In Its Last Days of Dignity

The stately dignity of the Rogers House at 65 Prospect St. appears untouched, so far, by the ravages of neglect and impending doom shown by the porch of the house directly across the street. It is expected to pass through the sites of both houses before the year is done.

Buggies and Sleigh Fire Destroys Barn, Contents Damaged

Firemen from three departments spent several hours last night fighting a fire which destroyed part of a barn on Lake St. and damaged its contents which included wagons, buggies and a sleigh.

The barn, owned by Mrs. Dorothy DeCandia, is just in front of the fire was discovered, and she moved it out of danger before firemen arrived.

The fire, of undetermined origin, was discovered by some children, who warned Mrs. DeCandia, she phoned the fire department.

One old wagon, stored under the hayloft, was burned beyond repair. Less seriously damaged were another wagon, two buggies, a sleigh, all stored in the garage portion. Mrs. DeCandia said she did not know whether they were insured.

The antique vehicles were brought by Mrs. DeCandia's husband, Alfred, who died last July. Before his death, the farm-house had been near by to protect it.

When they first arrived at the scene, the firemen went down the DeCandia house nearby to protect it.

Companies from the Town Fire Department in Manchester, the 8th District Fire Department, and from the Vernon Fire Department combined forces to quell the fire with water drawn from a Manchester Water Co. reservoir across Lake St. and carried by pumper truck from the hydrant at Lydall and Vernon streets, about a mile away.

There was no livestock in the barn, which is a series of three buildings and to end. One section, which contained the hay-splitters, was destroyed by the middle section, normally used as a garage, was nearly destroyed. The third section, which appears to be seriously damaged.

Another fire on the same property occurred last November. Mrs. DeCandia's house near by was badly damaged.

Anderson, who spent the past week on business in the state of Washington, told the Herald today that 80 per cent of the caucus selected city and town delegates there are committed to McCarthy.

Our No. 2 Problem?

Now, in the perspective of our domestic trauma, the war in Vietnam has all but faded to a secondary role...

It is no longer been, for the past few days, the number one headache, the number one disease in American life...

It is quite possible to take General Westmoreland's report, namely that "militarily we have never been in a better relative position in South Vietnam..."

Our position with regard to the bombing of North Vietnam has been improving, too, with informal signs that, by drawing our bombers still a little further to the south...

One might also say that it is part of our good position in Vietnam right now that Soviet Russia has been lifted, and the long nightmarish of the ordeal of our Marines there has been ended...

It is also good that United Nations Secretary General Thant, once the world figure most likely to be brushed aside by United States policy, has now been briefed and consulted by our highest authority, and seemed to find himself very busy on the fringe of management about times and places for the first negotiations...

There were in existence, it has been revealed, all kinds of intricate timetables for a number of gradual stages of de-escalation to be exchanged back and forth, each answering of each signifying an appropriate response supposedly not only moving talks forward, but in the atmosphere of mutual trust in which the first talks could take place...

Even Gold Got Healthier
When the gold crisis was at its height, and news of its imminent end even began to circulate, it was a relief to find an occasional analyst who would say, in language anybody might pretend to understand, that the real location of the crisis was not in the technicalities of the gold market, but in the political, spiritual, political health of the country itself...

But it might be pleasant to hear some relatively simple analysis like this, less of her personal safety. Then came the week of the great reversal in the standards and directions of the country of the dollar. Somehow, its leadership succeeded in restoring confidence in itself. Somehow, it seemed there might be an end to the national sickness of the war in Vietnam. And by the end of the week the forces that had once seemed at liberty to pounce on the gold position weakness of the country were finding themselves thrown back on their own plot and forced to run for cover...

Once again, there was an expert opinion which got away from the usual expertise. It said that the country's position on gold had improved more than they had thought to have improved as a result of any of the technical things done directly about the gold crisis. An improved general health had begun to provide an immunity to the infection carried by the gold bug...

The Forgotten People
Anyone who watched the TV coverage of the grim weekend's riots, and millions of Americans did, could hardly avoid astonishment at the close-up pictures of looters calmly walking out of stores laden with stolen goods while policemen looked the other way...

