The 1952 Parallel

The potential parallel between the war in Korea and the presidential campaign of 1952 and the war in Vietnam and the presidential campaign of 1968 has suggested itself, inevitably, to many of us. Now it has suggested itself to the particolar individual who is the most important single indivudual it could possibly reach -Richard Nixon.

It made its hopeful appearance in the question and answer session Nixon conducted with publishers and editors in Washington Monday afternoon.

And the way it appeared was in Mr. Nixon's suggestion that, given certain military conditions in Vietnam, he, as an incoming new and freer President, might be able to agree to peace terms that the Johnson Administration, with all its many and tangled commitments on the record, could not accept now.

Along with this suggestion, Mr. Nixon ointedly recalled that General Dwight Eisenhower "did not indicate exactly in 1952 how he would end the war." But how Eisenhower, as President, did end the war has become open history. He ended the war by being able to accept, because of his military repuion, peace terms in Korea which Truman was atraid to accept for fear he would be accused of being "soft" on Communism.

Mr. Nixon, of course, would bring into the Presidency the same particular pressible John Birchers, would be likely to accuse him of having become an ap-

Being sufe on that score, a Nixon as President could, just as Elsenhower did in 1953, take a peace settlement in Vietnam that might be highly controversial if a Humphrey were trying to sell it to the nation. This could obtain even if it were true,

which the actual record does not happen to indicate, that Nixon has been more hawkish on Vietnam than has Humphrey as a supporter and defender of Lyndon Johnson's decisions there. The only really basic difference in the

1952 and the 1968 situations may be the difference in the nature of the two wars itself - the one a police action being waged legally and with full moral justification under the flag and the law of the United Nations - the other a unilateral enterprise on the part of the United States being waged outside the United Nations sanction for purposes which are highly controversial in this country itself and throughout the world. As for the parallel which does exist -

the potential importance of the election to peace-making - it is good news that it has found its place in the Nixon mind and awareness and potential poli-

Russia's Exchange, Friend For Foe The statement in Prayda that the people of Czechoslovakia will have to show friendship for the Russian troops before the Russian troops can ever be withdrawn is fatefully clear evidence of the dilemma upon which Russian power has now impaled itself. A relatively few weeks ago, Osechosio

akis was Russia's friend, and the people of the country remembered Russian roops primarily as the troops who had berated them from the Nazis. The ogical friendship between Czechoslovakia and Russia might have continued ndlessly, if only it had been possible for the two countries and their politicisms o strike some kind of compromise in the way their internal cultures and atnospheres would differ.

When Russia used its troops in th effort to reassert totalitarian control of the internal details of Czechoslovakian life, the troops which thought they were going to somebody's rescue found themes received with enmity and the thing of a hatred.

The potential, natural friendship which ad existed between Russian troops and the Czechoslovakian people ever since 1945 was suddenly dead, totally dead. Now Russia, having made its troops target of Czech hatred, tells the Czechs the troops will have to remain

But the only possible way for the Czech

the Russian troops would be to see their backs as they retreat over their own borders, and then not see them at all for a long, long time.

What Russia says it wants Russia has made it impossible for Russia to have. By invading a country, it has lost it. By surrounding the Czech people, it has lost them. A fe wweeks ago it had a willing, voluntary ally. Today, and far into the future, it has only a sullen

It has been an idiotic exchange. And it is an idiotic world in which any great power seeking security acts so much against its own real interests.

Colorado Offers New Category in Child Medicine

DEOVER, Colo. (AP) - A new kind of medical practioner will be trained at the University of Colorado Medical School in attempt to meet an impending crisis in health care for chil

The work will have a range broader than a nurse's but narower than a doctor's. The orkers will meet the medical seeds of children who don't require special attention or care or serious allments. This new category of medicine it doesn't have a formal ame yet—is the brainchild of

Dr. Henry K. Silver of the medical school's department of pechildren already are "receiving grossly inadequate total health mre," And, he said, "It's going to get much worse," He said estimates place the

child population of the UNITED States at 76 million by 1980. To provide adequate health care or these children an additional 100,000 pediatricians need to be trained by then, he said. The quota cannot be met, even allowing for a drastic inrease in the present rate of fewer than 1,000 pediatricians

entering practice each year. Silver's plan will begin to become a reality when the first group of trainees starts classes With this specialized training, the new practitioner will be ready to see patients after five years of post-high school study, ompared with 11 years to put a

ediatrician into practice and nine years for a general practi "This is not a substitute for a toctor, but entails more actual responsibility than a nurse or some form of medical techni-

cian," he explained.

The training period can be shorter, he said, because the courses will be focused mainly on the needs of children. This abbreviated training should make the program attractive to hose such as women who want a medical career along with marriage and family—who don't want to spend the time required o become a doctor, Silver said. "This opens the health profession to people who might have had to select another area of Silver said. The pay, he \$10,000 to \$12,000, with increases

up to \$15,000. The training would include woyyears of undergraduate study, two years at the medical school in basic sciences and clinical experience, and a one-year intermship. Those completthe course would be awarded bachelor's degrees.

These new workers—they may be called "child care associates" or some similar name -would undergo examinations and certification by the Colora-do State Board of Medical Ex-

uminers before starting pracder supervision in offices of pri-vate physicians or public health departments. They will be able to handle about 80 per cent of he patient load seen by a pediarician on a normal day. The doctor would be freed for

more seriously ailing patients, those with special problems, for research or for keeping himself up to date.

Medical societies in Colorado have approved the plan, and an advisory committee from these groups is drawing up enabling legislation to be placed before the Colorado legislature when it convenes in January.

PAPER PICNICS

NEW YORK (AP) - Now that fall is here and the flys and ants have stopped swarming, plenics will again be a favorite means of outdoor entertain-ment. Besides the food, the only ingredient you need for a suc-cessful outdoor party is paper. Here from the Hudson Consumer Council are some tips on how to make paper work for you:
Out of paper towels you can

An original way to pack paper An original way to pack paper naplcins and utensils together comes out so pretty it looks like a centerpiece.
