More Montesquieu The "arrogance of Western culture" is the theme of a book written by Arthur

Hertzberg, a Columbia University lecturer and a rabbi. In his book, scheduled for publication in about a month, Rabbi Hertzberg advances the intriguing argument that anti-Semitism has its roots not in religion. but in 18th Century Enlightenment that intellectual, secularizing movement that is generally regarded as having laid the foundation for modern democratic

Rabbi Hertzberg's contention, as it emerged from an interview with a New York Times reporter, is that anti-Semitic and totalitarian rationale is planted in the Western mind by the major thinkers of the Enlightenment-Voltaire, Diderot and the others-who in turn borrowed it from Roman and Greek thought. Rabbi Hertzberg agrees in part with the widely accepted view that the Enlightenment propagated confidence in uman reason, political equality and the perfectability of man. But he argues that it also gave rise to Western inability to meet other peoples as equals and to the determination to remake or to exclude

other peoples. America, he holds, is less vulnerable to this Western cultural arrogance because its founders drew their inspiration from Montesquieu, the one major Enlightenment figure whose vision of freeom was for all people of all traditions. Nevertheless he finds a domestic application of the idea that "in order t arrive at culture, you've got to be like us," in relations with Negroes.

He puts it this way: "Here at home we say to the Negro. 'Be an amateur white man or stew in your bloody ghet-Montesquieu notwithstanding, there are a number of American Negroes who condemn the whole of Western culture

as a package and reject the idea of ever integrating with the American version of it. They do not, at this point, represent more than a small minority. It is very easy to infer, if we accept the writer's view, that in its international dealings, the West-including the United States—must suspend its cultural prejudices if it is to maintain any semblance

of amity with Africa and the Orient. What is more difficult to cope with are the domestic implications of the rabbi's contention about Western culture and the people who make it up. If we do ndeed have in our makeup some inherent cultural arrogance, how is racial integration to be achieved in the United States? Not by a mere suspension of the arrogance for the sake of amity or ac-

Integration means more than the accommodation of one society to another to avoid an occasional conflict. It means Negroes and whites living side by side day after day in the same society.

It cannot happen in the presence of my built-in arrogance. We can hope there is enough Montesquieu in our rationale to help us purge that arrogance. The Riot Report by the President's commission makes it clear that the alternative is a division into two separate so-

Collective Guilt Again

In a time of national sadness and tension it is understandable that some talk a bit foolishly, as some are doing when they accuse white America of collective guilt in the slaying of Martin Luther King. So it was, too, in the days after President Kennedy's assassination. But when erudtie people like anthro pologist Ashley Montagu voice the sentiment, perhaps it's worth a word of re buttal. In a recent letter to the New York Times, Mr. Montagu contends that white Americans "are as responsible for the death of one of humanity's great est leaders, Martin Luther King, as it we had pulled the trigger ourselves If that language isn't strong enough, 'race problem', there is no 'Negro problem', but there is a sick white man problem, and he is the Negro's problem well as humanity's challenge. Now of course no one denies the ter rible sufferings and wrongness of slav ery or that many Negroes have had a bad time since emancipation. A white American today can readily curse the

slave ship captains of 300 years ago (and let's not forget the Arabs and th African tribal chiefs who made the trade possible). But collective guilt is another matter entirely. Americans did not invent slavery, as an anthropologist ought to know. It is least as old as the human being's dis covery that something more useful could be done with captured enemies than killing them or eating them. It has existed

ly disguised. Americans, in any event, did put ar end to slavery in this country, belated ly to be sure but definitely. They have tried, especially through the law, to give the Negro full citizenship and in recent years they have gone far in that direct tion. That it has not been easy on any body is in part because there is indeed a race problem -here and everywhere hat different races confront each other Racial antipathy or fear or whatever it is exists not only in South Africa but also in the newly independent black conrolled African states, and between Africans of different tribes; some of our own Negro spokesmen are frankly white

haters. It exists not only in America but in England and elsewhere. We don't even have to discuss something so fundamen tal as race; a look at a bellicose world shows it rife with enmity among nations even of the same ethnic strain. None of which justifies racial resent-

ments in America, although this country has dealt with the problem as well as any and better than most. It ought to be possible, however, to realize that racial attitudes lie deep in human nature and are not confined to one nation or one race. Those who hope and endeavor to eradicate such feelings deserve praise

So one thing wrong with the notion of collective guilt is that, whether its theorists perceive it or not, it in effect white America is guilty (albeit most are demonstrably innocent), and if racial emotions are universal, then it is human nature itself that is under attack. And where does that get anyone?

