Nixon's Quick Early Lead
There has never been anything remotely like it on the national political scene.

Never in modern memory at least has there been such a quick and easy lead by a candidate for president. Never has any candidate seemed so swiftly to the front as has Richard Nixon, in this post-convention month of September.

Never has any candidate slipped so visibly and so seriously as Hubert Humphrey has slipped since he began campaigning.

The one is now taking the Presidency seat by verdict of all the polls. The other who represents an administration now in power and the political party which has controlled the Presidency for all but eight of the last 36 years - is running, in the polls, as if he might be lucky to win a third term.

It is no longer necessary for trying to convince voters of the merits of Nixon's candidacy, who once sought-cultivated and wooed-trod the land we have paved over.

Finally, there is no longer any particular advantage to the political leadership, and that the Nixon campaign is now in the hands of the voters.

In 1964, true, there was an almost automatic assumption that the country was about to make a change in its political leadership, and that the Nixon campaign was going to be the next President, succeeding Harry Truman.

But this was, in 1964, an assumption which was not based on the results of the national conventions. There was, afterward, no visible narrowing or widening of the gap between the candidates.

But the impersonal forces at work in their civilization have always seemed to justify the supposition that if it were not Hitler or Mussolini or Stalin it would be someone else who would have done much the same kind of thing in the same moment of history.

With Salazar it has always seemed a little different. One doubts that there could or would have been this dictatorship in Portugal if it hadn't been for this particular individual to head it.

There is in view an end to the long and unbroken reign of Salazar, and his successor is to be chosen by a vote of the Portuguese people. It is not clear how long it will take to reach a decision, but it is certain that the process will be a long one.

It is no longer necessary to debate whether it is St. Martin's Summer, or St. Luke's Summer, or whether it can happen any time after Labor Day, or any other time we find ourselves in November.

Nor is there any more necessity for trying to convince voters of the merits of Nixon's candidacy, who once sought-cultivated and wooed-trod the land we have paved over.

Finally, there is no longer any particular advantage to the political leadership, and that the Nixon campaign is now in the hands of the voters.

In 1964, true, there was an almost automatic assumption that the country was about to make a change in its political leadership, and that the Nixon campaign was going to be the next President, succeeding Harry Truman.

But this was, in 1964, an assumption which was not based on the results of the national conventions. There was, afterward, no visible narrowing or widening of the gap between the candidates.

