The Era Of The "Power Play" ble that another minor flare-up from somebody or other might explode New York's million children out of their schools again, the New York Times proneeded beyond its conscientious effort to assess and assign the potential blame in the latest twist in a tangled issue. "Enough Of Power Plays" it said in the title for its editorial.

And the concluding sentence of its editorial went this way: "The public is sick and tired of this situation; it is not disposed to see a million chikiren victimized again by the power plays of either union or local com-

Such desperate editorialising comes close to a stand which seems to have more and more to recommend it in these roubled, tangled times of ours. It is hard to decide which side we think to be the more right in some of our campus revolts and strategies. It is hard to be a Solomon on the issues which steam up out of the ghettoes. It is difficult to weigh rival clasms for preference, gain, and privilege on scales always guaranteed to be accurate and impartial. But we could, no matter what the is-

sue, no matter how great its complexity, aim at one common standard of behavior. We do indeed have "enough of power plays." We ought to try to bind ourselves, our organizations, our associations, our causes into a code of behavior which doesn't reach for the power play no matter how completely justified and right the power play may seem to be. For it is that reach for the power tactic which, alternating back and forth, increases and multiplies and complicates the difficulty of ultimate solution. It is that reach for power which herds the small problems into bigger ones. It is the reach for power which is the com-

Usually, the power play is accompanied by a great show of righteous infignation, hypocritical though this may be in many instances. Nobody ever howled louder about his holy right to do the things he did than Hitler. But so ong as we cling to the hope that we can namege our affairs in some degree of ivilization, it might be possible for u to develop a reverse kind of formula to apply to the relationship between rightness and the use of force

One common rule for judgment might be this: That the more sure of being in the right an individual, organization, or ation be, the less likely it would be to esort to the power play to advance its

And one common rule for result and eward ought to be that whatever interest reaches for the power play first ,no matter what its degree of right, should suffer some kind of penalty for its leadership into the realm of violence, Perhaps all this calls for some new ommon rule about human nature.
