LBJ Reminiscences
WASHINGTON (AP) — President Johnson took a nostalgic look back at 37 years in Washington in an early farewell speech Thursday night.

The President remembered his arrival in 1961 as a congressman's assistant and told of his dreams to do something to achieve peace, to bring health and education to all, to do something "about leading men, to head and hold."

"Well, I'm leaving," the President said, "and I haven't gotten all these things done."

Johnson voiced his impromptu reminiscence at a speech before the National Bar Association, an organization of Negro lawyers.

The President reviewed progress in civil rights and cited fresh figures on increased Negro income. He received a standing ovation as he told his audience, "I know that Americans, black and white, will prove they can be real cool brothers."

U.S. Birth Rate Drops
WASHINGTON (AP) — The U.S. birth rate dropped to a record low last year, the Census Bureau says.

American produced only 17.1 births per 1,000 persons, plunging below the previous low during the depression years.

The previous low was 18.4 in both 1928 and 1932.

The Census Bureau said the rate has increased in the population since World War II at 1.58 per cent. The population at the start of this year was 200,948,000 persons.

The median age of the population was 27.7 years. One out of every nine persons was Negro. And there were 100 women for every 94.7 men.

Ransay Shortage Cited
WASHINGTON (AP) — A shortage of airport runways, not a control tower, was the main reason for the delay in the Federal Aviation Administration for the construction of the new major cities.

Acting administrator David D. Thomas told a House subcommittee Thursday that the agency has not detected any definite slowdown by air traffic controllers, even though many were having to work 10-hour days, six days a week.

"The ultimate answer to the slowdown is the amount of concrete available," Thomas said. "Our biggest problem is to get enough runways."

Thomas said his agency officials have been meeting around the clock to try to find ways to ease the congestion causing long landing delays at crowded airports. He said meetings with the airline industry were planned within the next week or so and added, "We hope to get up with a decision in about 30 days."

Flood Toll Now 21
JAKARTA (AP) — The reported death toll in the worst floods to sweep Indonesia in 30 years rose to 21 today as reports reached Jakarta from rural districts.

Antara news agency reported two deaths in the Kebumen area of central Java and one man drowned in swirring waters near Jogjakarta, traditional home of Javanese rulers. At least 90,000 persons are reported homeless.

South Yemen Revolt
Suez Danger to Regime
TAIZEA, Yemen (AP) — The revolt in South Yemen appeared today to have become a grave danger to the regime of President Qalbi Al Shabab.

Abdullah Saleh Saabak, commander of the South Yemen Revolutionary Security Forces, led more than 500 of his men across the border into Yemen and said they refused to fight any longer against the rebels trying to overthrow Al Shabab.

"It was not clear any more for whom and for what we were fighting," Saabak told news men. He was followed by 30 top army officers who brought their weapons and a considerable supply of ammunition.

The rebellion is being waged by one of South Yemen's two leading nationalist groups, FLOSY — the Front for the Liberation of Occupied South Yemen which Al Shabab told news men was the National Liberation Front got control of the government upon the departure of the 46-year-old former general Ahmad Saabak and his men last week and sentenced him to a prison term of 4 years and 45 days. "I," as he is known at home, was set free at once because he had been in jail longer than that waiting for trial and under Yemeni law this was deducted from his sentence.

Compromise Said Near On Condominium Plans

Chances for the construction of Manchester's first condominium improved as a result of last night's meeting between the Town Planning Commission and Green Manor Corp. representatives, where both parties displayed cooperative attitudes on the proposed Lyell St. project.

Although the commission is yet uncommitted on either accepting or rejecting the 212-unit complex, chairman Adolph Dobbin last night indicated he thought the two groups were nearer a favorable compromise after discussing the matter.

"There is little doubt we can agree on a good, clean, well-planned project," that he said last night.

"After all, the plans do comply with the regulations the way they are now, but we're considering the project now in the light of potential buyers. We have to make an initial sale and the resale of the units as well as the living conditions they will effect."

