Navy F111 Crashes, No Survivors Found

PORT BELOU, Calif. (AP)—The Navy described as a routine weapons test under control of Hughes Aircraft Co. the F111 fighter-bomber—manned by two civilians—crashed 10 miles off the California coast Wednesday. It was the second Navy F111B to go down. The Air Force has lost a half dozen of its F111A jets which developed from the controversial F111 program.

Most Red Troops Leaving Prague

PRAGUE (AP)—Most occupation forces, estimated at 600,000 men at one time, was believed to be still in the country to help with the country's reconstruction. From the start, the program, originally known as CEF, was controversial and plagued by troubles. In 1967, a Navy F111 crashed during a test program on New York's Long Island. Two civilian test pilots were killed.

Foe Pulls Back, Tay Ninh Calm

SAIGON (AP)—Two small skirmishes were reported on the ranges of Tay Ninh city today, and enemy troops ambushed a U.S. convoy farther out, but U.S. soldiers said it appeared that enemy forces had pulled back for the moment. The fighting was reported on the southwestern and southeastern edges of the city as 2,000 South Vietnamese paratroopers and marines swept through areas that Viet Cong and North Vietnamese infiltration had occupied Wednesday.

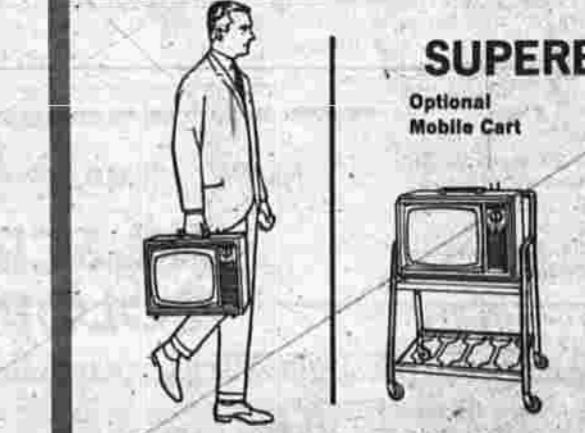

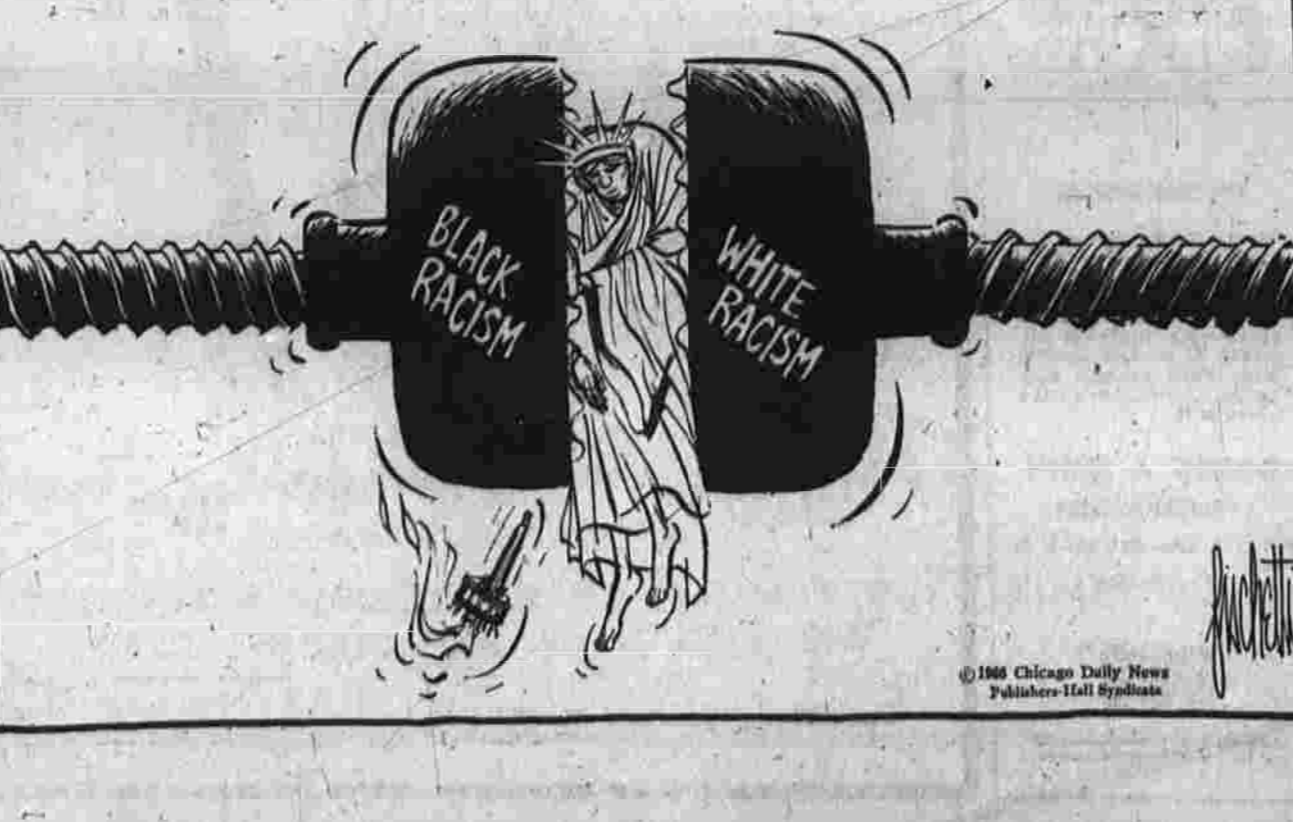

A similar one-year delay has been asked by the committee in November 1967.

