Opening lead—Jack of clubs. When South played today's hand the other players were sure he had shrewdly chosen a second of the world record for going down at six hearts. He won the first trick with the ace of clubs and took a diamond finesse at once.

West won with the king of diamonds and returned club to the king. South drew trumps with the ace and ten and tried another diamond finesse. As West dealt the queen of diamonds South spread his hand and claimed the rest.

As West dealt the next hand North patently observed: "You could have made that hand."

What do you say?

SEC Considering Aid Rule Changes

WASHINGTON (AP)—Investment advisers and stock brokers who advertise past performance to investors are being asked to provide more information about their records.

The Securities and Exchange Commission is considering a rule change that would require advisers to provide more information about their records.

Specific mention of one investment recommendation in an advertisement would have to be accompanied by all recommendations—the last as well as the good ones.

The SEC would order to provide a full list on request under the rule being considered but "the advertisement cannot list some and omit the rest in a list."

Earnings Increase

WASHINGTON (AP)—Gains of some 40 million American workers rose an average 4 cents to \$2.00 an hour last month, the highest increase for a September in two years, the Labor Department said.

The previous auction record for a Renoir work was \$200,000 in Paris in 1966 for his "Portrait of Marie Perle."

The Renoir landscape was sold to the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York, by Mrs. W. Clifford Klein of Walpole, N.H.

Of five works by Camille Pissarro, also consigned by Mr. and Mrs. Hens, two surpassed the previous auction record for works by Pissarro, at \$165,750. They were 66 "Jardin des Pigeons, Matinee de Printemps," which went to an unnamed private collector for \$200,000, and "Le Pont-Neuf, Paris," which went to Nathan Perlmutter of Chicago for \$210,000.

The one Picasso in the auction, "Paysage de Goul," from the artist's Rose period, went to an unnamed Swiss buyer at \$40,000. The auction record for a Picasso work is \$32,000.

DisAlvo to Try Blocking Film

BOSTON (AP)—Albert Desalvo, 37, the self-described Boston Strangler was due in federal court today to try to block showing of a movie based on his stranglings.

Desalvo won a court order from Judge W. Arthur Garrity in U.S. District Court, allowing him to appear for a hearing on the petition filed by his lawyer, Thomas Troy.

Desalvo is serving a life term in prison for crimes not connected with the stranglings.

Troy asked an injunction to block showing of the 20th Century Fox film, "The Boston Strangler," charging it distorts Desalvo's life and would prejudice any further attempt to gain his freedom from prison.

Desalvo, who claimed he is responsible for the deaths of 13 women in the Greater Boston area, was convicted for a series of sex attacks on four women.

Resignation Accepted

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP)—President Charles Helou has accepted the resignation of Premier Abdullah Yafi's cabinet.

The move came during the Cabinet's regular weekly meeting Wednesday to discuss Yafi's dispute with Justice Minister Sulaiman Franjeh over a reshuffle in the judicial corps.

Education Minister Jan Aza resigned earlier in the week.

President Helou asked Yafi to carry on as caretaker until a new Cabinet is formed.

Flag-Raising Rival

HONG KONG (AP)—Pro-Nationalist and pro-Communist Chinese shipyard workers fought with chairs, iron bars, and tools today in a brawl over the raising of a Nationalist Chinese flag.

Police said six were hospitalized and four injured in the riot.

The fight started when a group of Nationalist supporters started to raise the flag at a shipyard union building and a group of pro-Communists tried to stop them.

Quebec Republic Study

QUEBEC (AP)—A proposal that Quebec become a republic within a larger Canadian republic is to be studied by the Quebec Legislative Assembly's Constitutional Committee, Premier Jacques Parizeau announced Wednesday.

The premier told a news conference that the proposal contained in a "working paper" expressing the province's views on the Canadian constitution. He also suggested a name for the Canadian republic—The Canadian Union.