Dobbin said that he felt the commission was ready to approve the project if its terms of creating a complex that might lead to the deterioration of the neighborhood could be met under all units would be unimpaired, as would garages under all the units.

Commissioner Truman Cranford said if the company might recover the commission's four-point criticism of the project with objective attitude, learning it "constructive criticism."

Dobbin told them, "We want to help the developer, not hinder him, we have no set standard. Each of the four items was separately discussed as they were read off by Town Planner Joseph Tamany. The first was the employment of Lyell St. which is destined to carry the bulk of traffic generated by the new project.

Tamany stated that he thought the developers should install sidewalks, curbs and gutters along their side of the street for the length of the project as well as enough pavement to create their half of a 24-ft.-wide paved travelway.

"This would call for approximately 8-10 ft. of paving, using the existing center line of the street and going back 30 ft. which would be Green Manor's half of a 60 ft. right of way.

Sander and Kaplan seemed in agreement with the general idea, but questioned the usefulness of their developing on half of the street until the town planned to develop the other.

Both Tamany and Dobbin agreed that this would be a good way to pressure the town into going ahead with much-needed improvements.

Again both the commission and Green Manor agreed that a sidewalk generally winding through the contour of the land would be most desirable, preserving as many of the existing trees as possible to screen the project.

Lack of storage space in the units was the next item discussed. The plans presently provide for a 6 1/2 x 7 1/2 storage room in the one-bedroom units, but that space must also house the water heater and furnace unit, as does the 8' 6" x 6' space in the two-bedroom unit. The three-bedroom unit has a 6' x 6' space with the heating units stored elsewhere.

Several of the commissioners expressed deep concern over the lack of space for outside equip-

Tremor Hits Wide Area Of Mexico

Traffic lights were not working after the tremor, causing traffic congestion even worse than usual at the morning busy hour.

The quake here occurred just 18 hours after a killer temblor at Maniz, taking an as yet uncounted number of lives.

Electricity was knocked out in a wide part of Mexico City. Residents fled their homes.

A one-story garage collapsed in a downtown area of the English-language radio station of VIP. There were no reports of injuries.

The exact time of the tremor was 8:22 a.m. Sited by stoppage of the AP clock. The duration ranged from three to five minutes, according to reports from various parts of the city.

Several downtown sidewalks were covered with shards of splintered glass fallen from office windows above.

Telephone calls indicated serious damage to buildings near the National Palace and a residential building south of the downtown area.

A spokesman said the earthquake center is believed to have been 210 miles south-southeast of Mexico City on the border of the Oaxaca and Guerrero Provinces. He said it was about 20 miles inland from the Pacific Ocean.

Paris Airport Busier

PARIS, All records were broken last year at the Paris Airport (Orly) and Le Bourget. Passengers totaled 4,700,000, up from 4,300,000 in 1967, a 14.5 per cent increase. Freight was up 11.5 per cent, to 150,000 tons; and there were 214,000 moving vans and 400,000 cars and trucks moving and 42 million visitors.

This War Discredits War. It has now been officially confirmed that the incident in Vietnamese waters on the night of June 18 was one in which American jet planes, under the mistaken impression they were firing on a surface entrance of enemy helicopters into the air war, loosed rockets and gunfire which sank an American merchant and hit the Australian cruiser Hobart, resulting in the deaths of at least seven American and Australian sailors.

At the time, the first explosion from the missile in Boston was that the patrol boat which had been sunk had been hit by enemy shore batteries. This, in that location, indicated operation of the enemy's fighting capacity which we would normally call an escalation, just as the rumored appearance of enemy helicopters was termed an escalation.

Instead, as has now been admitted, there were neither shore batteries nor enemy helicopters involved, but merely another of those terrible instances which occur in all wars, when one side kills its own men by mistake.

There seem to be several reasons why this sort of thing happens more often, and gets more notice when it happens, in Vietnam than in any other war.

First, this is the largest war ever fought without the benefit of clearly established battle lines and clear geographical division of the fighting terrain.

