





night on the issue reveal that many of the townspeople want to know why Wa-terbury can't handle its own educational problems, why it is necessary to bus children to schools in the suburbs. It's a fair enough question, we sup-pose, but one that doesn't lend itself to easy answers. Like most Northern cities of any size, Waterbury has de facto segregated schools. It's a problem the city has been wrestling with for some-time, and one which the city looks to the proposed school-complex building program to solve in the next few years.

Waterbury is determined to handle its
education problems. But the job is going to be a tremendous one, requiring a great deal of money and planning, as

well as time.

In the meantime, de facto school segregation continues, with its adverse effects on the learning rates of those separated from the general school population. 


