South Windsor Agencies Hold Joint Meeting

Methods of land acquisition, trial Development Corporation formed in 1967 is a private funding pool designed to attract new business to the community by extending loans to businesses settling in South Windsor. These loans are composed of private local money plus state and federal loans secured through the BSA. The Sewer Commission reported that the primary treatment plant should be completed by Oct. 10, and that an open house and dedication is planned for early November.

Town Hall Nearly Ready
The chairman of the Public Building Commission reported that the new town hall should be ready for occupancy by Nov. 1, and that there is a budget deficit of about \$4,000 which the commission will have to request from the council.

Land Acquisition Methods
Land acquisition methods came under discussion when council member Jane Roman expressed the possible need for coordination of land acquisitions and establishment of priorities perhaps through the creation of an Inter-agency Land Acquisition Committee.

The town attorney outlined the procedures which have been followed in the past with regard to land purchases by stating that the town first informed the need for land for a particular purpose, made an informal survey of available land and chose several possible sites from this survey, and then informally approached these land owners in regard to their desire to sell. The attorney felt that this method has worked well in the past. Land owners were aware of the fact that several pieces of property were being considered as potential sites, and they therefore tended to be more realistic in their asking prices than they might have been had the town definitely decided the exact site before approaching potential sellers, he said.

Flexibility Cited
Joseph Curino, chairman of the Planning and Zoning Commission, agreed that flexibility is necessary to negotiate a good price. He added that rather than create a new agency to handle methods of land acquisition that perhaps the Capital Goals Committee with the recommendations of the existing agencies could handle the job of establishing land purchase priorities.

Referendum Questions
Fits listed the referendum questions appearing on the voting machines in November as follows:
1. For approval of \$875,000 for secondary sewer treatment plant.
2. For approval of \$275,000 for sanitary sewer system line extension.
3. For approval of the Charter Amendments.
4. For approval of \$266,700 in notes to purchase land on Nevins and Sandhill Rds. for a new proposed high school.
5. For approval of \$192,000 in notes for possible open space or other uses not now specified.

Fits stated that there would be considerable publicity concerning the referendum questions and that it is necessary that the public realize the need for approval of these questions.

Charles Enas, town clerk, reported that the response to the town seal design contest was very limited and only five entries had been submitted. Others suggested that the council seek the assistance of a professional seal-maker.
