Gromyko Defends Czech Invasion

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP)—The Soviet Union today defended its intervention in Czechoslovakia, as essential to world peace, and at the same time held out a hand of friendship to the United States.

Czech Chiefs Arrive For Talks in Moscow

MOSCOW (AP)—Czechoslovak Communist party chief Alexander Dubcek and Premier Otdisek Cernik came to Moscow today for negotiation with Soviet leaders who six weeks ago sent troops into their liberated country.

Dubcek was reported to be seeking withdrawal of at least some of the Communist Bloc troops sent into Czechoslovakia on Aug. 20.

The airport where Dubcek's airliner landed was closed to Western correspondents. However, informed Communist sources reported that the Czechoslovak delegation was met by the top three men of the Kremlin-Soviet Communist party.

WASHINGTON (AP)—Yippie leader Abbie Hoffman was arrested today when he showed up at a House office building wearing an American flag designed as a shirt.

Arrested with Hoffman were his wife, Anita, and another Yippie-Youth International Party-Bred Fox, all of New York City.

Capitol police charged Hoffman, who has been subpoenaed by the committee investigating the disorders during the Chicago Democratic National Convention, with mutilating the American flag and resisting arrest.

MEXICO CITY (AP)—Mexican army troops silenced sniper guns early today in the bloodiest battle yet of Mexico City's student rebellion. Tanks patrolled downtown streets of the capital, due to be hosted Oct. 12 to the Olympic Games.

Police and hospitals reported 25 persons were killed in an hours-long exchange of fire set off by a rifle shot, presumably aimed at a soldier, at the crowded site of an anti-government rally Wednesday night.

PITTSBURGH (AP)—Re-elected Air Force Chief of Staff Curtis E. LeMay, a famous flying general in World War II, picked his running mate today.

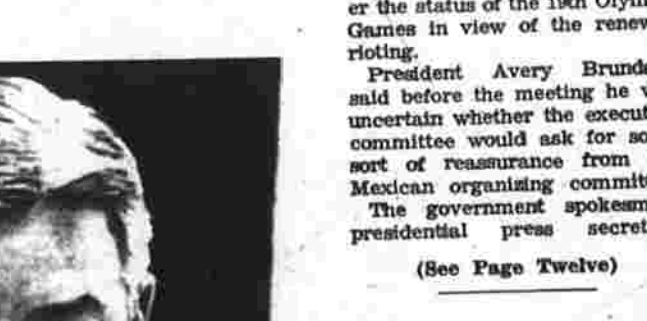
LeMay, who has been called "the architect of systematic destruction" because of the mass bombing techniques he developed in World War II, said the decision to campaign with Wallace was a difficult one.

LIMA, Peru (AP)—The Peruvian army toppled the government of President Fernando Belaunde Terry early today. Later rampaging students battled with police and troops in Lima.

A radio station which appeared to be directed by the military said Belaunde had been flown to exile in Buenos Aires.

The pre-dawn coup apparently was bloodless, but later in the morning the capital erupted in violence as student mobs upset cars and set them afire.

Trucksloads of troops were rushed into the city from outlying army encampments. The coup was staged with swift efficiency.

Dry Weather Threat to River Levels

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP) — Continuing dry weather threatens to force the level of rivers and streams farther below normal, the U.S. River Forecast center predicts.

The seven Northeast states covered by the center generally measured precipitation totals in September one-half inch to 2 1/2 inches below the average.

The driest areas were Rhode Island, eastern Massachusetts, most of Maine and the Albany, N.Y., area.

The St. John River in northern Maine was at record low levels for the third straight month, and prospects for the New York-New England region were for more dry weather in October, the forecast center said.

Some places washed for less rain in September, however. Andover, Mass., for example, had 5.56 inches during the month, and precipitation was near or above normal in an area extending from western Massachusetts through southern Vermont into central New Hampshire.

The end of September arrived with the New York City reservoir system at 75 per cent of capacity, the Albany system at 80 per cent and Connecticut reservoirs at 86 per cent of capacity.