The intelligence service, the Constitutional Committee said, was studying the proposal.

40 Maintain Vigil At Soviets' Trial

MOSCOW (AP) — About 40 supporters of the accused maintained a vigil in the rain outside the courthouse today as the trial of five Soviet intellectuals entered its second day.

The five defendants, including Pavel Litvinov, grandson of a former Soviet foreign minister, are accused of organizing an illegal demonstration on Red Square Aug. 25 protesting the invasion of Czechoslovakia.

One of the accused, Mrs. Larisa Danilov, said on the stand Wednesday that she felt it was necessary to express her opposition to the invasion. She said she did not feel she had broken any laws.

Mrs. Danilov's husband is serving a term in a labor camp for writings that authorities considered anti-Soviet.

Western correspondents are barred from the trial, but twice Wednesday a court spokesman gave foreign newsmen some information on the proceedings.

Near the end of the first session, he said, the five had admitted the case "with no consideration themselves innocent."

They are accused of violating public order and slandering the Soviet Union. The offense carries a penalty of up to three years in prison.

In addition to Litvinov and Mrs. Danilov, the defendants are:

Vladimir Remizov, a linguist, and Vladimir Dremlyagin, unemployed.

He said signs carried by the demonstrators have not been submitted yet as evidence so that the trial has retained a non-political tone. The article under which the five are charged is considered a criminal offense.

Persons convicted of violating it usually are sent to camps for common criminals, not political offenders.

In early afternoon the crowd outside the courthouse was reduced to about 200 workers who surrounded friends of the defendants when they talked with correspondents. The conversations were not interrupted, however.

A middle-aged man in a cloth cap pulled to a group of correspondents and shouted at them. Friends of the accused "know much as they pay you!"

A woman, apparently in her sixties, who said she worked at a factory down the street, shouted "Fascist devils" at the sympathizers.

The workers, apparently all politically reliable from the Soviet point of view, engaged in lively arguments with the sympathizers.

Cleveland Mayor Cites Plan for Enforcing Law
CLEVELAND, Ohio (AP) — Mayor Carl B. Stokes, troubled by racial unrest in Cleveland, announced Wednesday a \$11 million program to improve law enforcement.

The Negro mayor also re-named Police Chief Michael J. Blackwell, 56, and gave the \$2.2 million a year post-graduate Inspector Patrick L. Gerty, 40.

Blackwell, who was appointed police chief when Stokes took office last November, turned down an offer to become a consultant to the police department and said he would rather go back to being an inspector.

Stokes told a news conference he would ask City Council for funds to overhaul the police communications system and to establish a modern command center to coordinate police response to crime calls.

He said he would fully detail the program later, but the immediate aim was to correct the "internal breakdown of police morale and discipline."

Relations between members of the 2,500-man police department and City Hall became strained after the July 28 sniper incident when 10 persons, including three white policemen, were killed after a group of black nationalists opened fire on police.

Stokes withdrew white police and National Guardsmen from the Glenville area the night after the shooting. Black community leaders and Negro policemen patrolled the streets.

Although Stokes' decision was later praised by some persons as having prevented more bloodshed, the Fraternal Order of Police strongly criticized the mayor's actions.

The order demanded the resignation of safety director Joseph F. McManamon. A resolution calling for Blackwell's resignation was dropped by view of the police chief's age.

There were reports that patrolmen were broadcasting derogatory remarks about Stokes over the police radio and refusing to answer calls to Negro areas.

Stokes referred to the worsening situation last month in a televised address in which he blamed the Glenville incident for "a tense mood in our city."

He said the tragedy "has stirred the fears and suspicions of so many, turning police against citizen, citizen against citizen, governmental official against governmental official, black against white."

