

Saigon Target **Biggest Ally Drive** Is Staged

100,000 troops of five nations fanned out today over the Saigon area and 11 provinces around the capital in the biggest allied offensive of the war. Only light, scattered action was reported, and a general lull in the ground fighting in Vietnam continued for the second day.

The U.S. Command announced that the big new sweep around the capital, Operation Toan Thang, or Complete Victory, began Monday. Its objective is the Viet Cong and North Vietnamese troops who got away rom the 50,000 American and South Vietnamese troops in Operation Quyet Thang, or Resolved to Win. U.S. headquarters announced

Tuesday that Quyet Thang, a sweep of five provinces around Saigon, had ended with 2,658 enemy killed. But when it began early in March, a force of 13,000 Viet Cong and units of two North Vietnamese regiments were reported maneuvering around the capital, possibly for a renewal of the Tet offensive

U.S. spokesmen explained that Quyet Thang and all other allied operations in the 3rd Corps area terminated Sunday, and all allied forces which had been participating in them be gan Toan Thang on Monday. Brig. Gen. Winat Sidle, chief information officer for the U.S. Command, said Toan Thang is "only a continuation of what we were doing. It is designed to clear the enemy out and keep

candlelight

The candle, provider of light for Europe since the end of the second century, was essential to the colonists when they first settled New England. At first, the supply of candles was imported from England for the colonists had to preserve their cattle from which tallow was extracted, in order to produce essential milk, butter and cheese. Instead, deer suet, bear grease, moose fat, beeswax and bayberry wax were used for the first American-made candles. The first Early American candles were made by

The first Early American candles were made by

dipping. When fat and water were heated together, the fat rose to the surface. The wicks, which were tied in rows from sticks, were dipped into the fat, removed and hung between chairs to dry. This process was repeated again and again as the fat hardened until candles of the proper size had been made.

There was little advancement in candle making until the 15th century when candle molds were introduced. The colonists used molds of wood or tin in various sizes from one to seventy candles at a time. The tips of the wicks were used to pull the candles from the mold when hard. Today, candles are made from parafin wax, faithy acids or scale way and in many colors and

Today, candles are made from parafin wax, fatty acids or scale wax and in many colors and aromas. Wicks are pickled in a solution of boric acid and niter, or sal ammoniac to retard their burning. Wicks are hung in frames of six dozen on elevent foot revolving wheels. These wheels hold 16 frames and after each dipping a fan cools the wax and it is ready for another dipping as the wheel revolves. Spirals and twists are made in molds of 12½ to 37½ dozen at a time!

The Medium Was The Nation

There was a long span of time Tuesfay—the seemingly endless singing of the hymn "Where He Leads Me I Will Follow" at Atlanta—when this seemed to be one nation united, by one medium, in one mood and one thought and one

In that long, endless moment, with the slow words of the hymn repeating themselves endlessly, it seemed that al the world and all its problems and all its unities and disunities alike had been dissolved into that one continuous wave of sound. If it could only go on forever, prove truly endless, one thought, this one experience could be all that remained of human existence on this earth, in this society.

But the throats which had been producing the hymn did not take the endless reprise. The moment was not endless. Eventually, it dissolved into its com-

One of these component parts was the

It was on this day, as on the day of the funeral of President John F. Kennedy, that television attained a stature almost beyond the stature of art, because it bound a whole nation into the final realization of the depth and meaning of the tragedy being enacted.

This was, and is, remember, the medium which, in some performances, seems hardly able to pause between commercials to give a smattering of the news. It is the medium which, in its deliberative choices of what is supposed to interest, absorb, entertain the American people, sometimes seems incapable of taste and sensitivity. It is a medium which sometimes seems, in its serious attempts to represent us to ourselves a prying invader, a manipulator of emotions, a sensationalizer of our in-

Yet, on Tuesday, this same medium was willing to devote all day to the singing of "Where He Leads Me I WIII Follow." This same medium brought dignity and beauty to the impressive sad unity it helped impose on the nation. And it did this, exercising all its sometimes jangled and excessive powers with sureness of taste and restraint throughout all the long ordeal, as if it knew that it was indeed, for the day, the medium becoming the nation, the instrumentality becoming the reality.

One of the component parts of the day was the Negro people.

It was brought into the nation unified

on television as it had never been brought into the nation before. That portion of the Negro population which was on display all day Tuesday was that segment which has risen to the top in those departments by which the standings of individuals in society ere rated. They were the more highly educated, the more talented, the more accomplishful, the more refined Negroes of American life. Dr. Martin Luther King himself was a cultivated man. It was impressive, Tuesday, to see how much accomplishment, how much culture, how much polish, how much ability, the Negro race had accumulated at the top of its own structure.

