This is the procedure by which the Air Pollution Control Commission, a function within the State Department of Health, has promulgated the new "Regulations to Govern Open Burning" hich become effective Nov. 3.

These regulations, as they apply in all mmunities of over 5,000 population. apparently make it illegal to light almost any kind of match outdoors without obtaining an official permit first.

The exceptions which might apply to te ordinary householder include the burning of leaves and brush where no public collection is provided for leaves and brush, the outdoor cooking of food, he burning of leaves at least clearly legal in Manchester. Whether the town anintains a satisfactory system for the ollection of brush is more doubtful; it will apparently have to be determined, by somebody, whether brush can be Manchester, either cut or

The safest thing for anybody wishing to light a match outdoors for anything except cooking purposes is to try to obtain a perimit for doing so. Such permits will eventually be available, one supposes, from the "local authority" in charge of such matters. That "local authority" in Manchester is apparently going to consist of the local health of-

Undoubtedly, now that the fact that such regulations are in existence is now day home to Connecticut people for the first time, there will be some discussion of the issue, and probably some kind of effort to have the next General Assembly review the law the Commis-

sion has made.

There is some irony, perhaps, in the fact that law and regulation have crack-ed down first and apparently most effectively on the ordinary small back-yard bootire or incinerator. It can be doubted that all the bonfires in a comnamity could equal the pollution output of one asphalt plant, or that the public burning of all the leaves in Connecticut would throw as much dust and fume into the air as any ordinary hour's operation of the state's gasoline and diesel fuet vehicles on its highways.

There is bound to be, then, some feeling that the new regulations are unjust sureasonable in their interference with traditional habits of Cornecticut individuals in their own yards and on their own land. There is bound to be reballion against the necessity for a permit every time somebody wants to light a match for some purpose which is perble under the new regulations, and a general reluctance and slowness to enforce the regulations too. vania railroad, when it merged with the New York Central, was an old Atlantic steam-engine. No. 460, which was pre-served because in 1927 it made the fastest run ever from Washington to New

It took just 3 hours and 7 minutes for the 460 to make the trip, and no railroad has ever made it faster since that time Today the Penn Central is spending 44 dollars (\$11 million in federal funds) in an attempt to knock the elapsed down from three hours 30 minutes to under three hours. It is hoping to wheel out a new Budd train that can hit a top speed of 120. That will be progress of a gain. The old 460 hit 115.

How the record run was made is story in itself, as the expression goes. Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh started it all. When he returned from his solo hop to Paris, he was welcomed home in Washington by President Calvin Coolidge, June 11th, 1927. It was in the era of the newsreel companies, and compeseveral companies decided to fly their films to New York for showing in the theatres, the International Newsreel Company decided to charter a train, and rig up a darkroom in the baggage car to

develop the film enroute. So at 12:14, the 460 pulled out of Washington and between Marcus Hook and Chester, just short of West Philip, the 460 hit 115 miles an hour -without even having its throttle pulled all the way out. Even with a water stop, and a change of engines to come into New York, t train pulled into the Penn station at 3:21. The train didn't beat the airplanes to New York, but because the film was developed, the films opened first in New York, by a full hour.

Those, in short, were the days of the real railroading and the real news cam-era work.
