over the hump. I'm encouraged."

A state of emergency remained in effect in Wilmington, Del., today after a night of sniping, firebombing and looting in a Negro neighborhood. Twelve persons were injured, one seriously.

City police controlled the situation but there were 50 state police and 1,200 National Guardsmen standing by to aid them if needed. Minor trouble broke out about noon then erupted full scale at night.

In Youngstown, 400 National Guardsmen and police patrolled three sections after a brief flurry of gunfire and firebombings that left three men wounded, including two policemen.

The city was under a 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. curfew. All bars in Mahoning County were ordered closed for 72 hours beginning at 7 p.m. Monday. Gas stations were also ordered closed.

Cincinnati police said the 2 1/2 hours of rioting there occurred after a rumor spread that a white policeman had shot a Negro woman. Police said the woman was killed accidentally by her husband.

During the rioting in the Mount Auburn area, Noel Wright, 30, was pulled from his car, beaten and fatally stabbed. His wife, Lois, 28, was beaten by three Negro girls but was not seriously injured.

Five judges heard rioter's cases into the night at municipal court. Some were sentenced to jail terms or fined up to \$500 within a few hours of their arrests.

Buffalo, N.Y., appeared calm today after a night of sporadic destruction by hundreds of young Negroes. The disorder broke out Monday following a peaceful march by teenagers in memory of King.

Miles, a small community in southwestern Michigan, called on state police and sheriff's deputies to put down a hit-and-run attack by a gang of about 125 Negroes.

The youths marched arm-in-arm down the main street chanting Black Power slogans and breaking windows at will until the police reinforcements arrived.

Pittsburgh officials ordered 1,000 more National Guardsmen into the city today to enforce a peace which came after four days of looting and arson. It brought to 4,000 the number of troops in the city.

Liza Minelli Decorates an Apartment

NEW YORK (AP) — Liza Minnelli, 29, is a typical American bride. She likes to talk about her new home. The small apartment she had decorated as a bachelor girl is being redecorated as a wedding present by a family friend.

"What an experience it is," says bright-eyed Liza. She has gone from her favorite quiet north colors to the widest color schemes. She had doubts about everything. Richard Olmsted wanted to do it. It seemed so routine that she thought, envisioning it, "I don't want to live in a home that will look like that. It isn't my type."

She is turning out so well that even if an idea seems too far out when she is asked for an opinion, she says, "go ahead."

She loves to decorate, but wouldn't have dared think about such ideas, much less try to use them in a small space, she says.

For example, the living room is divided into squares. There is a large black and white rug, a circular rug, plaids, paisleys, prints, stripes. And they go together beautifully because the colors are mixed carefully.

Walls in the dining area, an extension of the living area, are shiny vinyl horizontal random-width stripes—pink, black, fawn, light blue, dark blue, raspberry. The wallpaperer lived with them for four days while he measured, fitted and pasted "and you can't see a seam," she says.

One wall in the living area is Navy blue felt; three walls are white, although one of the three is covered by bookshelves for the "wonderful library" that her husband, entertainer Peter Allen has carried around the world.

The dining section has no dining table. Glass cubes next to two couches will fit together to serve that purpose. The bed room is the widest spot of all, Liza says. There are Roman shades everywhere—pink and orange fabric draped walls with the same fabric on the bed and hanging from the ceiling to make the bed the illusion of being a four-poster.

Liza's closet is lined with a far-out orange and red wallpaper.

She has always decorated before without help. Her mother, Judy Garland, prefers very feminine things. "Everything must be white, blue or lavender to please her," says Liza.

You can learn from interior designers, she points out. They make you look at things in an objective way.

"One day the decorator said, 'How attached are you to that lamp?' I protested—it's a favorite, the first thing I ever bought' . . . and so on and he let me keep it. But soon, I began to hate it and asked him to find another."

Her kitchen is old-fashioned wood, orange and rust, and she'll spend lots of time in it because she loves to cook.

Their art includes portraits, black and white ink drawings and impressionist-style paintings done by Liza's father, Vincent Minnelli.

One night when her father planned to visit, she and her husband dashed out and bought some new, high-backed inadvisable chairs. At first, she didn't like them, but she was beginning to dig the idea when they became defective. Guests sank lower and lower and one muttered as he went to the floor: "I guess they haven't ironed out all the bugs."

