The inner reality of what has been happening, in the McCarthy movement, is something the Senator himself acknowledged as his own purpose when he became a candidate. He said he wanted to set up an opportunity for dissent to channel itself into political activ-

And this, almost instantly, became a great accomplishment which generated itself out of his willingness to contribute himself and out of the hitherto sublimated yearning of young people for something to work for instead of merely against.

Senator McCarthy gave meaning and significance to the political process again, in a nation which was beginning to sicken at the prospect of an unlimited expanse of dead-end down-grade choices. He raised a signal of protest which was not simultaneously a call to

Appreciation, sometimes unwitting, sometimes conscious, of the possibilities Senator McCarthy has been able to generate appears on a variety of fronts. Down in Washington, Dr. Donald Lourie, president of the New York state Council on Drug Addiction, was testifying the other day and saying that politics might be proving itself the antilote to pot and pills.

"If you want to cure the drug problem, the name of the game is commit ment," he said. He should have given Senator McCarthy an explicit bow, as one who made commitment seem pos-

In his column in the New York Times. James Reston has been celebrating the ebirth of American politics as something exciting and significant, "The political system that wasn't working is eginning to work," he wrote. People are joining in the political process who hitherto apparently believed "that traditional political discussion was use-

Foreign Minister Brandt's strongest argument for recognition of the new boundary was probably based on his reading of the current facts of life in Europe. In that portion of former Prussia which has been under Polish rule since the end of World War II, there are now 8,000,000 Poles in residence, while most of the former German residents are in either East or West Germany. Of these 8,000,000 Poles, he said. probably as many as 40 per cent had been born since the war, and therefore had reason to regard the territory as one which belonged to them.

Perhaps, if we could always guarantee ourselves nothing but mild and broadviewed statesmen everywhere, Brandt's

arguments could be taken not only as conditioning for something that is going to happen anyway, but as guarantee tha the territorial arrangement involved could somehow prove to be a lasting and peaceful arrangement.

But, in the kind of world in which we do live, with the kind of leadership which does develop and which people do take to their hearts, the effort to guarantee peace and stability to Europe by shrinking Germany and enlarging its neighbors is doomed to as much eventual failure as resulted from the same kind of effort after World War I.

There is no cure for Europe's troubles in any re-drawing of frontiers. There is no possible pattern of frontiers which could ever be guaranteed to be permanent and peaceful, precisely because there is no such pattern which would not include some grievance, real or fancled, for some population group which could not and would not be, later on, exploited by some exploiter of nationalist feelings and ambitions. The only cure for Europe is what it

has always been-the reduction of frontiers-and not the reduction of frontiers by having the frontier of any particular nation expanded until it swallows all the others up into an empire of Europe, but the reduction of frontiers which would lower them all to a point of no real importance, as in a true United States of Europe, so that it would make no more difference whether one lived in a state called Germany or Poland than it makes whether one lives in Connecticut or Rhode

That happens not only to be the only cure for Europe, but also, as well, the only cure for the world. All of which will materialize in good time, if there is to be time.

Wrong Way Defection? It is a curious footnote to the recent liberalization of Communist politics in Ezechoslovakia that it now seems likely that the Czech general who recently "defected" to the United States might more properly have "defected" to Soviet Rus-

Ezechoslovakia was that he was on the losing side in the struggle between conservative, Moscow-oriented Communists and the liberal Communists who are now proclaiming that their country can be a half-way house between East and West. His quarrel with the regime in Czechoslovakia, then, was that it was moving too far toward the West, instead of staying with the East. Having lost his quarrel, it became him to escape from the country if he could. But, rather than heading toward Moslow, he made Washington his choice as a destination for his exile.

We cannot be exactly sure the choice was flattering to us, as most other detections from the Communist side of the cold war have seemed to be.
