Pwo months ago a migratio from this area moved across the Persian Gulf and is already well established in the semi-arid region of the India-Pakis-tan border. A build-up of this population, unless it is con-trolled very soon, will threaten the whole of the Indian subcontinent. So far only tentative attempts at control have been carried out.

On the African shores of the Red Sea large swarms of adult ocusts are also moving ar breeding. This is one of their summer breeding areas; but already the increasing swarms have moved far out of this zone. and have settled and begun breed and lay eggs along the

The swarms in Mauritania Mali and Niger are also in recognized summer breeding enormous even for a locust year.
This is the most stirring char

acteristic of the locust swarms They move. The adults are tremendously powerful filers and voracious eaters, with a huge breeding potential.

When their surrounding have been denuded of vegetation they take wing, usually in the direc-tion of the prevailing winds, the members of the swarm staying ogether. There are two distinct phas

in the life-cycle of swarming k custs, so dissimilar that they ar custs, so dissimilar that they appear to belong to different species. In normal years, the locust leads a solitary life, usually in the drier parts of the world. It is a large but not very conspictous insect, and although each female lays many eggs, the wingless hoppers which hatch from them are thinned out by their natural enemies and by a scarcity of food, so that their natural enemies mail and the numbers remain small and the population remains static. Then solitary locusts do not migrate but spend their lives in the area where they were born. From time to time, however

From time to time, however, a series of changes in the environment favors the locusts: Abnormal rains bring on a flush of vegetation as the small locusts hatch, so they have ample food, and great numbers survive. These tiny wingless locusts stay together in bands, which move slowly along in search of food, and join up with other bands, all moving in the same direction. Because of the way they move they are called "hoppers," and as they feed they grow, casting their skins they grow, casting their skins to accommodate their growing bodies. After five or six months bodies. After five or six molning they are fullgrown, and in this final stage each has four efficient wings.

These locusts are smaller than the solitary form, darker in color, every active and feroclously hungry. Within a short time their bodies have hardened they are ready to fly.
