



NEW YORK (AP)— In an effort to unify New York's Demomerats, Arthur J. Goldberg was appointed today to take command of Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey's New York

campaign for the presidency.

Goldberg, former United States ambassador to the United Nations, Supreme Court justice and long-time labor union attorney, didn't replace anybody—but was added to the top of Humphrey's New York organization.

Eugene P. Foley, a Minnesotan and former assistant secretary of commerce, remains as campaign coordinator.

The hig Democratic split in New York is over the peace issue, with Senate candidate Paul O'Dwyer and a member of congressional candidates refusing to endorse Humphrey unless he breaks with President Johnson's Vietnam policy. Goldberg, an advocate of a halt in bombing of North Viet-nam, said that he believes if Humphrey is elected "he will take the necessary steps to bring the war in Vietnam to an early and honorable conclusion."





atively passive," as have the professions.

The real problem for business, he said, is in the type of participation. "There is a fair amount of confusion," he said. "Some of the things they have been urged to do are probably silly. They have to learn how they can contribute."

Gardner, a realist with an optimist's bent, helieves the problems of the cities—of poverty, inequality, decay and unrest—can be overcome by intelligence, energy and goodwill, but only if leadership segments do not shirk their jobs.

"If the universities and professionals and businessmen are all to say that the problems are not theirs then you are

are all to say that the problems are not theirs then you are faced with a question of who is minding the store," he said.

"Some of our top business leaders are going to have to get into this area. Business will have to be broadened, A certain percentage of businessmen will have to have a capacity to deal in the political arena."

In years past, businessmen sometimes were accused of shifting leadership in political or community affairs. Said Gardner: "I think this ration as of this moment has come as far of this moment has come as far as a nation possibly could in training people to avoid poli-tics."





The Ineradicable Aristolochia Some months ago we read about a University of Connecticut botanist, Dr. Howard W. Pfeifer, who had been awarded a Federal grant of \$25,900 to conduct research in South America and Europe on a plant known in Connecticut

Although there are in the world some 500 species of Dutchman's pipe (aristolochia to the botanist), most of them are in the tropics. Only two of them are Connecticut, and that, we submit, is


We don't know much about the Connecticut species of aristolochia, but what little we do know is enough. A friend of ours has been fighting aristolochia for about 25 years, ever since the spring when she was beguiled by a seed cata logue blurb into planting the vine by her

The seed catalogue said that Dutch man's pipe is a fast growing vine which would provide quick shade. It was described as an excellent covering for trellises, porches, and other areas where a natural screen would be useful.

The plant is fast growing, all right. It is also indestructible. It spreads every-where. There is no restraining it. First it subdued the syringa, then smothered the snowball, and sought to strangle the spirea in its Laocoon embrace. It has even infiltrated the barberry bush by the porch steps, and is now springing up in

Our friend began an all-out assault against aristolochia more than a score of years ago. She smipped and clipped. She attacked it with hoe and mattack. She dug and ripped and tore. She trampled and burned, and thought she had eliminated the scourge. But not so. Aristolochia went underground. It took root beneath the porch, gathered strength, and from that inaccessible stronghold it annually sends out feelers to try to sub-

Dr. Pfeifer, of course, knows a great deal more about the nature and habits of Dutchman's pipe than we do, and by the time he has worked through the \$25,-000 grant he will know even more, including, hopefully, whether the plant's aristolochic acid has any value in cancer herapy, which was one of the objectives of his study.





FINDING METEORITES FOR PROFIT

GRAND FORKS, N.D. (AP) Meteorite hunting can be profitable, says the North Dakota Geological Survey, which is asking citizens to start hunting for the space alones.

The survey is distributing a new publication, "Moteorites in North Dakota: A Guide to Their

North Dakota: A Guide to Their Recognition," in an effort to locate unrecognized or unreported meteorites that have fallen in the state.

"Meteorites are scientifically valuable and should be made available for study," said Dr. Wilson M. Laird, head of the survey. "They are usually very old and have recorded in themselves some of the early history of our solar system."

They also can be profitable for the finder, Meteorites sell for a few dollars per pound or up to \$40 per pound, Laird said.



Two Temples Preserved By 'Surgery'

ABU SIMBEL, Egypt (AP) -The greatest archeological surgery in history is now complete and successful. The twin temples of Abu Simbel, standing safely on their new home, look down with majestic disdain on waters of Lake Namer, had once threatened

In an operation lasting 53 months archeological surgeons from France, West Germany, Italy, Sweden and Egypt cut the two temples into 5,000 blocks, each weighing 20 to 80 tons. With electronically guided saws and fine chisels, the cutting operation was undertaken with extreme care to reduce scars to a bare minimum. Linen soaked in special glue was pasted on the stone before saws went through them. This averted distortion in stone

ited, Some 195,000 cubic yards of rock was removed using only buildozers, rippers and pneu-matic tools, while the front fa-cades of the temples were pro-tected by sand filling and tem-ple characters down to the welple chambers deep in the rock were supported by steal scaf-

folding.
Stone blocks were wrapped in foam rubber and transported 220 feet higher than the old site. Each stone block was given spe cial markings to determine it relation to other blocks.

Scientists planned it so that the two temples stand on their new home facing the rising sun every morning. Sun rays pene-trate the temples chambers and corridors and engulf four prominent gods in the innermos

tury-old temples from waters rising behind the new Aswan Dam. The project cost \$38 mil-lion; the United States and Egypt bore most of this, Chemists, archeologists, architects and egyptologists used special materials to stick together the carved stone blocks. Bynthetic resin, a type of glue brosses as energy resin mortar.

known as epoxy resin mortar, was the main one. The joints between the blocks were filled with a special mor-tar and powdered sandstone mixed with an adhesive and having the same color of the stone surroundings. The joints and scars were completely dis-

Two huge protecting domes were erected on the temples and over them rocks were piled. The rocks were injected with epoxy

The next step was to remove the "bandages." Water was sprayed over reassembled chunks and the linen became loose and easy to pull away. By some error, epoxy leaked on the facade of the king's temple and caused a stain. Scientists are working to erase it.

A line of 21 stone baboons greeting the rising sun stand on top of the temple for the Phar-ach Ramses. The king's temple, dedicated to the worship of the sunged Re-harakhti, is decorat-ed at its entrance with four seated colossi of Ramses, each hearing an inexplicable smirk.
Ramses, known in history as an egocentric Pharach, kept an

elaborate harem of more than 70 wives. He preferred the beau-tiful, shapely Nefertari for whom he built the small temple and dedicated it to Hat-hor, th goddess of dance and music. Ramses had 111 sons and 6 daughters. Nearly 1,700 workmen and 200
