

Originally, the state legisla-ures picked the electors, but

was soon changed to give the job to the people.
In fact, the electors soon became rubber stamps, reflecting the result of the popular vote. This year, however, because of the uncertainty caused by a three-way presidential race, there is more chance that the electors will act independently. In order to be elected, a candate must receive the votes of at least 270 of the 558 electors. But with three major candifates this year, it is possible hat none will win in enough states to be assured 270 elector-Each state has a number of

electors equal to its senators and congressmen. For example, Maryland, with eight House has 10 electoral votes. The District of Columbia, with no congressional representation, was given three electoral votes by the 23rd Amendment. In each state, voters selecting among the various presidential candidates are actually picking rom slates of electors. In some, they vote for a whole sinte, in others for individual elector Whichever candidate gets the nost votes in the state, his elecions win. It doesn't matter if he

gets 90 per cent, or receives one more vote than each of his opponents. On Dec. 16, the electors as lected in the general election meet in their respective state capitals to cast their votes for president and vice president. With rare exceptions, electors have generally followed the in-structions of their state's voters. But they don't have to. Only 1 states have any kind of legal insruction for electors, and only three provide penalties for those who fail to follow their man-

FISHING NOTE ON SKEET

Skeet Shooting is an Ameri can invention, circa 1910. The word "skeet" itself is an archaic Scandinavian word for "shoot." The average skeet squad is composed of five people each of whom shoots a round of 25 shots. The similarity to trap shooting ends there. The skeet field is laid out in a semi-circle (or half-"clock" with eight stations for shooting. Seven stations are positioned at equal distances on the perimeter of the "clock" with the eighth in the middle on a line between position one and seven. (Station one would be the numeral 12 on a clock; position seven would be the numeral six.) High targets are thrown from semi-circle; low targets from station seven at the other end. The trap houses at station one and seven are called the "high house" and "low house." Targets are always thrown in the same pattern of flight, but the angle of the shot varies because the shooter changes positions as the skeet squad moves from station to station. Two targets are shot from each of the eight stations- one from each house. Doubles, where targets are thrown simultaneously from both houses, are then shot from stations one, two, six, and
