There is still some small room left for sanity and logic in this world of ours. Washington comment is beginning to discover that President Johnson actually strengthened himself, rather than lame-ducked himself, with his twin announcements of March 31.

For a time, we were treated to super-Sotal judgments that, by taking himself out of the race, the President had destroyed his own power for the very policy objects he had in mind. These superficial judgments ignored any possible importance for elements of

power which might be founded in moral They were, in fact, the same kind of superficial judgments which, only a few weeks before had been concluding rather unanimously that it was very foolish of Senator McCarthy to even think of en-

tering the New Hampshire primary. To us, it seemed logical and inevit able, from the moment of the President's announcement, that he had suddenly increased and magnified his own power as a leader many times over what it had been before.

And nothing seemed more cruel than the verdict of so many soothsayers that the President, by his course of action, had taken a defeatist course of dwir dling influence for himself. Now, as we note, a sounder and more

In describing President Johnson's increase, rather than decrease, in power, Correspondent Frankel cites his "ability to put pressure on Congress for a tax increase with a minimum spending cut" and his "great tactical flexibility in the developing talks with North Vietnam." Perhaps the most truly remarkable thing about this evolving assessment of the President's power is that it is being made by people who do accept the President's retirement decision as a final thing. It is, therefore, very definitey power of the moral, intangible kind they are conceding him. Perhaps people in public life should try that kind o power more often, not merely to retire by, but as an occasional fuel for careers hey intend to continue.

It may be that, just as scientific prog ress in general has been so accelerate in recent years that the discoveries and accomplishments of the last few decades can be said to equal all the previous progress of mankind, so we are on the verge of a development which will speed up the evolution of the science of clothing ourselves toward a swift solution of problems unsolved for centuries.

That led us on to speculation about the possible design of a seamless, one-piece, all-purpose, all-climate garment which might bring man at least to the simplicity and comfort enjoyed by the lowliest fur-cloaked animal.

Contrary to what some townspeople may expect, the Birs Department does not provide a pool filling service to residents.

Chief Phillip Cromble has stated that "Unfortunately some salesmen sell pools and give the impression that the local fire department will fill them. This is not the case in South Windsor."

"Because of the necessity for keeping fire equipment available for fires and because of the great number of requests received, the South Windsor Fire Department several years ago established its policy of not filling pools. Neither does the department lend hose and equipment to pool owners who wish to fill their own pools."

The Connecticut Water Company official recently noted many residents fill their pools over the Memorial Day weekend, and the water pressure is seriously lowered. Many water users putting a great drain on the water supply could lower the level necessary for complete fire protection.