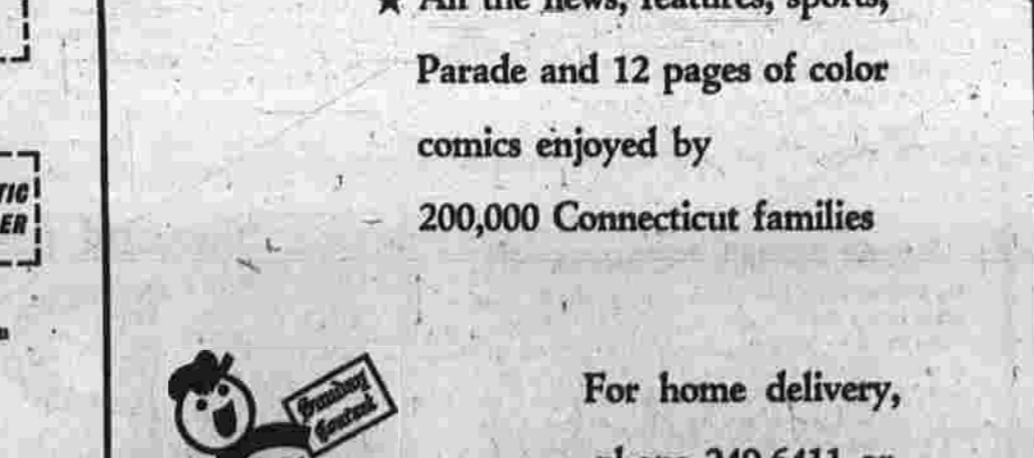

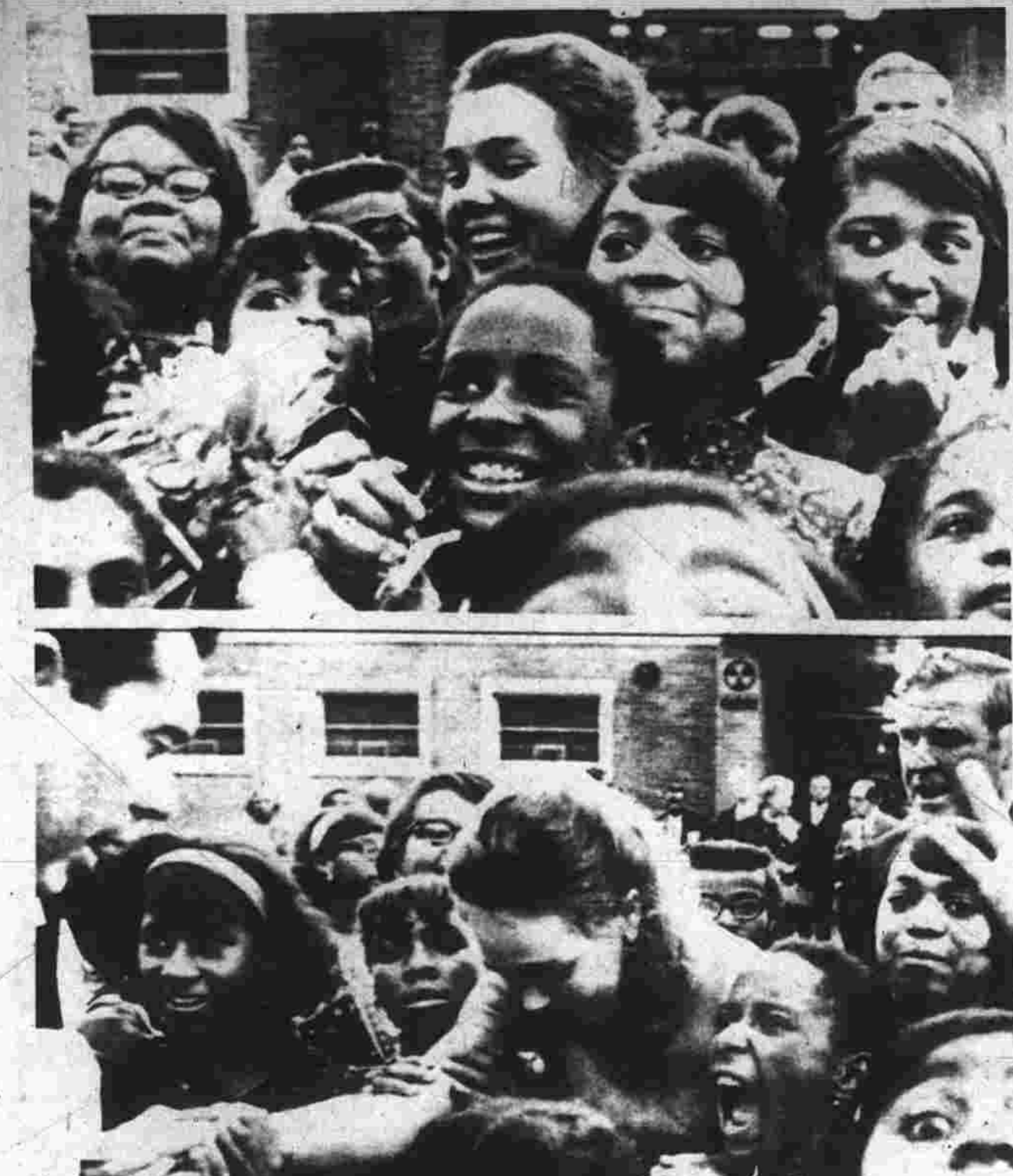

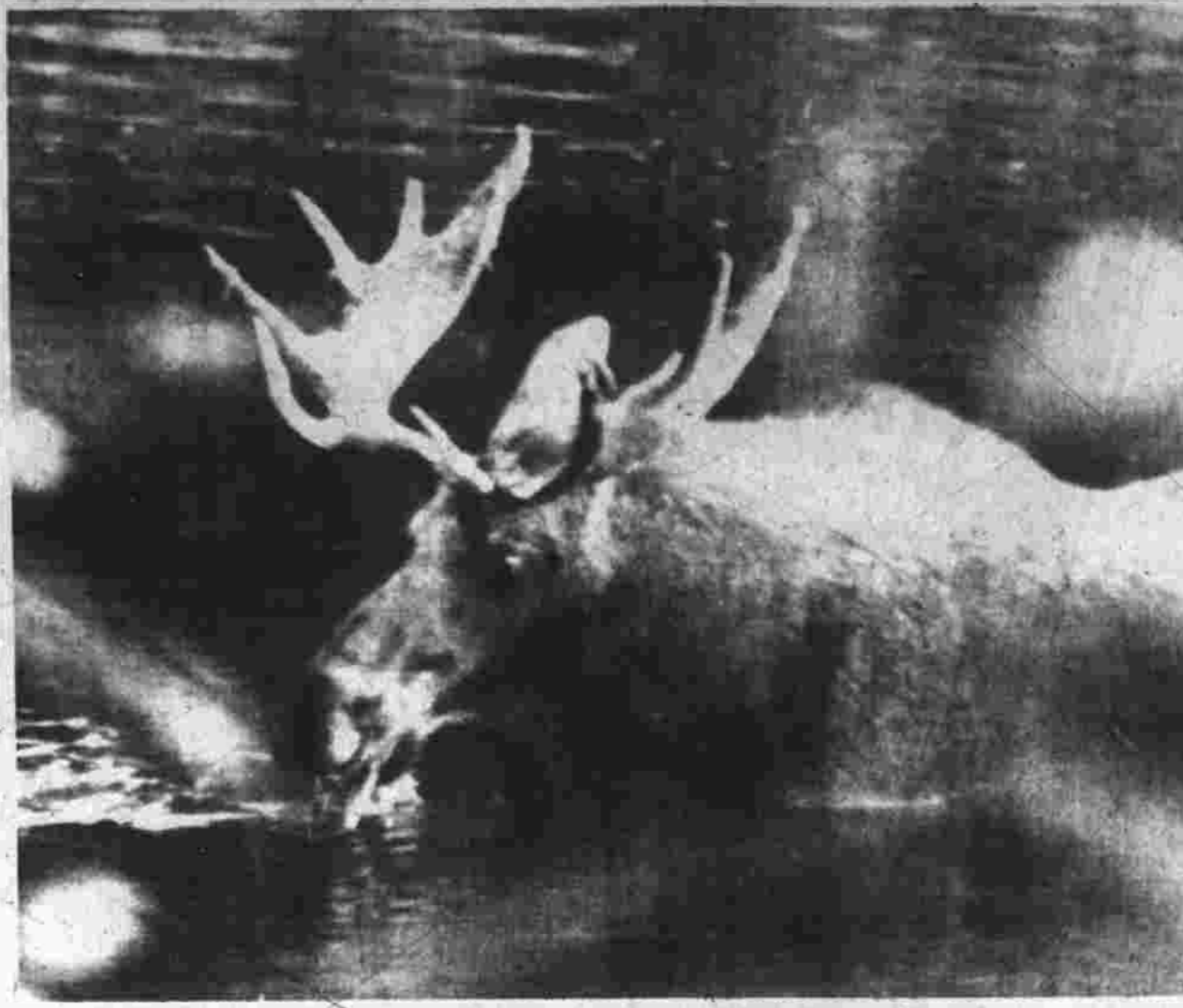

The club also seeks to help mothers with practical ideas on caring for two babies at once and to provide used equipment and clothing sales to ease the financial burden of twins.

