



Abolish The Electoral College Despite fears of a Constitutional crisis, the ration last week managed to elect a new President. The fears alone, though, should be enough to put new steam into movements to reform the electoral system.

Through the nation's history hundreds of efforts have been made to alter the method of choosing a president. Except for the Tweifth Amendment, whose main purpose was to see that there would be separate candidates for President and Vice President, all of the reform efforts One reason is simply the old one that