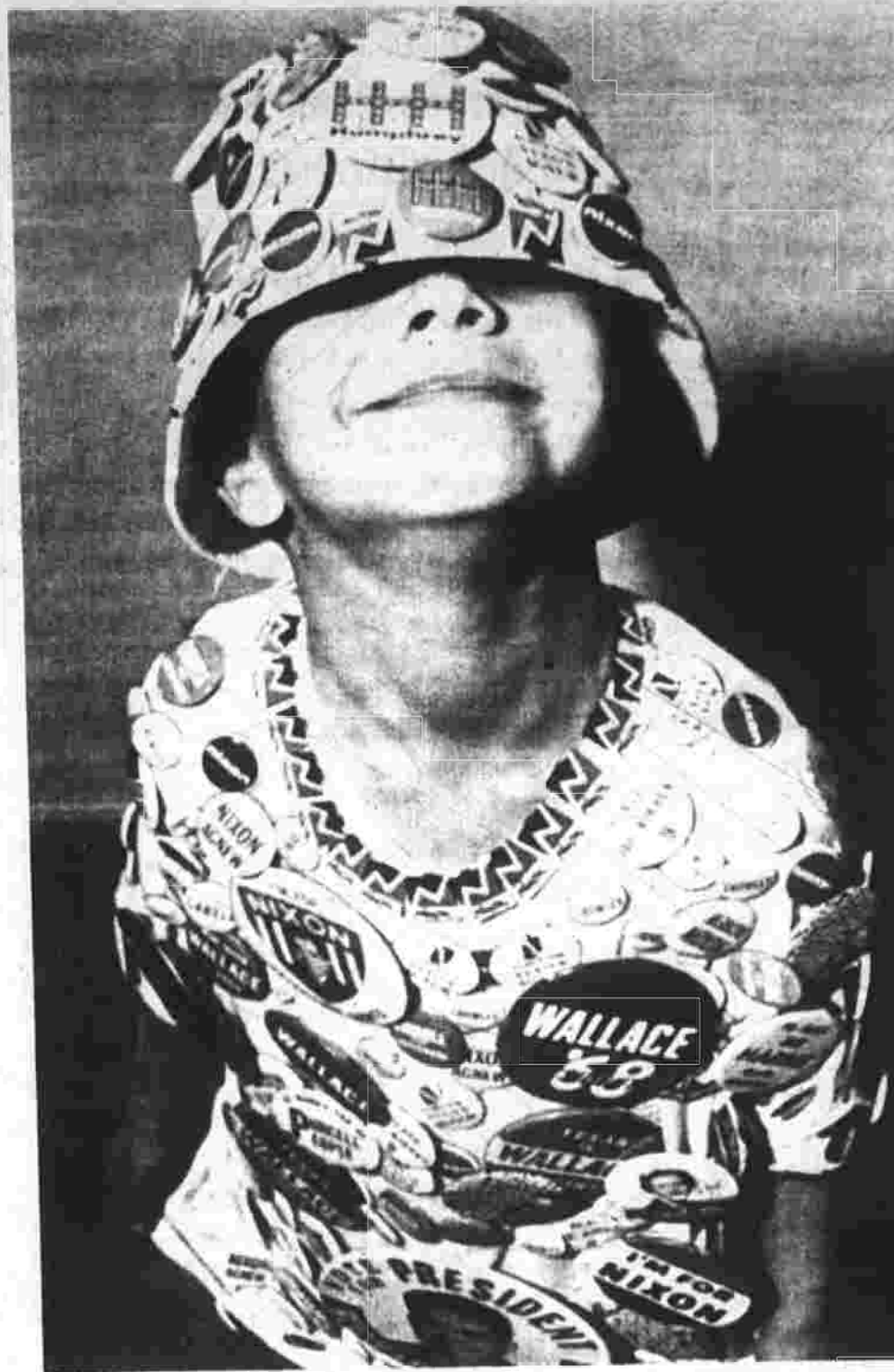

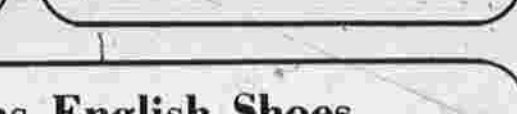

Honor Medal Awards  
Higher in Viet Action  
WASHINGTON (AP) — The proportion of Medals of Honor awarded for heroic action in Vietnam is higher than for both World War II and Korea, Pentagon spokesman figures indicate.

An estimated 1.5 million men have served in Vietnam and 5 have been selected to receive the nation's top award for valor — about one of every 30,000 sent to the war.

Of the 5 million who served in Korea, 121 — or one of every 4,000 — received the medal. In World War II 431 medals were awarded, about one for every 4,700 of the approximately 16.1 million who served.

