in a kind of domestic peace corps program. Most are in the Amazon region.

More than 700 students have already taken part in a joint program sponsored by nine government ministries to help the poor of Brazil's underdeveloped interior.

"Our aim is not only to provide assistance to the local people, but also to put future technicians in touch with their country's reality," says Army Lt. Col. Mauro Costa Rodrigues.

Rodrigues is the executive coordinator of the "London Project," started in December, which is responsible for putting the students in the Amazon jungles and in the drought regions of the Northeast.

The students, with an average age of 23, are all volunteers. They are divided in groups of four to 10, and sent to frontier military posts and remote missions in the jungles or in the "caatingas," the semi-arid regions of the Northeast.

Most of them are nearing graduation as doctors, dentists, veterinarians, engineers, teachers, economists, geographers and geologists.

So far, the project has reached 97 settlements in the jungles and in the desert.

The London Project, initiated by the Interior Ministry, is carried on in close cooperation with the ministries of Army, Navy, Air Force, Education, Health, Transportation, Agriculture and Planning. It is also aided by the government's Superintendencies for Development of the Amazon and of the Northeast and by almost all Brazilian universities and state governments.

After arriving at its final base, a group has the task of providing assistance to the population, in addition to undertaking research of the area.

Among the items studied by each group are: Topography, rivers and lakes, soil, mineral resources, climate, flora, fauna, colonization, population distribution, agriculture, forests, fishing and hunting possibilities, including and potential local industries, transportation and commerce.

When the students return to their schools, they prepare reports on their studies and conclusions, which are used by the universities and by the government in future development efforts.

Colonel Rodrigues says that about 200,000 new crochets (about \$63,000) were spent to finance the first part of the project, carried on during the first two months of this year.

Most of the money came from the federal government and the University Movement for Economic-Social Development, a private foundation.

A large part of the medical supplies were donated by private laboratories, and equipment and transportation were provided by the military.

The project's second part will be carried on in July during winter school vacations.

Little Girl Look Is in This Spring

NEW YORK (AP) — If you're wide awake this spring, you'll go for the round-eyed little girl look, observes cosmetic and make-up specialist Evelyn Marshall.

The look began last year, she points out, but now everyone is going for it.

Guyana Seen Sputtering to Flash Point

GEORGETOWN, Guyana — The always volatile political situation in Guyana, the mid-state that recently came within a hair's breadth of becoming a Soviet beachhead in South America, is sputtering toward flash point again.

No one looks forward with pleasure to what appears to be the inevitable explosion. But no one seems to have the formula for smothering out the flame.

Precisely when it will all begin is uncertain. Election day is expected to provide the primer, and Prime Minister Forbes Burnham has yet to fix the date. Consequently, elections must be called by March 31, 1968. Burnham presumably will wait every possible benefit from a development program, bolstered by some 20 million dollars a year in U. S. assistance.

For now, though, he stands will not commit himself. The time element is critical. If he waits too long he is likely to encounter massive popular resistance based on an increasingly eroding price-wage squeeze. Living costs were relatively stable last year, inching up less than 1 per cent this year. However, due primarily to a currency devaluation brought on by deterioration of the British pound, prices are expected to swell almost 30 per cent. Meanwhile, wages are virtually frozen.

Coming down hard on this point is Cheddi Jagan, the leftist former prime minister who all but delivered Guyana into the Soviet camp when it was still British Guyana, a crown colony. Jagan's chances of leading his people's progressive party to an electoral victory are considered marginal although the P.P.P. made up almost wholly of east Indian immigrants, is Guyana's largest party.

The People's National Congress, Burnham's party and largely Negro, governs through a coalition with the tiny United Force (U.F.).

This time, however, Burnham hopes to outflank the P.P.P. with the help of a sizable overseas vote. Jagan predictably insists that overseas registration will be carefully controlled to give Burnham's P.P.P. the advantage, a charge dismissed as irresponsible by the government.

However the P.P.P. retains command, whether through a clear majority or with united force support, Jagan's Indian supporters are expected to protest violently and the upshot could be a repetition of the 1962-64 Racial War. In that bloodbath, finally quashed by British infantry, Indian and Negro fought hand to hand in the streets; hundreds of houses and commercial buildings were reduced to ashes, and the national economy was brought up short.

There are some Guyanans who contend that this sort of thing cannot happen again, that the hand guns, rifles and automatic weapons used during the troubles have been surrendered.

But in the barrooms of Georgetown one hears that a considerable number of guns are under the ground waiting to be dug out and used again.

Jagan himself professes to want no part of further violence but refuses to forest in his party that are "beyond my control." His grip on the P.P.P. may have weakened a bit since his ouster from the government in 1964 but if there is a single leader, it is Jagan.

For the record, Jagan has yet to admit to membership in the Communist Party. His sentiments, however, are unmistakable. A founder of the tricontinental solidarity movement two years ago in Havana, he travels frequently to Moscow and east European capitals and from his party headquarters here guides out a constant stream of pro-Communist anti-U.S. propaganda.

As prime minister from 1964 to 1967, he associated openly with Cuba's Fidel Castro made no secret of his fascination with the Soviet brand of Communism and brought on the racial conflict that destroyed his party. No western government with the exception of Castro's would like to see Jagan back in power, least of all the United States. In such event, however, it is not likely that Washington would be called on to go to the lengths required three years ago in the Dominican Republic where Marines and airborne infantry were put ashore.

I'm reprinting them with a few parenthetical remarks to clarify them for your younger readers.