But in the presentation of the Negro race which was made Tuesday there was more than the culture and success and impressive intellect of those at the top. There were other qualities which were also gifts to the nation. There were the beautiful faces made more beautiful still by their sadness. There were the myriad gentlenesses of mien and con-

Above all, in these people who moved so much closer to all the rest of America Tuesday, in the medium which was the nation, there was the spirituality which told the hearers and watchers of many faiths and of no faith that here was the power and surge of belief, of elemental union with universe, which seemed to make the religion involved a particularly vital force, an organic and not merely a doctrinal reality.

In Dr. Martin Luther King there seemed that same combination of disgreatness and deepness and natural force

The other great component part o the day was the rest of this nation, watching, listening, absorbing the sad eauty, the stern and horrible meaning, the desperate necessity for hope as this greatest of all humanly produced passion plays unfolded. For the sleeping, the casual, the well-intended but never totally committed part of this great najority, the experience yesterday was like that of being drawn out of its own separate consciousness into some almost mystic merging with a new whole. It may be that, thanks to the medium and the way it brought the components of this nation together, nothing will ever be quite the same again. It might be a better, stronger America.

### Some "Disarray"

in one of those mishaps which car nishappen on any newspaper, the New York Times carried, in its "News Summary And Index" the other day a caption which read as follows: "Mc-Carthy's Camp Found To Be In Disarray. Page 34."

Neither on Page 34, nor on any other page of that issue was there any news story under any such headline, so that the only disarray illustrated was on inside the normally efficient operations of the New York Times itself. As a result of this mishappening, we

may never read, now, about the sham bles, the inefficiency, the loose ends, the lack of sensible and orderly chains of command, the sheer total disorgani zation of the organization which is in charge of Senator McCarthy's quest of delegates to the Democratic National Convention.

But our judgment would, we feel sure, be just the same even if we had been privileged to read the detailed analysis of the "disarray."

We would recomend that other can didates study the McCarthy "disarray" and try to organize a little of it for themselves. For we think it indisputable that, in 1968 so far, the most efficient production of votes per dollar, per manwoman-child-hour, so efficient a ratio it may establish a record for all time has been that of the McCarthy cam-

### SHAME!

(Martin Luther King 1929-1968) Just when the entire world was hopefully applauding America for leading the way down the road to possible peace in witheast Asia there comes the shameful tragedy of Memphis, Tennessee, where the assassin's bullet once again must have peoples of all nations wondering about the barbarism of the richest and supposedly most enlightened society in the universe.

The shame for what happened to Martin Luther King cannot be laid at the door of the assassin exclusively nor can the total onus be heaped upon the forces ted it to happen. Actually, the blame is the blame of every American in varying degrees. Even those, who both here Bristol and across the nation, have labored valiantly for the cause of civil rights, have not done enough. As long as a man can be shot down in cold blood because his color and his views do not suit the white community, nobody will have done enough.

A visibly shaken President Johnson, who has before him the terribly demanding task right now of convincing the world that the United States really wants peace and justice for all, has been given an added burden because of the worldwide distrust of America the King assassination is bound to create. Mr. Johnson apparently was so sobered by the tragedy of Memphis that he decided to lelay for a day his momentous peace mission to Honolulu. And he gave all of

us excellent advice when in his comment on Doctor King he said: "I hope that all Americans tonight will search their hearts as they ponder this most tragic incident." Those of us who do honestly search

our hearts will readily concede that there is a great void there when it comes to our attitude toward our black neighbors. Many of us have never shaken the hand of a single Negro. Many more have never nad a social conversation with a black man. In short, the majority of whites haven't the fogglest notion of a Negro's character, his joys and his pains, his ambitions and dreams, his hope and

It is not enough to claim that we are always kind to the Negro girl clerk who s the token symbol of integration in a supermarket or department store. It is in tipping the black bootblack. It is surely not enough to boast of the cheery word we have for the Negro garbage collector. There perhaps is a prime example of the real underlying cause of the black man's frustration in this country today. Why should the percentages of Negro garbage collectors and, ironically, of fighting men in Vietnam be so much higher than those recorded by the white

najority? Again, why? Martin Luther King dedicated and gave his life to the quest for the answers to these distressing problems. If his death, terrible price though it was, awakens enough of us to our personal individual reasonsibilities, then it might some day prove to have been a worthwhile sacrifice, even an American redemption. A few weeks ago the President's Com mission on Civil Disorders issued a voluminous report of its findings in the investigation of racial warfare in our

cities. The report has been largely ig nored even though it has some of the answers needed to prevent events such as occurred in Memphis Thursday. The time has come for every Ameri can to take proper notice of that report and institute the racial remedies it advocates. If we do not, the death of Doctor King will be but a prelude to total
