

If any of us possess any kind of wisiom, there is perhaps more of a disposiion than ever before to concede that there may be as much as in the wisdom of the young as there is in that of the old. An Advantage Of Autocracy

The new, technically annoying and psychologically disturbing East German curbs on West German travel and commerce into the city of West Berlin have come at a time when the West German Government at Bonn has been concentrating heavily on improved relations with the Communist satellites of Eastern Europe and also at a time when President Johnson in Washington has been putting great emphasis on public expression of his hopes for better cooperation between the United States and

The result of this timing, and this apparent crossing of purposes, has been to make both Bonn and Washington irresolute, even though both would, it seems to us, have to conclude that the new hindrances placed about West Berlin originate not in East Germany but in Mos-

Bonn is irresolute because, if this is a

move by East Germany aimed in re-

prisal for Bonn's wooing of other Rus-

sian satellites, Bonn wants to hold its own main energy precisely for a con-tinuation of such diplomatic operations. Washington is irresolute because the new East German regulations are not in any way a challenge to the American presence or privilege in West Berlin. What this adds up to, then, is a situation in which Western diplomacy is not prepared to match the urgency of Western news headlines, which have a fire horse habit of responding with big type to every revival of Communist pressure on the Western advance enclave which is West Berlin. Western diplomacy may feel that, to win the battle in Western headlines, it might have to resort to policles more severe than the actual dimensions of the new trouble for West Berlin justify. It may be, then, that the Communist strategy is going to be conceded a kind of victory, in that it has tweaked the West's nose, and been allowed to get

The Hippie Alert

The hippies who gathered out in the mountains of Colorado, on the assumption that the asteroid Icarus might hit this old planet earth, and that, if it did. this particular region might be one region spared catastrophic damage from the collision, were not totally wrong. Asteroids sometimes do hit the earth, or the moon. Conceivably, some of the great natural disasters part of almost every folklore were actual happenings as the result of such collisions in the

Furthermore, the mountains of Colorado, famous for their beautiful gorges between their peaks and ridges, might well be the perfect place to hide, if one were expecting some astral collision. In short, the hippies were not totally crazy in this respect, any more than they have been totally crazy in some other aspects of their beliefs and con-

. To the contrary, we are inclined to salute them for their alertness and their awareness and their willingness to do something about it. There are a number of possibilities

which could mean the end of this poor world. The hippies out in Colorado at least had the capacity to single out one of these possibilities and try to sound an alert and lead an escape.

They also had the good taste to select a particular end of the world possibility which had a certain attractiveness about it. How much more pleasant it is to contemplate having our world come to an end because of the inevitable wandering of some asteroid, irrevocably decreed from the moment of the creation itself than to have to try to blame it on some nation, or some human political creed, or some scientist, or even, if we wanted to be really honest about it, ourselves in our own individual little sectors of life

Will The World Learn Anything? Many deserved tributes have been paid

President Johnson has spoken of the "tragedy and senseless violence" that brought his death The Archbishop of Canterbury has said that, in the horror at this event, "we shall renew our efforts in the cause of just and nonviolent solutions of our human problems." The Swedish Foreign Minister has spoken of "a defeat not only for American democracy but for democratic values as such." The Prime Minister of New Zealand has said that "for the United States to lose its gifted men in this way is a sad distortion of the freedoms which they in turn have fought to preserve." In Cairo the Government's official spokesman has condemned the killing of Senator Kennedy, "whatever the nationality of the assassin may be." peace pray that Robert Kennedy will not have died in vain, that the message of cooperation, of brotherly love, and of mess that he so courageousl

preached will echo down the ages." Will that message, in truth, find any echo in the Middle East? Will a genuine effort be made on both sides to stop the war in Vietnam? Will a "just and nonviolent solution" be sought in Biafra or south of the Zambezi? Will American democracy (and democracy everywhere ry harder than before to rid itself of awlessness, hatred, and violence? Shall we, as President Johnson asks, "purge he hostility from our hearts and prac-

tise moderation with our tongues"? The killing of Robert Kennedy had seeds both in the sickness of American ociety and in international violence Will his tragic death change anything in the world? Will the shock lead to any softening of rigid attitudes? In every zone of war or imminent war the way could be opened for nonviolent solutions Over, the Middle East, Vietnam, and Biafra negotiations are being sought; over each a deadlock persists. Over each a change of heart is needed, for the alternative is a relapse into more killing,

devastation, and misery.

A year after the June war, is it impossible for the Arabs and Jews to meet? Mr. Jarring's mission seems near its final frustration. Yet more is needed than readiness on the Arab side to mee the Israelis face to face, which so far the Arab Governments have refused, o readiness on the Israeli side to apply in practice the principles of the UN resolution. Both sides must accept in their others have just claims. The Arabs must honestly accept that the State of Israel has a right to exist in peace and security, however unjustly, in their eyes, it was carved out of Arab territory. And the Israelis, no less, must accept in their hearts that the Arabs, even on the west

bank, have the right to rule themselves

in their own way and be treated as fel Vietnam calls for changes of heart no less deep. Vietnamese must learn to live with Vittnamese. The Northerners and the Vietcong will have to accept that theirs is not the only admissible form of society and that people in the South ferent. In the South, equally, those in authority will have to accept that the National Liberation Front and its members cannot be kept out of civil and political life if peace is to be attained. When families have been torn apart with brothers and sisters fighting on op-posite sides, reconciliation is hard. But just because of such tragic divisions the value of nonviolent reconciliation ought to be the more obvious. And American hearts, too, must change: To an understanding that, however worthy the motives which took the US forces to Vietnam, the outcome has been terrible human suffering. That, at least, is some thing which Senator Kennedy himself was directly conveying to his countrymen. It is something that they have be gun to understand.
