Hebron Session Set For Parents At School

Parent teacher conferences will be held at the Hebron elementary school on Nov. 12, 13 and 14. These will be half-day sessions with school ending at 1 p.m. Conference sign-up sheets will be sent home the week preceding the conference.

The school has received large pieces of cardboard suitable for charts, flash cards and posters from the Robertson Paper Company of Montville. They have also received a supply of 9 by 12 foot long sections of styrofoam suitable for sculpturing and other art projects.

The public health nurse serving the town of Hebron and the elementary schools reports that she has spent a total of 90 hours and 46 minutes in the schools in the 19 school days in September. This averages more than the time allotted to both the elementary schools, she reports.

In her report, the nurse brought to the attention of the school board that many non-professional duties performed by the nurse this month properly were the duties of a health aide.

Paul White, principal of the school, stated in his report that 27 children had been seen in the school office for health problems when the nurse was not in the building. He stated that it was extremely difficult for the principal and secretary not having at least a full-time health aide in the building with nearly 500 people in the school daily. White also stated that valuable administrative time was being spent on these chores.

Get First Aid
The public health nurse reported that she had seen 63 students for first aid due to accidents and 64 students for illness. She has seen 23 pupils, 17 parents and 11 teachers for health counseling; recommended 12 students for health appraisals by family physicians; and recommended that five children with vision defects, two with hearing defects and 13 with tooth defects to seek professional care. She also held five nurse teacher conferences and made four visits outside the school to or in behalf of pupils.

The nurse reported that she spent much time in organizing records, orientation, inventory, supply of the health rooms and establishing routine.

The nurse has provided each teacher with a small first aid kit to prevent some unnecessary visits to the office or health room when the nurse is not immediately available.

Vision screening has begun in the lower grades and weighing and measuring for the fall term has been started.

Bolton Assessors Set Declaration Date For Property

The Board of Assessors have set meeting dates for the declaration of property other than real estate or registered motor vehicles.

The dates are Oct. 6 from 9 a.m. to noon and 1 to 4 p.m.; Oct. 9 from 9 a.m. to 12 noon, 7 to 9 p.m.; Oct. 30 from 1 to 4 p.m. and 7 to 9 p.m., and Nov. 1 from 9 a.m. to noon and 7 to 9 p.m.

The assessors meet in the town office basement conference room. They have supplied the following information.

Personal property held by the owner on Oct. 1 must be declared by the owner during the month of October to avoid a 10 per cent penalty imposed by the Connecticut state statutes. Personal property consists of aircraft, machinery, water power, dams, horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, poultry, commercial furniture and fixtures, boats, farming tools, tractors, road machinery, farm produce, mechanic's tools, goods of manufacturers, traders and merchants, utility equipment and fixtures and all other taxable goods.

Disabled veterans, disabled veterans 65 and older and the blind must file proof with the town clerk. Farmers must apply for exemption with the assessors during October.

Home owners 65 or over, subject to certain other limited conditions, may qualify for a \$1,000 exemption and tax freeze. Applications should be made to the assessors' office between Oct. 1 and Jan. 15.

Placing Wallace on Ohio Ballot

By JACK BELL, AP Political Writer. WASHINGTON (AP) — The Supreme Court decision making George C. Wallace the first moderate third party candidate to get on the presidential ballot in all states holds important implications for his future and that of the Republican Party.

What Wallace has done, however, goes beyond the court's decision that Ohio's law requiring 400,000 signatures to get a presidential candidate on the ballot cannot be justified.

The former Alabama governor has organized, with strictly Alabama advice and assistance, a campaign which will require the gathering of 40,000 signatures to get his name before the voters.
