Shortages Multiply Cuban Economy Wrapped In Tangle of Red Tape
HAVANA (AP) — Six months ago Fidel Castro ordered almost everybody to the bookshelves and barbers out of private business in Cuba.
The sweeping nationalization has resulted in one of the most tightly controlled economies in the Communist world. It compounded the problem of the island's chronic shortage of consumer goods by wrapping it in a new tangle of red tape.

Even without nationalization, Cuba was in for what Castro foresaw Jan. 2 as a 'hard year' because of a poor crop of sugar. Since sugar buys most of the many things Cuba has to import, this means exporting other Cuban products to make up for the loss.
"We are going through a hard period, difficult in the life of a revolution," explained a publication of the Communist Party Central Committee, the newspaper of the nationalization campaign. "Our people are preparing to take up the sword and the arms of work and to tighten their belts."

Neither were they so directly involved when the government followed up by taking over more than 200 Cuban-owned "big" businesses—distilleries, breweries, paint and textile factories, rice mills, movie theaters, cigar and cigarette factories and department stores.
Last March when Castro nationalized 25,023 enterprises, he needed the impact touched everybody. Suddenly, the butcher became the government's television repairman because the government; the corner grocer became the government.

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP)—The Connecticut State Labor Council, AFL-CIO, has given the Democratic presidential candidate, Hubert H. Humphrey its unofficial support.
A vote week Thursday at the group's endorsement convention allowed heavy, if not unanimous, support for Vice President Humphrey and his running mate, Sen. Edmund Muskie of Maine.
The delegates by their vote adopted a resolution proposing that its endorsement of the Humphrey-Muskie ticket be passed on to the AFL-CIO national convention which it meets next week in New York. Only the national AFL-CIO can officially endorse a presidential candidate.

LBJ Plans to Offer Decade-ahead Programs

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Johnson says he plans to offer programs "for the decade ahead" when he delivers his farewell message to the nation and to Congress next January.

Johnson said Thursday he has begun a series of meetings with top administration officials on the three messages which are required by law to be sent to Congress before the next President is inaugurated Jan. 20. The others are the budget message and annual economic report.

The President said his final message will cover not only immediate goals, but will look ahead to what should be accomplished in the decade.

Government Spending

WASHINGTON (AP) — Budget Director Charles F. Whelan has warned that government spending may climb by another \$3 billion in the next fiscal year and this could affect the decision whether to drop or keep the new surtax.

Whelan told the Senate-House Economic Committee that the growth in the economy normally gives the government a jump in revenues of about \$1 billion every year, equal to the amount the surcharge on the income tax is bringing in.

But he pointed to a possible \$5 billion spending jump in 1969.

HONG KONG (AP) — The Red Chinese army, trying to restore order in Canton after months of Red Guard violence, uncovered an elaborate torture chamber operated by a group of Red Guard volunteers, according to a report published in the newspaper.

The report, published in the newspaper, said the chamber was located in a building in the city of Canton. It was described as a "basement hellhole" equipped with steel wire traps, vials of acid, racks on which prisoners were stretched, and most looks with which the dead and living were suspended from the ceiling.

Board Rules LPNs Not 'Professionals'

HARTFORD (AP) — The State Board of Labor Relations has ruled that Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs) are not "professional" employees under the definitions of the state Labor Relations Act.

The board ruled that the LPNs are "unskilled" employees under the act, which covers only those professions that require a professional status.

A campaign official here said Thursday that the former Alabama governor's organization has collected more than 1,000 signatures needed to win him a spot on the New Hampshire ballot. A Wallace supporter in Vermont said the campaign there is only a few hundred signatures short.

Allies Drive into DMZ; General Dies in Crash

SAIGON (AP)—Allied forces, supported by tanks and naval gunfire, thrust into the demilitarized zone Friday and reported killing six enemy soldiers in heavy fighting.

Further south, one of the U.S. Army's most highly decorated field sergeants, Gen. Keith L. Ware, was killed when a military helicopter crashed in flames near the Cambodian border.

Allied casualties in the DMZ assault were four killed and 28 wounded, spokesman said. All of the dead had about half the wounds were South Vietnamese.

Military spokesmen said the assault was a preemptive action designed to blunt an expected drive south by two North Vietnamese divisions. It also was meant to relieve enemy pressure on allied outposts in the northern sector of South Vietnam.

The DMZ, which extends about three miles on each side of the North-South Vietnamese border, was created in the Geneva Convention of 1954 to serve as a neutral buffer zone. But North Vietnamese forces have used it as a sanctuary for troops menacing northern allied outposts.

Friday's assault was the fourth major allied drive into North Vietnam and about half the zone, although there have been a number of reconnaissance patrols into the area.

The first announced allied thrust into the zone came in May, when U.S. Marines moved in for five days.

The last thrust into the DMZ came a month ago when U.S. Marines and South Vietnamese Infantrymen backed by armored forces pushed about three miles north of the Cambodian border.

The South Vietnamese spearheaded the assault and by nightfall, after 14 hours of fighting, the allied forces had returned to base camps just inside South Vietnam. The enemy bunkers were just south of the Ben Hai River and about three miles northeast of the allied outpost of Gio Linh.

The swift push into the DMZ was punctuated by saturation bombing raids. U.S. B-52s were called in to drop about a million tons of explosives on the enemy positions and the Communist forces in the DMZ.
