

may be, we never really believe to them. We would hate to think of the Battle of Britain being waged with 200 few-200 ever in that battle at any one time and we would hate to think of 200 additional Messerschmitts flying against the Normandy invasion. But we would still cling to a belief that the Allied victory in both instances would still have been achieved somehow, to the belief, in fact, that no great ideological war is ever settled that easily.

On paper, the few hundred British Spitfires which were available for the Sattle of Britain were no formidable obstacle. It was the way they were flown which was perhaps much more decisive than their number. Similarly, additional Messerschmitts for the Battle of Normandy might, under certain conditions of German morale and disfilusionment, have given a mediocre account of them-

Whatever their conclusion, all World War II games about quantities of equipment have little or no application to such a war as that in Vietnam where our ability to put as many planes in the air as we can build or float places for them to fly from has not been able to produce any decisive turn in the war. There it is hard to argue that thousands of planes, either more or fewer, would make very much difference. To have its real chance to be decisive, air power has to be able to meet an enemy who has also made air power his primary weapon. In such a case, both sides are then preparation bound, and psychologically bound, to accept the destruction of one air force or the other as a decisive thing. And perhaps the final clincher of the victory of one air force over another is the ability of the dominant force to try to bomb out of existence the factories which supply the enemy air force with its planes.

But for an air force to achieve or claim a victory against a jungle, or against a jungle force —that is a difficult thing, though there might be no limit to the number of planes it could put in the air.

Documents We Believe

In many ways, the war in Vietnam has seen a war which has increased the amount of cynicism in the world, decreased the amount of faith men have in each other, and warned all of us against ever taking anything at face

There has been one notable, intriguing exception to all this descent into the epravity of continual disbelief. We believe even the enemy, we credit him with complete good faith, when it comes to our interpretation of "captured

Whatever is in these "captured documents" we believe. Our own most experienced military and propaganda analysts bonor them as valid fact and relible revelation of actual enemy inten-

We have been trained, by a quarter century of cold war, to disbelieve everyhing else the Communists ever tell us. But let us find in the pocket of a dead

how many pounds of rice and how many bullets to take with him when he goes in to capture Salgon, and everybody, from the military in Vietnam to the politician on the stump back home, honors that document as if it were some kind of holy writ.

This turns out to be the only instance in all history when it has never occurred to us that the Communists might be low enough and treacherous enough and clever enough to have their guerrillas, who obably can't read anyway, carry documents designed to keep our generals busy and confused preparing for attacks which may never be delivered.

If we were to hazard a guess as to the reality of this situation, it would be that our military analysts in Saigon are not quite as innocently gullible as they appear. All the captured documents we hear about are warnings of tougher, expanded Vietcong action to come, something the military in Salgon and the more hawkish politicians at home would just as soon have the American people be expecting and fearing. There may be those among us who consider these captured documents useful, whether or not they are believable.

The PBA statement is an expression of the patroimen's feeling that criminals are being treated too leniently, and that municipal authorities and the courts One can understand and sympathize with the frustrations of the men on the

beat, but instructing them to disobey orders of their superiors is not the way to deal with the problem. It is, in fact, only making it worse and giving sanction to insurrection and disrespect for law. In the first place, there is no evidence to show that police have been ordered to turn their back on crimes committed in their presence. Mayor Lindsay's of fice denies ever having given such an order; so do Police Department executives. If the Patrolmen's Benevolent Asociation has proof that such orders have been given, they should present it to the

Regarding leniency in the courts: to the layman, and even more to the policenan whose duty it is to enforce the aw, often at peril of his life, some adgments of the courts may often appear to be mere slaps on the wrist. That olice should feel resentment and frustration in the face of what they consider undue leniency is understandable. It must be remembered, however, that courts in sentencing an offender have have in arresting him. The courts have different responsibilities, and must take into account a number of considerations ncluding not only what is just, but also what is wise, in terms of the individual, of his family, and society. The dispens-

ing of justice requires an uncommon breadth of information and understandng, of wisdom and of integrity. Ideally, as well as in practice, the agencies of law enforcement should work together in close collaboration — police and courts - for the benefit of society. lo have them working at cross purposes, or even thinking of each other in such light, is to diminish the effectiveness

To have the Patrolmen's Benevolent Association of New York City counsel members to refuse to obey the orders of superiors and to enforce the law as they see fit is in effect taking the law nto their own hands. This is bad counsel indeed, and will lead only to trouble. The PBA in New York or in any other community which followed such advice would be doing harm to the community and to its own members alike. 