Second, it is also a war which has brought dependence upon purely mechanical and scientific devices, like radio and other instrumentalities used for spotting the enemy, which have no way of telling the difference between an enemy shape or presence and a friendly one.

Both these factors almost automatically increase the chance for the tragic kind of error.

The third factor entering the Vietnam picture is simply that, for a large percentage of the American people, this is a war which lacks the clear moral issue which has motivated the national conscience to justify and soften the sacrifice involved, even when the sacrifice is the result of a mistake.

The killing of one's own men has taken place in every modern war, and been accepted, nevertheless, as one of the unavoidable evils of the necessary evil.

But a war whose very basis is questioned in its own mind, some day, by its costs, and, inevitably, makes those costs result from colossal mistakes seem almost inevitable.

It is a difficult challenge, a "high noon" confrontation between the sheriff or enforcer and the offender, high in the skies, is too risky. The only persons able to land the airliner might be incapacitated.

The airlines have resisted proposals that all passengers be searched for guns before boarding, but no one has yet developed metal-detection devices which can distinguish between hidden guns and shotguns, clocks or shaving kits.

As for locking the cockpit door, a hijacker can compel a stewardess to relay his demands to the pilot over the intercom.

Inside Report

MIAMI BEACH—The ineluctable importance of the Gallup Poll showing Richard M. Nixon as a sure winner in Gov. Nelson Rockefeller can be seen in the way it ended an alarming rapid deterioration in Nixon's strength.

Prior to the Miami Herald's early Galleys Monday morning of Dr. George Gallup's last pre-convention sampling, Nixon's strategy had good reason to be optimistic.

To counteract this, Nixon forces were pushing a harder sell than ever before. One Nixon delegate from Arizona was circulating around shabby Southern delegates, attacking Reagan, and lamenting how embarrassing it would be for the Republicans to nominate a Presidential candidate under threat of recall by voters of his own state.

At the Nixon camp's request, Senator Strom Thurmond was employing all his prestige to keep South Carolina's 22 delegates with Nixon under the unit rule. Charlton Lyons, grand old man of Louisiana Republicans, planned to exert similar pressure against a dirt-crowd Reagan.

But Nixon's problems did not end in the South. The enigmatic Gov. James Rhodes, who in June had virtually conceded the nomination to Nixon, was changing his mind again. He told associates over the weekend that he would have his name placed in nomination as a favorite son and would stay that way for one ballot or maybe two.

Rockefeller strategists immediately countered. Publicly, they released polls from key industrial states. Privately, they placed telephone calls to uncommitted party leaders, claiming that the Gallup Poll failed to show how much Nixon strength comes from Southern states which will be carried by George Wallace anyway.

But these countermeasures scarcely dented the renewed surge in Nixon's momentum, particularly among the press, who quickly resumed forecasting the inevitability of Nixon's nomination. Rockefeller's high command met through all of Tuesday in New York, without great success, to concoct more effective ways of counteracting Gallup.

According to his associates, he always wears, not an "old school tie," but a red tie, symbolic of the British Labour party, at the final reception before departure, he confounded everyone by appearing in a green tie. During the hot weather, he wore no tie at all, and unbeknownst his shirt completely—yet even then, he buttoned up all his conventional advertisements.

Although he mellowed perceptibly during his stay, the headmaster remained convinced that the American way of running schools through superintendents who are dependent on lay school boards is utterly absurd. Gallup, Harris Agree Rocky Leads HHH

NEW YORK (AP)—Top pollsters George F. Gallup Jr. and Louis Harris say that Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller "has no chance" to win over Democratic presidential candidate Hubert H. Humphrey and Sen. J. McCarthy.

"They also said in a joint statement Thursday that Richard M. Nixon would win an "overwhelming" vote in a contest involving Humphrey and third party candidate George C. Wallace.

Gallup and Harris disclosed these conclusions after their most recently published polls, taken in July, were in apparent contradiction and created considerable political repercussions as Republicans gathered in Miami Beach, Fla., for their national convention.

Gallup said Harris said two key factors accounted for the time at which the polls were taken and the margin of error built into the sampling process.