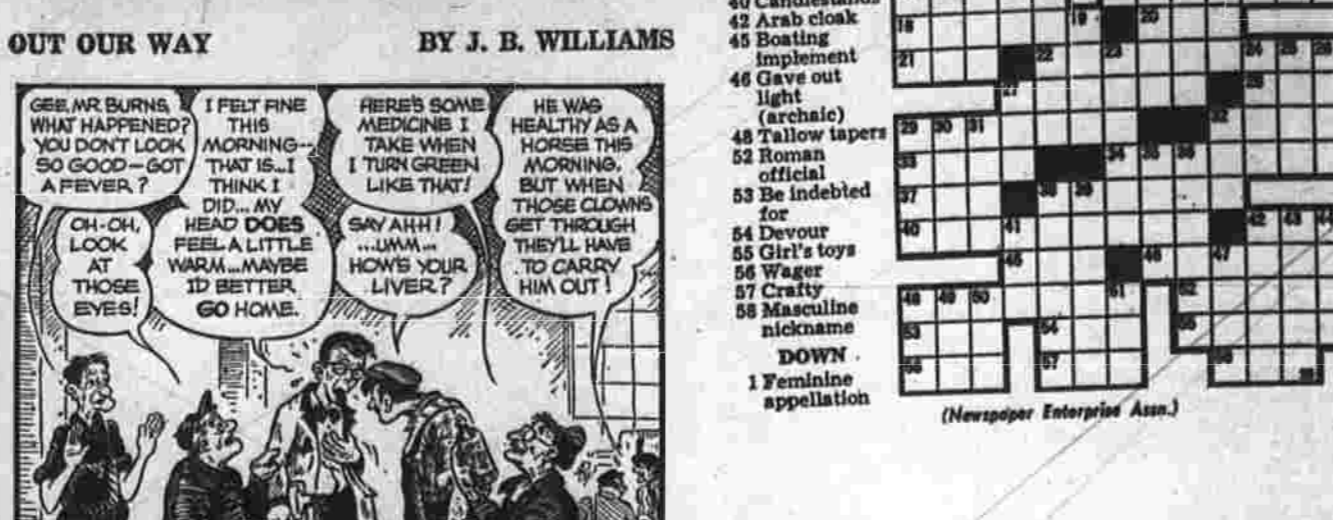