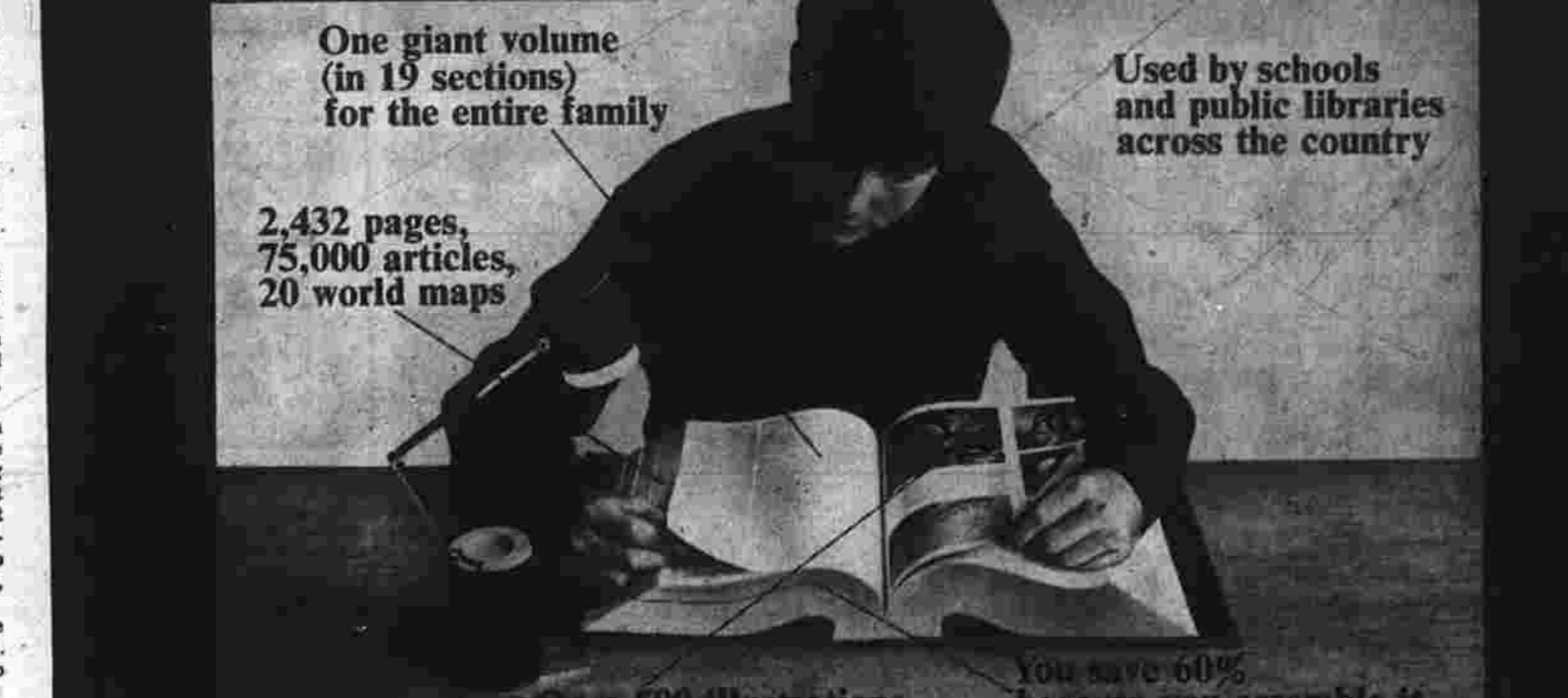

Bigness of Soviet Rockets Gives U.S. New Problems

WASHINGTON — The Soviet Union's penchant for launching big rockets is giving the United States a whole new set of problems in its tenth anniversary of American space flight.

It was not too long ago that U.S. officials rather emphatically explained to congressmen and others that the only reason Russian rockets were bigger than ours was that they had not mastered the technique of making small warheads for them.

But that old superior attitude is giving way to deep concern as some of these same officials see new payoffs for the nation which can build big because of powerful rockets. There are even warnings coming out of the civilian National Aeronautics and Space Administration that the stage is being set for another " Sputnik."

The warning rings true enough for both presidential candidates to take some lessons. Vice President Humphrey made sure the Democratic platform had plenty of positive statements about the vitality of the national space program. Richard Nixon, while not hammering similar statements into the Republican platform, has just asked his staff to prepare a white paper on the national space program so he can make up his mind on whether to stand on the issue.

