Condominium Application Before Planners Tonight

Public hearings and present positions point to the presence of a large crowd tonight at the Buckley School when the Town Planning Commission conducts a public hearing on the second plan revision of the proposed Green Manor condominium for the north side of Lyndon Hill, near Vernon St.

The commission has already denied applications filed on the large project in November of last year and in February of this year, and a court appeal on the denial is pending.

More than 500 citizens packed into Buckley School, the site of tonight's hearing, last October to hear the original Green Manor plan that called for 302 dwelling units, 90 one-bedroom, 122 two-bedroom, 122 three-bedroom and 30 four-bedroom homes, arranged in a town house. At that time, the commission also was expected to be offered for prices ranging from \$15,000-\$22,000.

The commission has already denied applications filed on the large project in November of last year and in February of this year, and a court appeal on the denial is pending.

Vernon Town Needs Petition to Allow Bingo

To make bingo games legal town-wide, the Board of Representatives must have a petition signed by one percent of the town voters, Abbott School, town attorney, said the board last night.

A suggestion to make the game legal was made by George Trapp, chief of police, who explained that at the present time bingo is only allowed in the former city area.

Chief Trapp said he has not received any request from bingo operators to have a full and equal chance to have bingo if they desire.