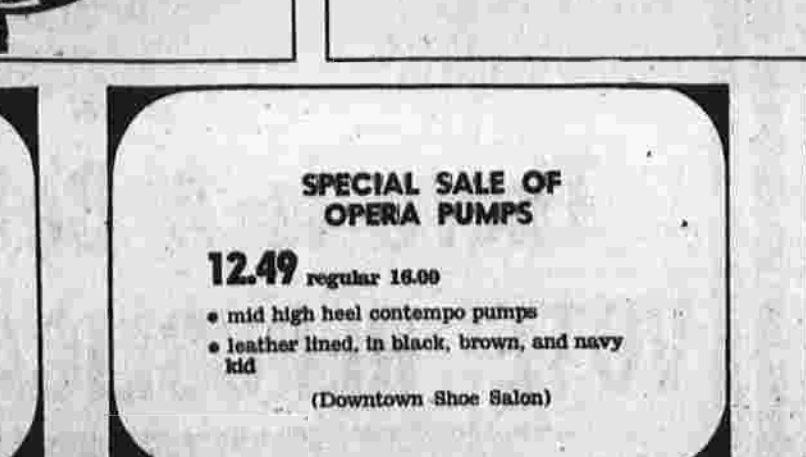

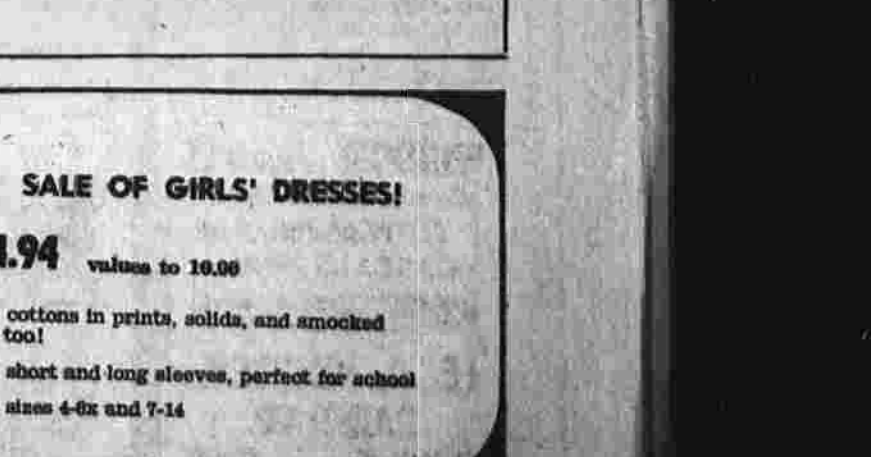

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Johnson has given the go-ahead for negotiations on sale of 50 P-4 Phantom jet fighters to Israel to help rebuild her deterrent force.

Moving South Is Denied

STRAFORD, Conn. (AP)—An official of Avco Corp. has denied a report that its Lycoming Division plans to move most of its operations to the South and reduce employment here.

The production area at the Stratford plant, which was closed Tuesday by Robert M. Cook of New Haven, candidate for Congress of the American Independent Party.

Cook did not question the move, but argued that people in the surrounding community have had nothing to say in the corporation's planning.

Their Effect on Women Medical Science Reviews Potent Powers of Hormones

By ALTON BLANKENHEIMER
NEW YORK (AP)—Through the potent power of hormones, modern women are winning greater ability to say yes or no to the prospect of having babies.

Speckhals in obstetrics around the world are engaged in current studies to learn how to apply the hormonal action in aid of childless women.

The batches of gonadotropin, some obtained from the urine of women past menopause or of child-bearing age, vary in their potency or content of the two principal hormones, Dr. Hanskuhn explains. Even childless women may be producing some gonadotropin hormones on their own. An additional amount may bring about ovulation of more than one egg.

When that happens, as with Mrs. Thomas in England, motherhood is in her future. Problems of how to specify the exact dosage of a hormonal hormone, Dr. Hanskuhn says, still being worked out.

