### Tolland County Politics King Urges State Income Tax

State Rep. Robert D. King urged establishment of a Memorial Day fund to provide an annual amount equal to one-half of the annual revenue needed to run all local governments. The fund would be used to aid towns.

King, speaking at Memorial Day exercises in Ellington, said the fund could be financed by adoption of a graduated income tax. Thirty other states already have such a tax, he said.

Under the present tax set-up each taxpayer does not bear his fair share, according to King, who is seeking another term in the legislature.

"At the local level the property tax has been pushed to the limit. On the state level the sales tax and assorted other taxes combined cannot, it appears, be fairly applied if they are made to yield the vast amount of money which must be raised to keep Connecticut governments from falling behind," according to the legislator.

King cited the lack of a "fixed relationship" between costs of local government and state grants as a principal reason that towns and cities have sharp increases in their mill rates.

"The town's costs rise like skyrocket, but state aid generally continues on existing levels," King pointed out.

"There can be no relief to local government from the overburdening effects of the property tax until two major changes are made," he added.

Direct aid to the towns must be increased dramatically," he stated. "Secondly, there must be a fixed relationship between the amount of local property tax levied and increase in state grants."

The towns and cities through-out the state raised \$4 by local taxation for every dollar they received in state grants, according to King.

Connecticut towns and cities raised \$518.5 million by property taxes in 1968-69, according to King, of which \$400 million was spent for public education. The municipalities in turn received almost \$130 million in state grants, including \$121 million for public education, according to King.

### Sheinwold on Bridge

NEVER UNDERESTIMATE THE POWER OF A QUEEN

By ALFRED SHEINWOLD

If you want to be popular in bridge circles you must develop your skill. You cannot afford to rely on your luck, as today's hand clearly shows.

Opening lead eight of spades. Declarer won the first trick in dummy with the king of spades and led out the ace and jack of clubs. East naturally played low, and dummy's jack won the trick. Unable to develop the clubs, South could win only seven tricks. Down two, for a loss of 200 points. South failed because he relied on his partner's jack.

The Impossible Scheme  
South cannot possibly develop four club tricks by leading out the ace and jack. Even if one opponent has K-c of clubs, the other must have 10-x-c; and the suit will still produce only two tricks.

South must hope for K-x-c of clubs in the East hand or 10-x-c of clubs on either side. And since East will not take the king of clubs on the second trick, South must rely on his own queen instead of on dummy's jack.

Daily Question  
Partner opens with one heart, you respond one spade, and partner bids 2 NT. You hold: Spades, Q-J-4-3; Hearts, J-4; Diamonds, Q-8; Clubs, K-7-6-2. What do you say?  
Answer: Bid three clubs. If partner has 3-card support for spades he will now bid three hearts or perhaps three diamonds, and you will wind up in 3 NT.

After the main speech delivered by Rev. Paul C. Kaiser, hot and weary the marchers headed for the shade of the park's leafy trees while speakers took their seats and cleared their dry throats.

As the last echoing notes of a bugle sounded, National Guardsmen looked on around the Civil War Monument while the bronzed old soldier upon it unaffectedly gazed through wizened eyelids.

The master of ceremonies, Theodore Fairbanks introduced Colonel Bayless, who delivered a welcome.

The invocation by Father Joseph E. Vuja of St. James' Church was followed by a faultless delivery of the Gettysburg Address from memory, by Miss Laura Kurtz of Manchester High School.

"A Memorial", this years winning essay written by Miss Pamela Lee Hamilton, also an MHS student, and entered in the Permanent Memorial Day Committee's annual contest, was read by the author.

(Continued from Page One) To and 5.5 miles from the border junction of Vietnam, Laos and Cambodia. The base is less than 300 miles from Saigon and one U.S. source commented: "That's the farthest south we've ever received artillery fire."

Fourth Infantry troops turned back an enemy ground assault with heavy artillery fire 11 miles west of Dak To, and B52 bombers dropped nearly 1,000 tons of bombs northeast of Dak To and west of Kontum in efforts to chop up some 15,000 enemy troops massing in the highlands.

While Viet Cong infiltrated into the western part of Saigon, South Vietnamese marines, dive bombers and helicopter gunships appeared to be holding their own at bay on the capital's northeastern outskirts.

But 40 dieldrich guerrillas holed up in the northern floor of a villa in the northeastern quarter beat back repeated assaults by the marines and tanks. One tank was knocked out by a Viet Cong bazooka, one marine was killed and eight others were wounded.

**Don't Destroy Great Nation, Kaiser Admonishes**

The words did not come easily for Paul C. Kaiser, former pastor of Manchester's Concordia Lutheran Church, as he delivered the keynote speech at annual Memorial Day ceremonies in Center Park yesterday.

"I stand before you feeling unworthy of this honor," said the former clergyman, "having never made the sacrifice many well and prosper more than in New York harbor that begins, and ends. Send these, the home-God, with liberty and justice for all."

words that stand out most in my mind on this occasion are these: "Greater love hath no man than this who would lay down his life for his friends." That is the sacrifice those we honor today have made.

Kaiser spoke of a great nation in which the true meaning of the spirit with which that nation was born is the sacrifice those we honor today have made.

He recalled a quotation from a patriot who did not long ago but indicated that an element of decay has begun to dissolve the nation in which that nation was born.

He cited a popular song entitled "What the World Needs Now Is Love." "That's so true," he said, "but it must be a positive love, one that expects nothing in return.

"We must have self discipline," he suggested. "If you continually punish a child, you will break his spirit, leaving him dull and without fortitude; the same can happen to a country.

"The emphasis must be on the individual in a nation that boasts of liberty, regardless of creed or color. You are the purpose for which these people lived and died.

"We must have a nation with the courage to face the things it can not change, to change the things it must, and the wisdom to know the difference between the two."

Constant discussions of salaries throughout the budget deliberations led Houley to study the matter. He came up with a proposal which, although not accepted officially by the board, led members to approve a motion that will fund \$1,000 for a job evaluation study in the town.

Representative Houley noted that the board basically agrees that a salary schedule is needed but is not ready to act on any salary item except if the administration feels a particular position is not functioning properly.
