The Ethiopian Herald's editorial quoted more vigorous imperial words from the Emperor's address to the League of Nations in 1936 after Italy had invaded Ethiopia: "It is the principle of the equality of states on the one hand, or otherwise the obligation laid upon small powers to accept the bonds of vassalship. In a word, it is international morality that is at stake."