For some women, Dr. Hanskuhn says, the hormone may produce a huge and serious enlargement of the ovaries, with some women having to be hospitalized to Amiotin in emergency. And hormones are also vital to the complicated processes of human conception and birth.

A high birth rate of this process is ovulation, the cyclical release of a mature ovum or egg from the stomach of some 100,000 eggs contained in the ovaries of a female child at her own birth.

This maturation and release of a monthly egg is controlled by a hormone, gonadotropin, produced by the pituitary gland at the base of the brain.

Gonadotropin is a mixture of hormones. One important one, FSH, the follicle stimulating hormone, and another is luteinizing hormone, which is essential for production of an egg that could meet with a male sperm to begin new life.

Peru Takes Over U.S. Oil Complex

LIMA, Peru (AP)—Peru's revolutionary military government took over a \$200-million American-owned oil field complex Wednesday in a move that could set off a new round of the oil price war.

The action against International Petroleum Corp., a subsidiary of Standard Oil of New Jersey, also could allow foreign investment which Peru needs.

President Juan Velasco Alvarado announced the seizure by the armed forces of the country's major petroleum complex in a speech broadcast to the nation shortly after noon.

The revolution is on the march," said Velasco, a general in the coup that overthrew and ousted President Fernando Belaunde Terry last Thursday. He was cheered by several hundred military officers crowded into the ballroom of the presidential palace.

It was not clear from Velasco's announcement how much competition—if any—would be allowed to International Petroleum.

In New York, Standard Oil of New Jersey issued a statement saying it learned of the seizure from news dispatches. It called the action "clear violation of international law and laws of Peru."

"However," a spokesman said, "the company said that full implications of the actions by the military regime are not yet clear. It hopes that once the

regime understands the true nature of the prior settlement, it will in all fairness recognize its validity."

That settlement, negotiated in August under Helms, called for the government to take over the oil field in December. No payment was involved, but the government gave up its claim of \$14 million in taxes, which it said were owed back to 1964 when the American firm bought the field from a British company.