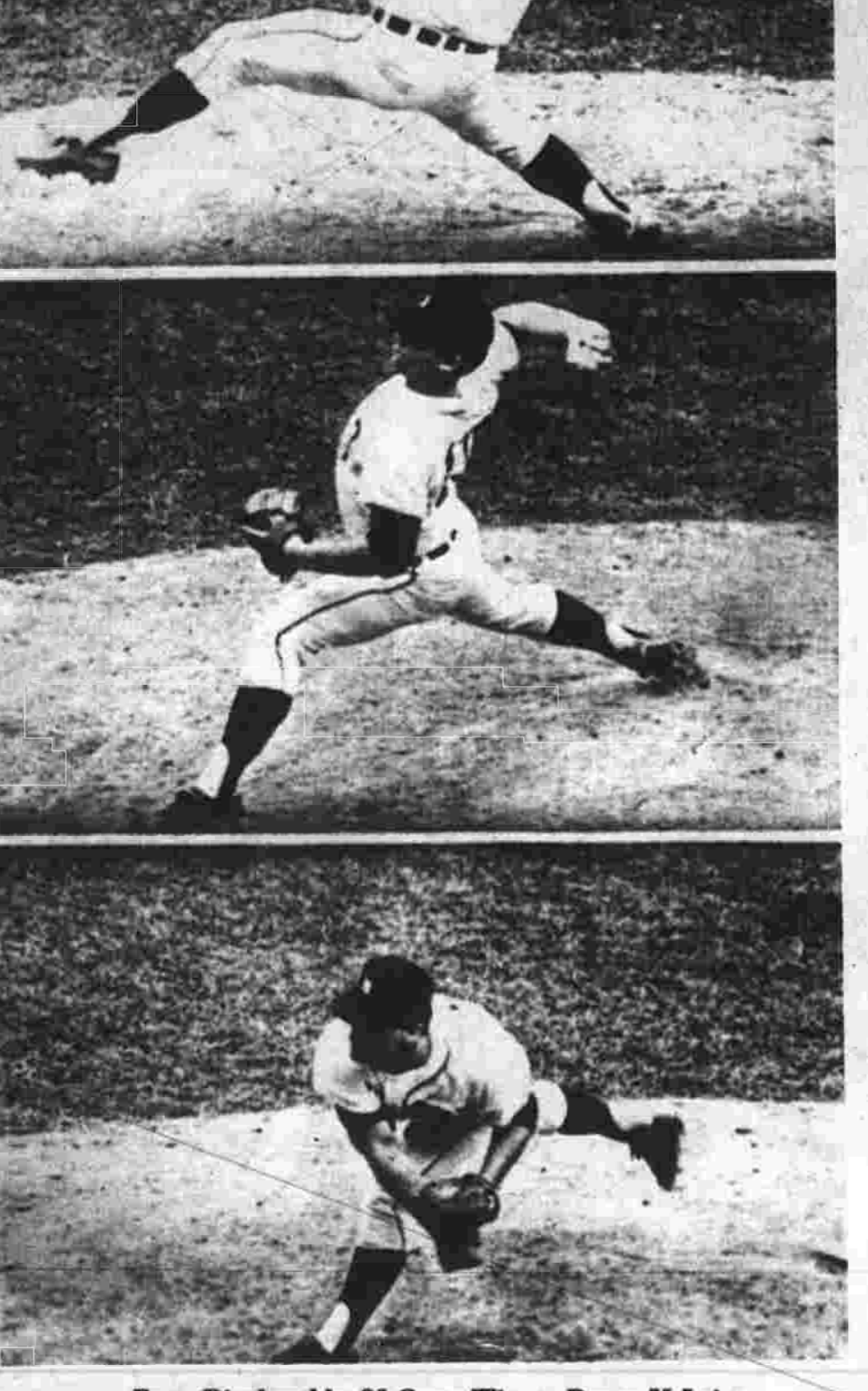

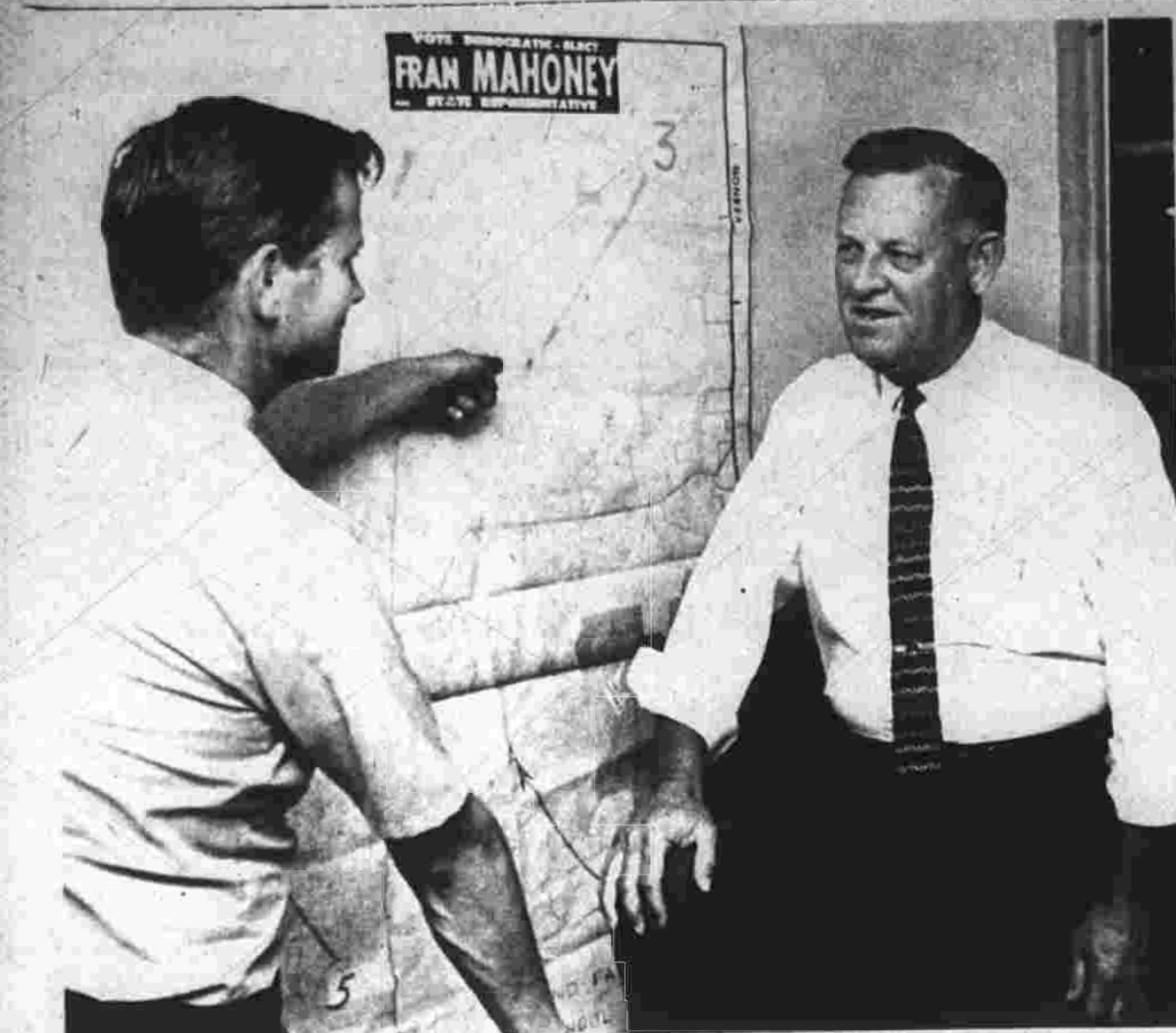