No one is willing to predict what form a new Soviet technological Sputnik would take. Instead, it is a gut feeling among space leaders that the United States will be put eventually for cutting back on the space program while the Soviets move right ahead on all fronts with theirs.

Even the huge Saturn V rocket, at being readied at Cape Kennedy to take three Americans to the Moon by 1970, does not look big enough to close the thrust gap.

NASA Administrator James E. Webb — one of the most unflinching and energetic men in Washington — warns that the Soviets are about to fly a rocket at much larger than Saturn V.

The bigger the rocket the bigger the chance that the Soviets will be able to put a group of men up in space to do a real mission. They will be in a real laboratory, and of exploring the planets.

Republicans can denounce Webb's warning as "The Russians are bragging" or "lobbying by an administration to get more money for its agency. And there already are lawmakers who question whether the existing national space program is necessary after all, given such domestic problems as the ghetto, the environment, and the balance of payments.

But there is no such complacency among military leaders at the Pentagon. The Soviet SS-

Scientist Gives Atmosphere Small Chance for Rescue

By GEORGE GETZLE

LOS ANGELES — There is a good chance that the Earth's atmosphere will not stay the comfortable, life-sustaining combination of gases it now is.

The atmosphere doesn't start out like that when the Earth was new, but was made comfortable and able to sustain human life by the green plants that have contributed most of the oxygen humans and other animals depend on.

Now, according to Dr. Ronald Templeton, curator of botany at the Los Angeles County Museum of Natural History, man's constantly increasing need to burn fossil fuels, as well as his careless and thoughtless destruction of plant life, is changing the proportion of gases in the air, using up the oxygen too fast and adding too much carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide, and other waste chemicals into the air.

"The natural processes by which the oxygen is replenished by green plants just can't keep up with man's prodigality," Dr. Templeton said in an interview.

He stresses the automobile, which he estimated that half of the fossil fuels that man has burned since the dawn of time have been burned in the last 60 years.

The automobile, with the grease of asphalt and concrete on roads and parking lots, also is partly to blame for the destruction of plants.

In places like Los Angeles, people can already see the "red spots" on the ground where the wind does blow, when the wind doesn't blow, have the same problem.

Dr. Templeton agrees with Morris Neuberger, the UCLA meteorologist who says that within the next 100 years, man keeps up the burning at the present pace, the whole world will have an atmosphere like Los Angeles' on a smoggy day. The wind will blow from about 100 miles away and will have to "push" itself through the smog to get to the people.

The single most important thing man can do to forestall this disaster, according to Dr. Templeton, is to control human population. He also says regulate and diminish burning.

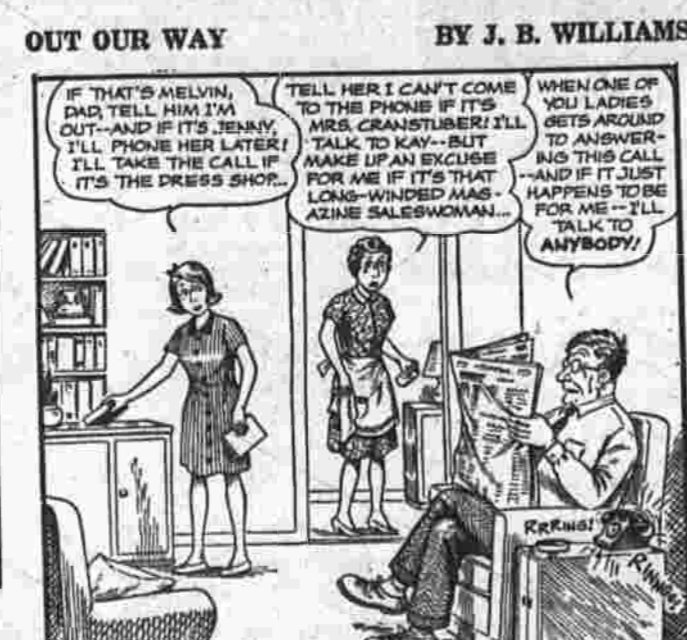