"Public opinion changes over time, and each was an accurate reflection at the time it was taken," he said.

The Gallup-Poll, published Monday and based on interviews between July 19 and 21, showed Nixon defeating both Humphrey and McCarthy while Rockefeller was only able to lift them. The Nixon camp charged this survey.

Thursdays Poll, based on interviews taken July 26-28, became available Wednesday night and showed Nixon could prevail over either of the Democratic hopefuls while Rockefeller's support is slipping.

The Gallup-Harris statement further charged the Rockefeller camp for the New York Republican has based his campaign to support Nixon for the GOP nomination on convincing delegates that he is more popular with the voters than Nixon.

In Miami Beach, Leonard Hall, Rockefeller's convention floor manager, said the joint statement provided "further confirmation of the momentum that has been building up in recent weeks all over the country for Mr. Rockefeller."

In the same city, Herbert G. Klein, Nixon's chief spokesman, charged that "propaganda and gutter journalism" keeps politicians from criticizing each other. He said Rockefeller's charge was at the battleground and "struck out."

The pollsters' joint statement said that because of the July results, Gallup thought it possible that his poll had "caught a transitory peak" in Nixon's popularity and a corresponding dip in Rockefeller's.

Noting that his interviewees had gone into the field on the day newspapers carried accounts of the endorsement of Nixon by former President Dwight D. Eisenhower, Gallup said: "I have no absolutely solid evidence but I am convinced that that was a major factor. Remember that Gen. Eisenhower is easily the most popular man in the world among Americans."

Monday's Gallup Poll gave Nixon 40 per cent of the vote, but Harris gave him only 25 against Humphrey. The two-point difference would be about 2.5 million votes, based on the 70.4 million votes in the 1964 presidential election.

Gallup gave Rockefeller 28 per cent against both Humphrey and McCarthy, but Harris gave him 40, or what amounts to a

The American jets caught one MIG just about 20 miles north of West, and two of the squadrons made several passes at it, firing missiles and unloading more than 1,000 tons of bombs.

LA. George Hise said one of his missiles exploded just short of the silver-colored enemy plane but came close enough to damage it. The MIG pilot dropped down and headed for the 19th parallel, which U.S. combat pilots are forbidden to cross. Lt. Norman McCoy reported he destroyed it with a direct missile hit.

A second MIG was seen in the distance, the American jets said, but it fled to the north.

It was the 11th MIG claimed by U.S. pilots in the war. The United States has lost 45 planes to North Vietnamese jets.

Private flew 100 missions over the peninsula of North Vietnam Thursday, again concentrating on supply lines. He reported damaging or destroying 14 trucks and 14 railroad cars.

The Air Force's biggest bombers, the B-52s, flew into mission in the 24 hours ending at noon today. They concentrated on suspected enemy troop concentrations on the western approaches to Saigon and unloading more than 1,000 tons of bombs.

Dr. Kristan practices what he preaches. He does not smoke and he keeps physically fit by jogging and riding his bicycle. He is a member of the Governor's Committee on Fitness.

Up to now cigarettes have been sold in the hospital's gift shop, which is operated by the auxiliary. Dr. Kristan is planning to send a letter to the State Task Force on Smoking to urge it to use its influence on stopping other hospitals in Connecticut from selling cigarettes.

Although Dr. Kristan points out that eliminating the sale of cigarettes in hospitals will not solve the smoking problem, he also points out that a doctor has an image and people look to him as an example.

The health officer noted, "It is ironic that while hospitals are treating cancer and heart patients and other tobacco-associated disease victims, they're selling cigarettes downstairs in the lobby."

By their unanimous approval of the ban on smoking in the hospital, Dr. Kristan said, the staff doctors are providing leadership for others to follow.

He further pointed out that the 16 staff physicians at Rockville General, all but two of them have stopped smoking cigarettes.

Dr. Kristan besides being a member of the Governor's Committee on Fitness and Vernon's acting health officer, is also flight surgeon for Connecticut's Air National Guard and a member of the Board of Directors of the Hartford and Connecticut Heart Association.
