





to analyze why this decline in casualties in the field should be taking place, then we leave the area of good certainty fewer human beings killed, the reality of peace therefore being nearer - and enter the realm of controversial and inconclusive speculation.

At the top and best speculative level. this decline in combat could be the ene-31 restriction in our bombing areas. Or it could be a mutual de-escalation being indertaken, consciously and deliberately, by both sides.

At the worst, it could be what many military analysts in Vietnam seem to think - the enemy lull during which he is building up strength and supplies for one more spectacular offensive before

phically are likely to turn toward violence in compensation for the loss they haven't learned to bear. To be honest about it, they make clear they don't want us to turn into full lifetime losers, who get so we never

"Nice guys finish last," Leo Durocher is supposed to have observed, long before he began demonstrating that you don't really have to be nice to finish at the bottom of the standings.

Now the psychiatrists want to veer away from the alleged cause and effect relationship.
