## 'Scandal' in Spotlight

NEW YORK—"Starvation in India may be a miserable fact of life, but hunger in America is nothing less than a national scandal," says CBS News producer Martin Carr, whose "Hunger in America" will be Tuesday 10 to 11 p.m.

The broadcast focuses on the approximately 10 million Americans who get neither the right food nor enough of it. "The people we study," says Carr, "literally do not know where their next meal is coming from—and sometimes it doesn't come from anywhere. Hunger is much worse than poverty; food is the most basic of all human needs. Man can manage to live without shelter, without clothing, even without love. Poverty, unpleasant as it is, is bearable."

To portray "Hunger in America," Carr had his cameras focus on four diverse groups: The tenant farmers of Loudoun County, Va., the Mexican-Americans of San Antonio, Texas, the Navajo Indians of Tuba City, Ariz., and Negro sharecroppers in rural Alabama.

Starvation, as explained by

Carr, is a headline word, a journalistic conceit when applied to America. "But while there is little real starvation," he says, "there is severe and widespread malnutrition, and it affects millions. Although it is inadequate, there is usually some kind of food. The Indians have their fried bread; the Mexican-Americans eat tortillas and beans. The Negro sharecroppers have grits and potatoes, and sometimes turnip greens. The white tenant farmers of Virginia have potatoe sand beans. The important fact is that this kind of diet simply does not sustain an active, productive life."

Fat, Carr points out, is no sign of health; indeed, excessive fat is often a sign of malnutrition.

"Hunger in America" describes the hungry Americans not only through the eyes of some of the hungry, but as they are seen by the people who devote their lives to helping them—the medical officer of Loudoun County, a Roman Catholic priest in San Antonio, a doctor who has spent 14 years working with the Navajo Indians and a doctor in Selma, Ala.

## Awards Show Sunday Closes an Ungolden Season

NEW YORK (AP) — Television's awards show, in which the Emmys will be passed out, comes along next Sunday night, pretty much winding up the awards season.

This has not been one of television's golden years. By and large, the regular fare, the series, have been predictable, grade B stuff. There has been a feast of old movies and a famine of meaty, quality drama.

This viewer, confronted with almost 250 nominees would find it difficult to pick a favorite program or performer in most of the 47 categories.

Certainly much of the sea-

son's excitement was stimulated, first, by "The Smothers Brothers Comedy Hour," and later, by "Rowan and Martin's Laugh-in." Both shows have several nominations and certainly deserve recognition if only for bringing some spice, daring and often a point of view into an entertainment area that had been slipping into a bland and perfunctory rut.

Occasionally there may have been lapses in taste and the viewer on occasion could disagree violently with their expressions of opinion, but the two shows combined to make a more stimulating season.

"CBS Playhouse" made a stab at bringing back meaning-

ful, original drama, and had some success with two efforts, "Do Not Go Gentle into that Good Night" and "Dear Friends."

ABC's adaptations of some old movies with new stars didn't come off very well, but "A Case of Label," with Van Heflin recreating his stage role, provided a fine evening of television.

Among the variety specials, one recalls with affection, "Herb Alpert and the Tijuana Brass," on CBS, a most imaginative show, and Frank Sinatra's NBC special with Ella Fitzgerald.

Raymond Burr probably deserves some award for managing, within a few months, to blur his well-established image

as Perry Mason by developing a completely different and equally convincing character named Ironside—so convincing a lot of fans believe Burr is really paralyzed and in a wheel chair.

"PBL" on the educational network tried hard if not always successfully, in the current affairs area. ABC's "The Rise and Fall of the Third Reich" was a painstaking and well-researched three-part series, and its "Africa," a marathon program that taxed the viewer's stamina, was certainly an ambitious piece of public service.

That does not add up to much of a list when one considers the thousands of hours of programming that went on the air. That is just one viewer's list—and

any fairly regular viewer can make up his own.

There were all those fine hours of sports which television handles so expertly. There were the news shows, the discussion group, the interviews and the analyzing, many of them enlightening, most of them well done.

But rarely does a single program stand out in memory like Eric Sevareid's conversation with Erich Hoffer, or carry the wallop of the educational network's documentary on migrant farm workers, "What Harvest for the Reaper?"

It may not have been a notable TV year, but the viewers apparently were enchanted by it. The most recent Nielsen surveys found that the average set was in use 6½ hours daily last January—peak viewing month—and had dropped off only one hour in April.

## Missionaries Now

NEW YORK (AP) — There are a number of good, serviceable series titles in television which are carefully designed to cover a wide range of material and subjects—"American Profile," "Omnibus," "White Paper," "Houseparty."

Perhaps the best umbrella title of all is appended to ABC's long-playing skein of actuality shows "The Saga of Western Man."

As it has worked out over the past few seasons, this title is a catch-all for just about any subject that piques the interest of its executive producer, John Secondari, a quadruple-threat operator who has turned out a best-selling novel, done service as a news man, writes and narrates his own shows.

In the past three seasons, Secondari's attention has rested on such diverse subjects as Leonardo da Vinci's contributions to civilization, Columbus' journeys to the New World, a play-by-play reconstruction of Custer's last stand and the slow crumbling of Venice into the waters from which it a rose. Now, in a real change of pace, "Saga" will come up with a documentary about contemporary missionaries in India and the islands of Micronesia in the Pacific.

To make "In the Name of God," the missionary special scheduled for Monday night, director John Hughes and a photography team headed by one of the best men in the business, William Hartigan, spent months in out-of-the-way tropical islands and poverty-stricken corners of India shooting thousands of feet showing modern missionaries at work.

Hughes, who started out with some preconceived notions on the subject, was surprised at what he found.

"The last thing in the world they seem to want to do these days is convert people," Hughes reported. "Mostly modern missionaries are interested in helping the natives. They are concerned with constructing—houses and roads—and digging wells, educating the children and improving health and diets."

In the course of two months in and around the Caroline Islands, Hughes saw more examples of missionaries helping people than converting them to Christianity. His one regret about the resulting program is that time does not permit showing film of teams of young natives of Ponape, a remote island, playing baseball with the enthusiasm of American boys.

HOLLYWOOD (NEA) - Another new television personality is Richard Bradford, starring in ABC's surprise, "Man in a Suitcase." This show has to be called a spring replacement - too late to be mid-winter, too early to be summer. Bradford is a handsome, quiet, prematurely gray actor. And, even if the series is a hit, he won't do any more of them. "They were shot in London and unless they give him a little piece of Fort Knox to call his own, he's had it. He comes from Texas, via the Actor's Studio in New York. Originally, he wanted to be a ballplayer (base, foot or both) but a combination of injuries and bad breaks stopped that. If it does, there's a dilemma. Richard Bradford may be the first television star to quit a hit before the series is aired here.