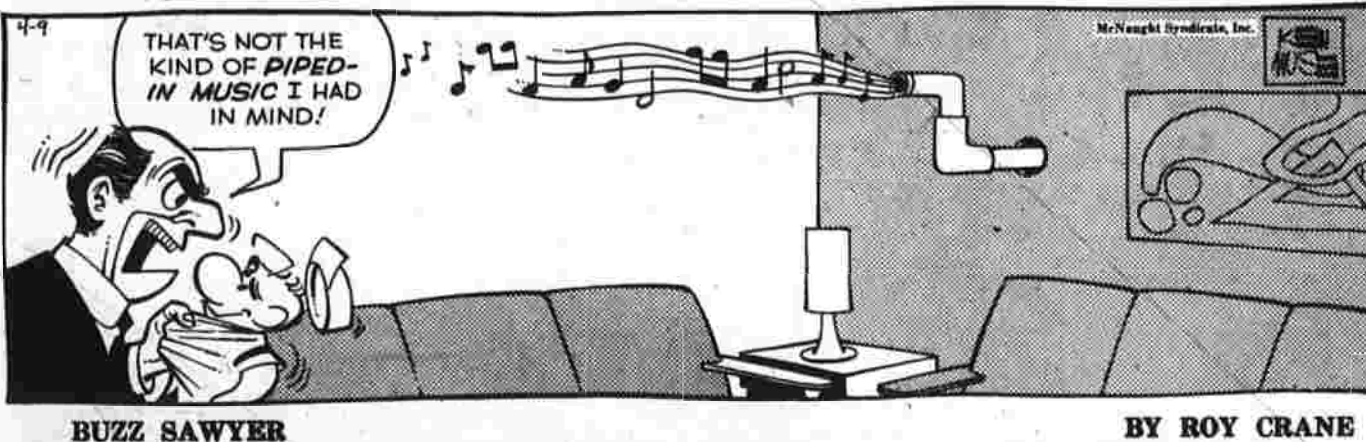

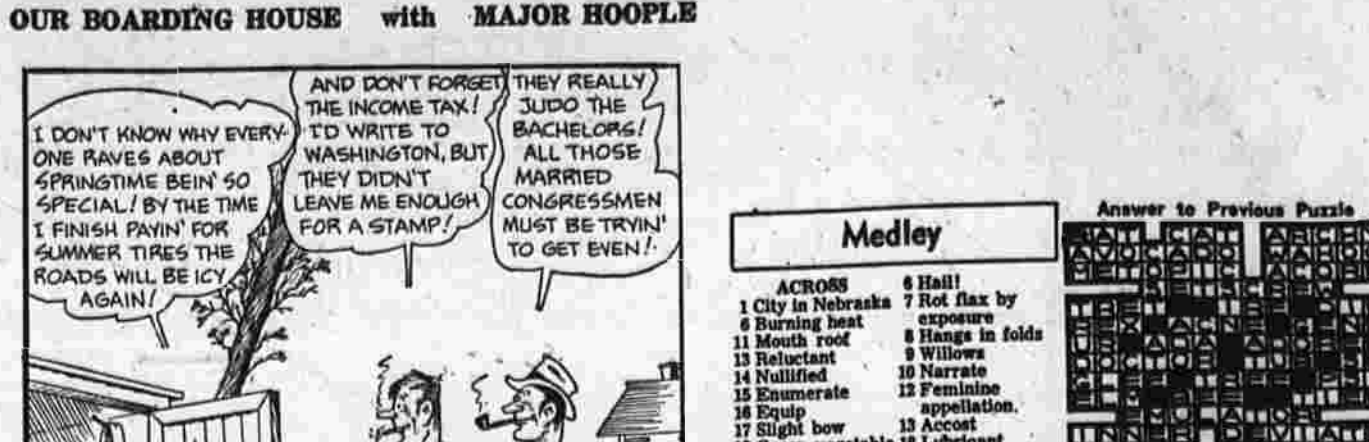

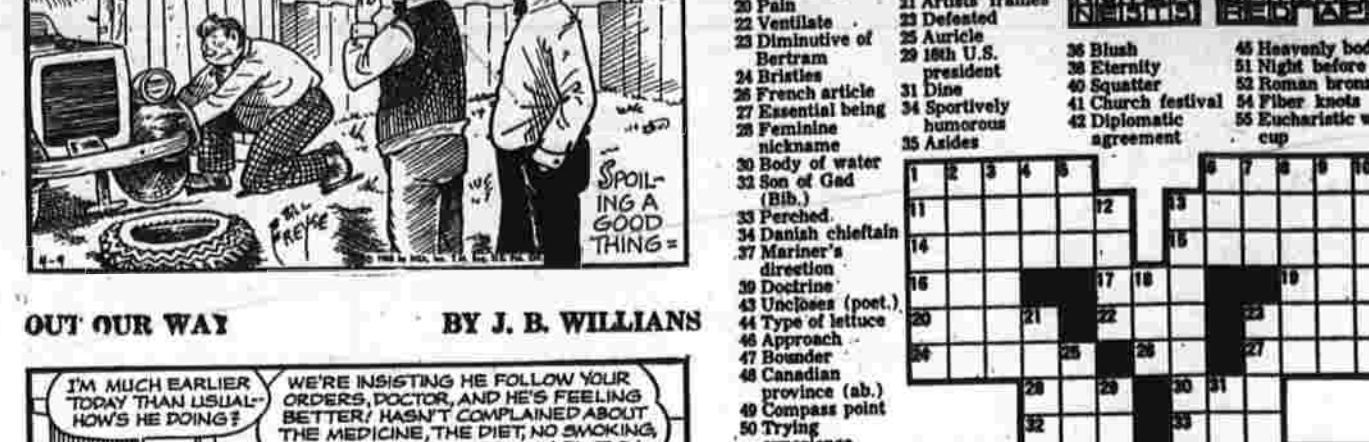
