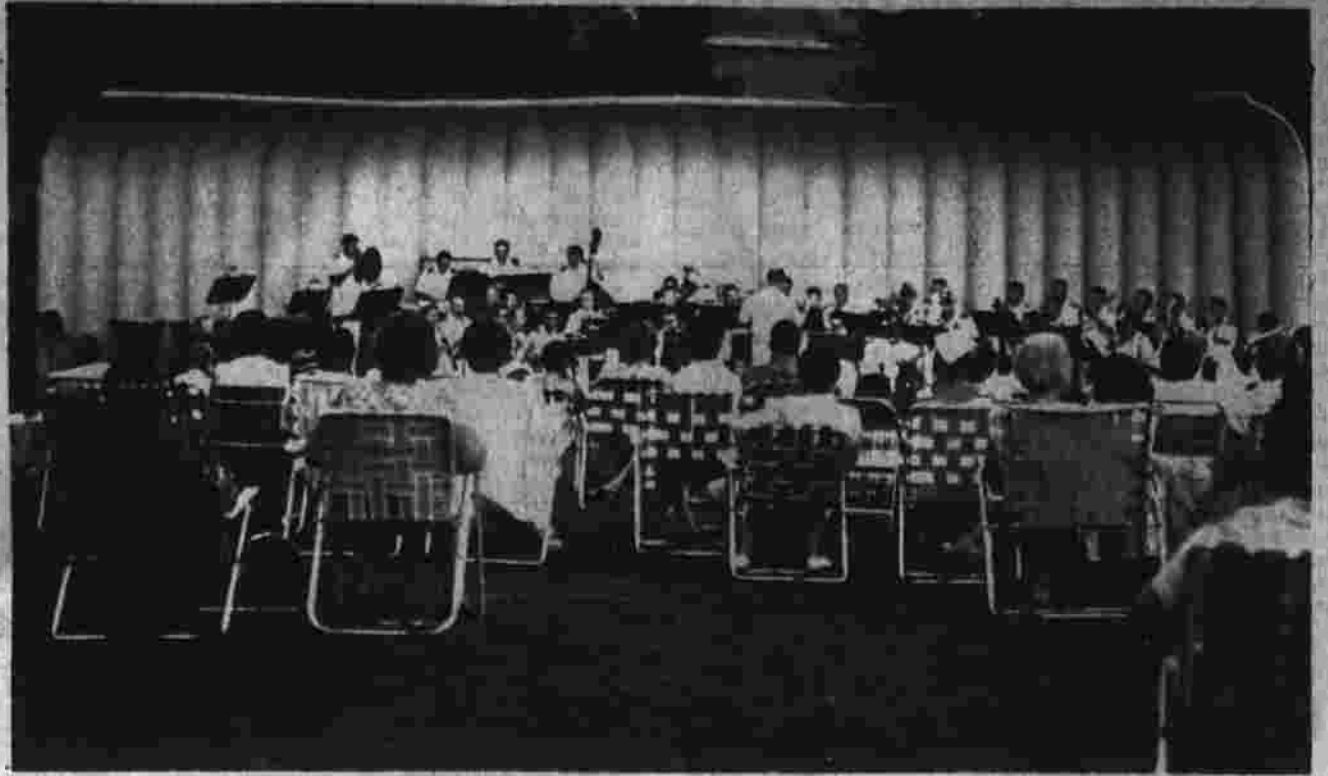

Court Refuses To Bar Fees For Divorce

New Haven (AP) — Nine women have been turned down by a federal court in their attempt to get a \$46 divorce suit filed free of court costs.

The women claim that the fee discriminates against the poor and denies them the equal protection of the laws guaranteed by the 14th Amendment to the Federal Constitution.

"We would hesitate to act until the ordinary political process has an opportunity to function on a normal course," said the judge.

The three-judge federal panel dismissed their suit Wednesday against the State of Connecticut.

The women now plan to appeal to the U.S. Court of Appeals in New York City, according to a representative of the New Haven Civil Liberties Council.

Coventry, England's Rebuilding

It was double-feature cinema last night, together of the activities in connection with the visit of 100 people from Coventry, England. Last night's films were brought here by the British guests, and gave quite a dramatic recounting of the rebuilding of a city virtually destroyed by German bombs in November 1940.

The history of Coventry goes back 600 years to the rise of Lady Godiva, who was protesting against her husband's taxation policies. One gentleman of the period broke the vow to stay behind his window while Lady Godiva was riding through the streets and he became known as Peeping Tom. For his misdemeanor, he was struck blind.

The main landmark of the city, the Cathedral of St. Michael, was almost destroyed during the bombing, but the shell and the spire were left standing. From the remains of this five-century-old cathedral grew one of the most controversial architectural projects of the decade, the new Coventry Cathedral.

Incorporating the remaining shell and spire, the new cathedral was begun in 1962 and finished in 1967. The original cathedral took 125 years to complete.

Plans for the new, new structure began in 1960, when a competition was held to choose an architect. Monetary Managers Must Walk Tightrope

 NEW YORK (AP) — You don't hear much today about the New Economists, for in baseball, politics or economics you don't praise the coaches when they aren't winning. And there have been no real big winning streaks this year.

Still, some of the same spirit and confidence and sense of balance that made the New Economists appear to be such winners during the balanced boom of a few years ago will be needed during the next 12 months.

During this time our economic leaders will be trying to cool things, but not to the degree of provoking a freeze. Their thermostat, so to speak, must be very sensitive, as were those of the New Economists.

The New Economists in their heyday advocated "fine tuning" to keep the economy constantly at a near maximum pitch, through use of short-term restraints such as temporary taxes, and spend, such as lower taxes or more spending.

In a way, they viewed the economy as a pretty balloon to be kept firm and fat. If the balloon looked a bit tired they blew in enough air to make the wrinkles disappear. If needed, they could leak a little air from time to time.

For a while the New Economists seemed to keep the balloon firm, neither too tight nor too slack. And to this day you will not find a dyed-in-the-wool New Economist who will admit that failure was in their method. They are more inclined to blame the politicians.

These politicians, it seems, became fascinated with the big bright balloon, saw in it a symbol of perfection and sought to make it more nearly perfect. They pumped in so much air that it appeared swollen and quite vulnerable to a pin.

So now, just as it was important to inflate to the proper pressure, it is necessary to let the air out at the correct speed and for the right length of time. It is a delicate job.

In most ways the present assignment is more ticklish than was that of the New Economists. The dollar must be protected for the sake of international monetary stability; joblessness must not be permitted to rise so high as to ignite domestic unrest; mortgage money must not be permitted to dry up.

Above all, the economic coaches must be able to detect well in advance when recession threatens. This will be difficult, for this huge economy of ours reacts to the coaches' signals in two types: Fiscal and monetary. Fiscal matters relate to government spending and taxing; monetary matters to the availability and cost of credit.

Most of the fiscal signals have now been given and cannot be changed for another year. That is, Congress has approved the rate of taxation and the amount of government spending for the present fiscal year.

The main responsibility, therefore, rests with the monetary manager, which is the Federal Reserve Board, made up of seven men appointed by the president and confirmed by the Senate for 14-year terms.

The board governs the Federal Reserve System, which consists of 12 regional banks and 24 branches whose purpose is not to make money in the manner of commercial banks but to supply enough credit and money for orderly economic growth.