It is clear that what happened in the end was only remotely connected with riot and outrage over the murder of Martin Luther King. It is equally clear that those who participated in it were not even remotely representative of the vast majority of Negro people, the burning, the pillage, the looting, the vandalism, were a little regard for Dr. King and with little thought of making a civil rights protest. They were looters and vandals, pure and simple...

What is becoming increasingly clear, as the reports come in, is that in many places the looters and vandals were, at least in the beginning, given license to do as they pleased. Police were instructed to ignore those who smashed and helped themselves amid the wreckage of the stores. The troops called in to many instances used only to cord off an area, protecting the surrounding neighborhood, but not to enforce any property within...

The reasoning behind these orders may be understandable, and we have seen in such places as Chicago and the nation's capital, to let a looting riot turn into a disaster. The real sufferers were the decent, honorable, law-abiding Negroes...

The dead have not yet been accurately counted, but most of the score or more were Negroes. The property damage cannot yet be assessed, but it is hundreds of millions all over the Negro neighborhoods. In Washington alone the number of homes burned out by the vandals runs into the thousands of Negroes...

At the end of the matter, in the gutted areas the residents and the shopkeepers will face new difficulties in rebuilding and restoring their lives because of what was allowed to happen this past weekend. So if nothing else the grim weekend has let us see the other side of the dilemma. For too many and for too long the phrase "law and order" has been under a cloud, as if measures to preserve it were somehow merely acts of oppression aimed against the Negro people to put down their protests against their place in society...

Saving Ducks Is Project Of Bureau

BOCORRO, N.M. (AP) — Whether it's called the Mexican or New Mexican duck, the U.S. Bureau of Sports Fisheries is working to prevent its extinction...

The ducks currently number only about 1,200 and some doubt exists among naturalists whether the waterfowl actually are one species or two.

Nonresident officials at the Bosque del Apache National Wildlife Refuge 15 miles south of Socorro have started a program to create a habitat acceptable to the ducks and foster their survival.

The ducks are not adaptable, federal game personnel report, and prefer to nest near trees. Years ago the ducks nested along the Rio Grande valley but the development of farms and cities changed that. So officials are trying to create a habitat for the ducks.

Underground water fills the holes in 24 to 30 hours but it takes about a year for vegetation to grow sufficient for nesting.

Untreated ammonium nitrate and dynamite charges are set about five feet underground and detonated to create the ponds.

Each blast creates a pit about 20 feet wide and six feet deep.

The question of whether the New Mexican duck is really different from the Mexican duck centers around a few buff-necked feathers near the fox's neck.

Unlike migratory mallards, the species look almost exactly like a female mallard.

McCarthy Lauds LBJ Peace Move

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — Sen. Eugene J. McCarthy has praised President Johnson for seeking peace talks on the Vietnam war.

McCarthy, campaigning for the Democratic presidential nomination, said in a speech Wednesday night that the President's action was in response to public support of McCarthy's peace campaign.

This has proved wrong those who said the question of the Vietnam war should not be taken to the people, McCarthy told 4,000 persons, mostly students, in Fehring Municipal Auditorium, which had been equipped to seat 7,000.

He winds up today two days of campaigning for popularity votes and committed convention delegates in Nebraska's May 14 primary. He will deliver a convocation speech at Nebraska Wesleyan University before departing for Boston and another speech tonight.

The longest applause Wednesday night came when McCarthy said Johnson had responded to public opposition to the war by declaring "that this war must be brought to a close."

McCarthy drew strong reaction also when he suggested that meeting the plight of Negroes, kept for 100 years "in a kind of colonial status" in "our immediate and most pressing obligation."

Barring unexpected hunting pressures or natural catastrophes, game officials hope the ducks will make a comeback.

Dr. Jiri Kotlar told the newspaper Lidova Democratica Masaryk's remains may be exhumed if the investigation shows this necessary. He said the commission is assembling documents and "we can start investigations only if we meet with circumstances which would indicate a crime."

Masaryk's body was found in the courtyard of the Foreign Ministry March 16, 1946, less than a month after the Communist took over the government. The Socialist government said Masaryk had committed suicide by jumping from a second-story balcony but many persons felt he was murdered.