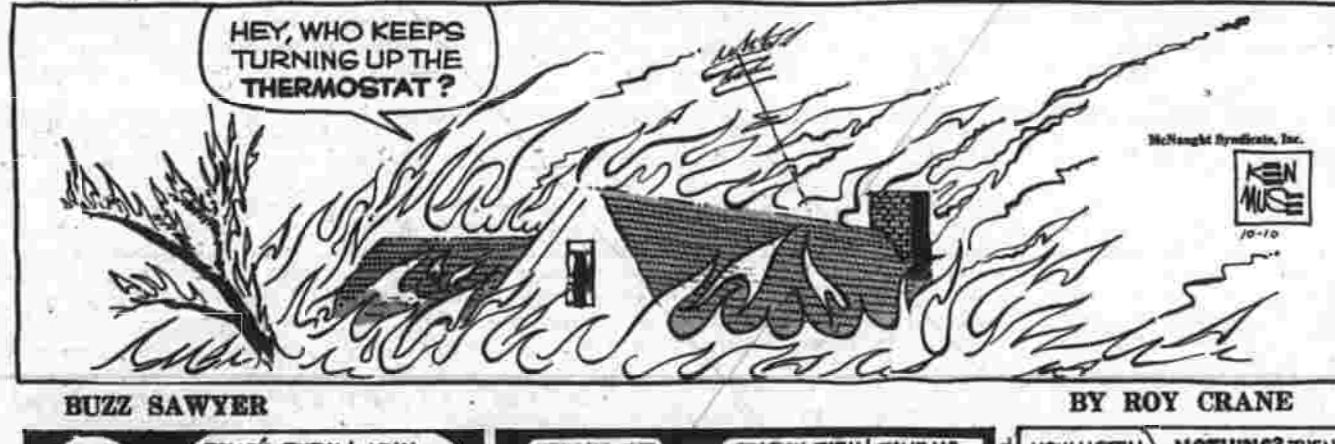

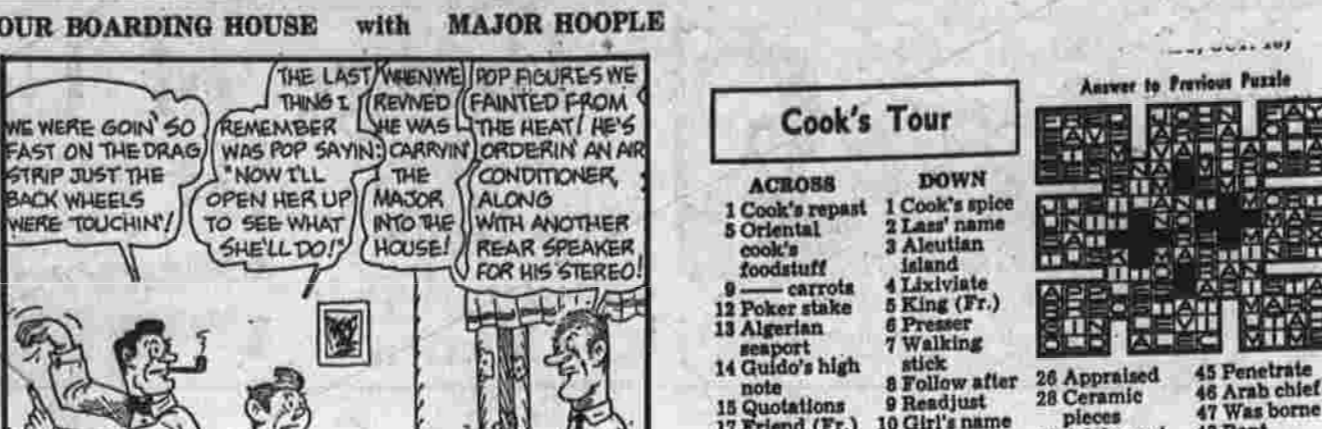

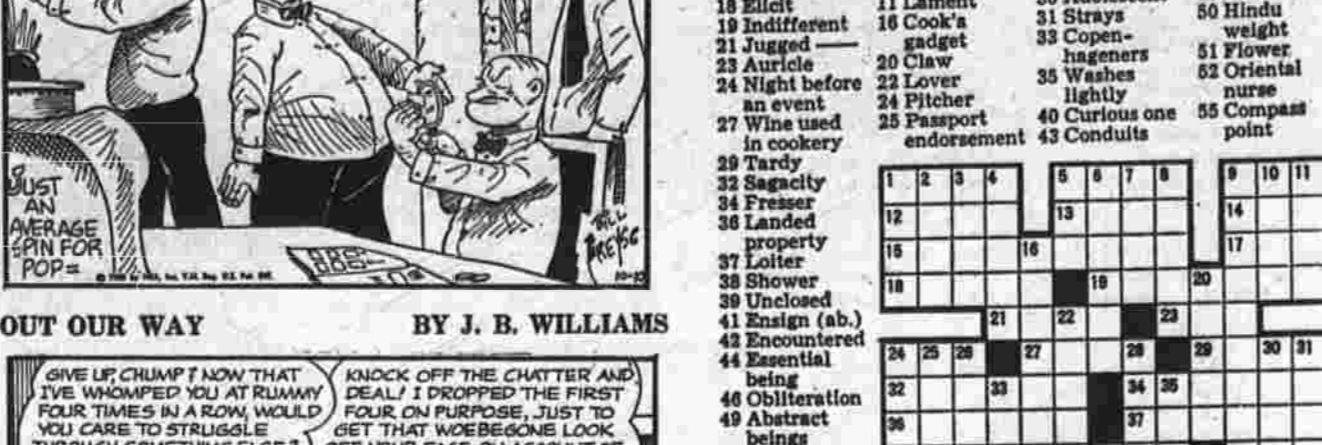