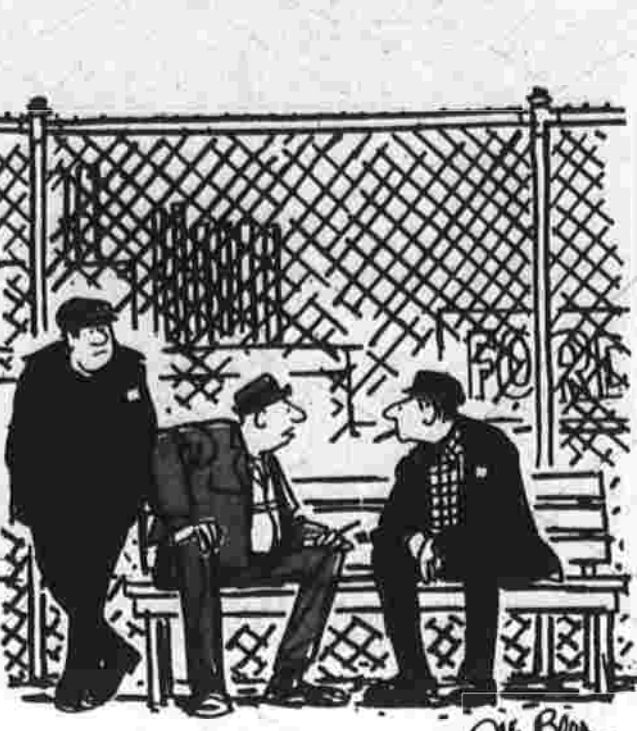

SAIGON (AP)—Allied forces killed 150 enemy troops in a new outbreak of heavy fighting near the Cambodian border, along the jungled approaches to Saigon, military spokesmen reported today.
Enemy gunners shot down a U.S. helicopter ferrying ammunition in the embattled South Vietnamese mercenary in the area. Four Americans were killed and two wounded.

In one encounter Thursday night police fired into a crowd of students, killing one and wounding several. Five photographers taking pictures of the incident were arrested.

MEXICO CITY (AP)—Stunners halted trolley cars near an Olympic field and armored cars kept their guns trained on some Mexico City newspapers reported death tolls as high as 30. There was no official estimate of the number wounded, but it appeared to be in the hundreds. Various sources reported between 1,000 and 1,500 arrested.

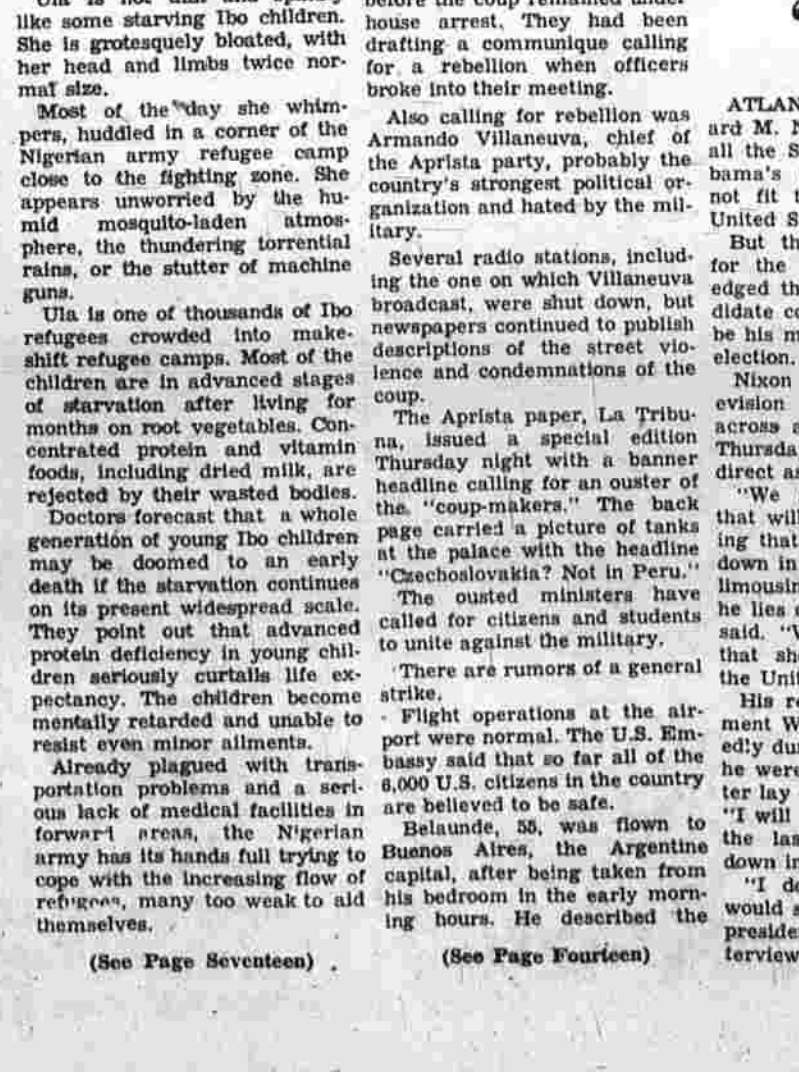
HUAC Probe Is Halted
