Humphrey Is Big Choice Of Pennsylvania Delegates

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — 27 to 1 ahead of Sen. Robert Kennedy and 3 to 1 in front of Sen. Eugene J. McCarthy. Pennsylvania, with 122 delegates, will have 130 votes at the party's national convention in Chicago this August. This is about 10 per cent of the number needed to win the nomination.

The delegation is the third largest among the states. The AP poll and telephone survey lists these Pennsylvania voters: Humphrey 63%, McCarthy 19%, Kennedy 2%, uncommitted or untraced 45%. It is almost a clear majority with a third of the votes still up for grabs. Humphrey supporters in the big industrial state are headed by former Gov. George M. Leader, and they claim that nearly all of those who still have "no choice" will be with the vice president at the convention's first roll call. Humphrey, reached at Washington, said he preferred not to comment on the AP poll and would rather wait until the delegates themselves take some definitive action. Film at Trial Shows Spock Blasting LBJ

BOSTON (AP)—The government showed a television film today of a Nov. 26, 1967, news conference at which Dr. Benjamin Spock called President Johnson "a deceitful and belligerent man who doesn't admit he makes mistakes."

The television film began the second week of the trial of Spock and four codefendants on charges of conspiring to counsel young Americans to avoid the draft.

At the news conference, Spock said he wanted to do "everything I can to end the war in Vietnam."

Prosecution testimony last week centered on a meeting last October inside the Justice Department building in Washington.

On trial with 65-year-old baby doctor are Yale Chaplain William Sloane Coffin Jr., 43; Michael Ferber, 23, a Harvard graduate student; Mitchell Goodman, 44, a New York writer and teacher; and Marcus Raskin, 33, a Washington research director.

The trial recessed Friday after testimony by John McDonough, an assistant deputy U.S. attorney general, who said Spock, Coffin, Goodman and Raskin demanded last Oct. 20 that he accept from them a briefcase filled with draft cards and facialies.

Reagan Says He's Hoping For Solid Vote in Oregon

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Gov. Ronald Reagan says he is hoping for a solid vote for him in Oregon's presidential primary Tuesday.

"Prize alone would make me now that I have been injected into the race, want to at least hold my head up," he told a crowd of 500 people in a hall here Saturday.

Reagan said an issue before the Oregon voters is "the winability" of the Republican nominee.

Despite this, Reagan said again he will not travel to Oregon for a personal appeal for support. He said he will not make an announcement of candidacy, but will "technically" become a candidate when his name is placed in nomination at the convention as a favorite son.

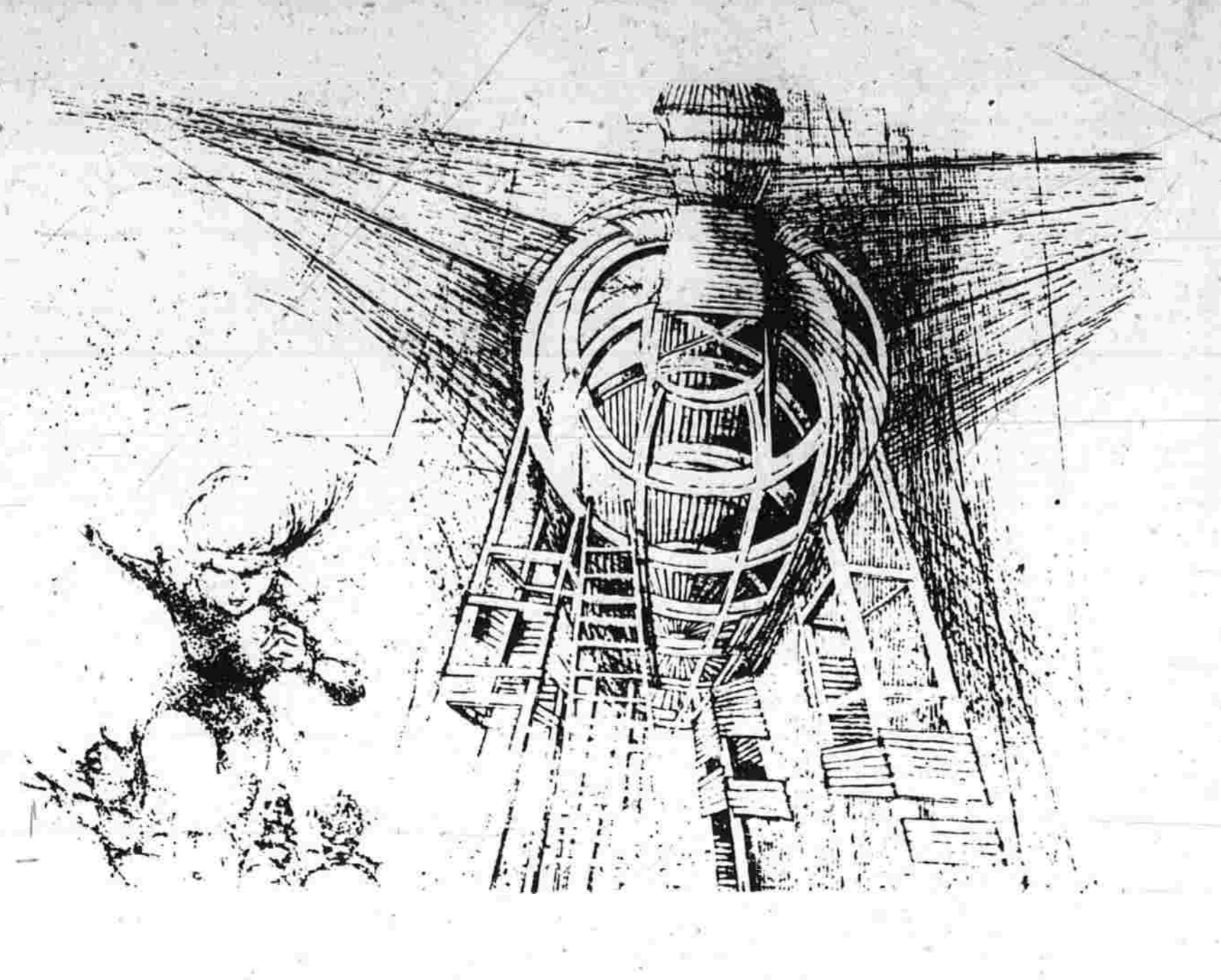
