Blind See Again With 'Windows'. Surgeon Reports

ing the windows of the eyes, a pecialist reported today. One man passed his driver's icense test a few weeks ago. said Dr. Louis J. Girard, of Baylor University College Medicine in Houston, Tex.

A woman, blind for 48 years since childhood-now is able to see the children she reared, The operation putting an arti-

ficial cornea or "window" into the eye might help 10 to 15 per cent of the millions of blind people throughout the world, Gir-

It applies only to those whose own corneas have been damaged by chemical burns or other inturies or certain diseases, or who have congenital defects affecting the cornea, he said in a port for the American College

f Surgeons. He predicted that most opthal nologists or eye specialists should be able to perform the operation, which takes up to 11/4

Girard said he has placed artificial corneas into the eyes of 60 persons in the last 31/2 years, nd at least half are able to see. "The results are the mos gratifying I have had in my ca-Girard said in explaining the echnique at a news conference The surgery uses a tiny shaft of clear plastic which acts as a thick lens. It has skirts or pro jections of mesh which hold it in