Another thing wrong with the theory is that it denies individual responsibilities ity. If all are guilty, the one who did he deed is not more so, even though in his case one specific individual obviousy did pull the trigger. It doesn't add up to a very edifying concept of morality or justice. That consideration suggests what is

probably basically wrong with the collective-guilt doctrine: It simply doesn't make any sense. The people who espouse it in connection with race would not dream of doing so in other, perfecty analogous contexts. At any rate we do not hear them denouncing the Russian peoples collectively for Stalin's hideous crimes, including mass murder and slave labor. Or proclaiming that, since we Americans derive mostly from Europe, we are therefore to be held responsible for medieval serfdom. Nor are these theorists likely to ap-

prove of the idea of guilt by association. Yet collective guilt is guilt by as-In the days since the murder of Martin Luther King, the American people have shown their profound sorrow at he event. Even in the midst of the riots that followed, the response has been more sorrow than anger. Unquesionably the majority of both races wish that such tragedies could not happen and that amelioration could come faster. #### U.S. Jets Set 1968 Record For Missions

estimated 135 enemy troops, hiding along Highway 9 the Khe Sanh combat base, sisters, opened fire simultaneously on the slow-moving 12-truck convoy and the road-clearing patrol about 200 yards away.

The U.S. Command said the patrol called in artillery and air strikes and tried to encircle the attackers, but when the eighthour fight ended at dusk the enemy had faded away, dragging their dead and wounded with them. Four Marines were killed and 20 wounded, spokesmen said, and the convoy suffered

moderate damage. Highway 9, closed since November, was opened in the allies' Operation Pegasus, which broke the 77-day North Vietnamese siege of Khe Sanh two weeks ago. During the siege, the Marines at the northwest frontier outpost had to be supplied

by air. Scattered clashes have continued around Khe Sanh as Marine engineers worked to repair the heavily scarred highway. Enemy gunners also have been shelling Khe Sanh since the siege ended, although not as heavily as during the siege.

U.S. troops sweeping around Khe Sanh Thursday and Fridey turned up the bodies of 22 more enemy soldiers killed in sporadic action since Tuesday, U.S. spokesmen said. They said the latest count put casualties for 29 enemy and 19 U.S. Marines killed and 66 Marines wounded. Other sharp firefights were reported in widely scattered areas of South Vietnam Friday.

Some 250 programs and individuals have been nominated blended perfectly. for industry honor. There are now 31 formal categories for awards plus a number of other broad areas for citation. In the news, documentary and actuality categories alone there are a total of almost 80 nominations.

As usual, some of the nominations in the entertainment categories involve programs dropped for next season —both NBC's "I Spy" and "Run For Your Life" and their stars are up for awards.

Five series, none less than two seasons old, are rivals for an Emmy in the "outstanding comedy series" category, but not one new series made the list. And the way the categories are set up permits one actor to be nominated for two Emmies for playing the same role.

Raymond Burr is up for his performance "by an actor in a leading role in a drama" in "Ironside," a two-hour madefor-TV feature, which was actually a pilot for the series "Ironside" that followed it. He is up for another Emmy for playing the same character in the series.

With such a raft of nominations, it is almost impossible to single out any programs or performers for special mention. And many of the nominated programs were not particularly impressive.

It may be that the large number of nominations is the result of the rather simple method of nominating. It may be done by an academy member, a producer or even some of the craftsmen of the business. However, winners will be chosen by experts namd by thee academy.

The awards will come May 19 on an NBC program scheduled for 90 minutes. But with so many categories, it may be difficult to crowd the awards, the envelope-opening and the thank-you speeches into the time period.






