### Penn Central To The Altar

Now that the supposedly successful and prosperous new railroad giant, Penn Central, has formally been ordered to take over and begin operating the New Haven Road on Jan. 1, it would be pleasant to think of enterprising new private enterprise management forging to the fore, with imaginative ideas for transforming the New Haven Road into something clean and modern and inviting to new customers.

No such good fortune awaits us. The Penn Central is not much more likely to "think positive" with regard to the New Haven than its own last private management or its trustees in bankruptcy. It is going to have to acknowledge an obligation to continue operating the railroad. But its greatest zeal is quite likely to be the same-kind of zeal which is the only kind of zeal the New Haven has known for many years now - the zeal to reduce the number of services offered on the ground that they are not profitable.

Particularly, we can be sure that the management of Penn Central is not going to exhibit any great private enterprise ingenuity and gumption in plotting a genuine basic recovery for the New Haven until it has exhausted the poormouth, sick-bed approach with which the railroad has been eliciting generous subsidies from the taxpayers of New York, Connecticut, Rhode Island and Massa-

We can honestly think of mo reason why any corporation should risk any of its own assets or go to the bother of peddling investment risks to others for a program of improving the New Haven when it has a handsome standing chance of getting perpetual subsidy from the public just for running a steadily declining number of passenger trains. In short, the ICC order gives us the ong-awaited assurance the New Haver will be kept running. It gives us very little real hope that we will like the way it is run. It is no generous Daddy Long-Legs who is about to wed our little orphan ratiroad, but a Scrooge who will want to keep collecting from the railroad orphan's fund from four states.

He was, for instance, adviser to Governor Rockefeller during those years when Nelson was even more of a hawk than John-

The only blot on the Kissinger "hard line" developed in the early stages of the 1968 campaign. When it was decided that Rockefeller would campaign for the Republican nomination, and do so in a onition to take advantage of public dis-Husionment with the venture in Vietnam, it was to Professor Kissinger that his foreign policy mind was sent for reprogramming, Actually, the operation sever seemed too happy a success either for Rockefeller or for Kissinger, any nore than Hubert Humphrey's parallel effort to have a group of academic experts fashion a new foreign policy stance for him proved successful.

The situation at the moment seems t that Kissinger and President-elect Nixon seem to form a rather nature pragmatic pair. Kissinger, one assumes, has drifted slightly back toward the tage of the hawk. The President-

some time seemed disposed to write off the Bundy-Rostow-Rusk-Johnson bawk adventure in Vietnam as a loser, and get himself a clean slate for the future. What he wants from Dr. Kissinger then, is not any ideological reunion over Vietnam, although such a meeting of minds is probably easy for the two men, but the creation of a new foreign policy style for the future. Mr. Nixon by his own words wants us to be strong and tough and realistic, and Dr. Kissinger is persuasive and eloquent whenever he undertakes to provide the theory and argument which shows how realistic and practical and power politics tough an intellectual can be. We have a waird impression that something of this kind of intellectually-fueled foreign policy toughness, rather than the aggressiveness any military elements, is what headed us into our present trouble in Vietnam. But perhaps Dr. Kinninger is going to obtain his satisfactions by proving that an intellectual can have his finger on the bomb button without pushing it, as his White House predecessors did. They told themselves that a nation with so much power must never be afraid to use In any case, President-elect Nixon has

got himself an impressive expert. And the reassuring indication is that Dr. Kissinger, Mr. Nixon himself, and almost any individual he can select to be Secretary of State will all be almost sutomatically hesitant, in the afterlight of the Vietnam experience, about taking on any new unliateral commitment for this country to regulate the destiny of another. We hope that, next time, before our intellectual hawks take us into a war, they will at least consult the generals. And we hope that no matter what the advice around the White House, the Presidents of our future will have an occasional common sense mind of their own, as Eisenhower did, when the hawks pressed in on him, as Johnson did not.



NEWARK, N.J. (AP) —Take 2,900 workers, 2,000 pieces of heavy equipment, enough steel to build eight Eliffei Towers and you have just part of the mass being used to double the capacity of the New Jersey Tumpike. The 127-mile-long superhighway—a cotridor for traffic between New York and Philadelphia, New England and the South Atlantic States—was used by 74 million vehicles in 1967.

When the highway opened in 1962, officials estimated traffic would gradually increase to 21,5 million cars in 1975. But, as these estimates fell short, plans were made to construct an inunvation in highway engineering.

Six new lanes, three in each direction, will be constructed alongside the six existing lanes on a so-mile strip.

However, the new james will be independent of the original ones at all toil plazas and service areas. They will also be separated by a resilient steel guard rail. 

chances of encountering any crime as he makes his rounds are about zero.

His beat starts at Resolute
Bay, 1,500 miles north of Winnipeg on Cornwallis Island, and
runs north through Canada's
Arctic islands to the North Pole an area of thousands of square miles.
"I never get a good case," he

"I never get a good case," he says. "Crime just doesn't exist here as it does in other places. There has never been anything like an armed robbery.

"I have a room as a cell here, but it is usually just used for letting the old drunk cool off."



















