Unwanted Boys Get Chance at Colorado Ranch

LA JUNTA, Colo. (AP)—Colorado Boys Ranch was started nearly eight years ago for youngsters "with no place to go but into trouble."

The quotes are from Dale Judge, director of the facility in southeastern Colorado that now is a success story.

"When you handle domestic relations cases, you hear that many children have parents but no home," Judge says. "Their parents either don't want them or simply can't provide them with a home."

"These are the children with no place to go but into trouble. They certainly tend to be the ones who become delinquent. We felt there should be some place for these boys on the verge of trouble, a home base that could give them a chance to grow up as useful citizens."

The late Judge Hal Chapman of Rocky Ford, Colo., championed the idea of a boys' ranch so tirelessly that the nearby city of La Junta offered a 36-acre site that had been an air base civilian housing area during World War II.

Chapman's first to arrive at the ranch north of La Junta was a 10-year-old boy with no father. Now he is a junior at the University of Colorado.

Boys of 10 to 14 are accepted. They are assigned by age groups to dormitories, each of which is supervised by a man and his wife.

Administrator Ray R. Stett, a former Army lieutenant colonel, says that only nine per cent of the boys coming to the ranch since it was opened in April 1961 have had to be transferred to other institutions for special physical or emotional care. He said that only two per cent of the boys have had to be dropped for delinquency reasons.

Boys riding through the big state find they are coming to a real Western ranch. In the beginning the Colorado Children's Association donated 40 cows to the ranch. Now it has 88 head of cattle, 30 horses, 50 dogs, 40 sheep and four goats. The boys raise all the beef and pork consumed at the ranch.

Each boy sent to the ranch must stay until he is 18 or has finished high school, although officials may release a boy to his parents before then if they feel that his home conditions have improved.

The first six boys accepted at the ranch-one ran away some years back, but soon returned-keep their ties with it although all are in college or at vocational schools. As one 18-year-old said, "This is my home."

U.S. delegate Philip C. Habib said a call on South Vietnam's vice president, Nguyen Cao Ky, the U.S. delegation head, W. Averell Harriman, would be on the plan with Ky Thursday.

The North Vietnamese spokesman also accused the United States of two more bombings at 125 miles inside North Vietnamese territory.

"Whatever the proposal," Communist spokesman told a newspaper, "it must be made clear that the conference is of four delegations... In a word, the shape of the table must be in conformity with the four-delegation conference."

The Americans and the South Vietnamese content the peace conference is to be composed of two sides and their Communist opponents on the other. They recognize the Viet Cong's National Liberation Front, only as an outlaw group and are willing to talk with its representatives only as members of North Vietnam's delegation.

The Communists insist that the NLF is the only authentic representative of the South Vietnamese people and must have separate, equal status at the peace table.

The Communists already have rejected U.S. proposals for a rectangular table or two long tables face to face. They have called for a square table or four tables.

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NATO Allies to Launch Communications Satellite

BRUSSELS (AP) — American forces and their European allies are getting a communications satellite that will help them keep in touch on any threat from the Soviet Union.

It is due to be launched from Cape Kennedy late next year. The satellite will look something like a silver-plated balloon, some three feet across, with a stumpy antenna sticking out at the top. Its 100 to 200 pounds of electronic gear will cost about \$20 million to build and shoot into orbit.

Another \$30 million is being spent on ground and sea stations under the authority of 14 nations of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. France, though still a member of the alliance, is not participating.

NATO's satellite will enable a commander at a remote but important post in the Arctic, for example, to talk secretly and almost simultaneously with dozens of other posts. They would include not only NATO's main military headquarters near Casteau, Belgium, but also for example, an airfield in the eastern Mediterranean or an air-traffic center at the entrance to the Panama Canal. These are hypothetical examples; NATO is not saying where the equipment will be installed.

The satellite will be able to handle hundreds of communications at once, including voice transmissions as well as teletype messages. It will also have "conference capability." That is, a group of commanders—or chiefs of state—each sitting in his own office will be able to hold a discussion without using commercial cable or radio links.

"There was a time," a NATO publication recalls, "when one man armed with a pair of pliers could paralyze an entire nation simply by snipping the telegraph wires. Today, instead of miles upon miles of exposed wires, a single satellite, placed beyond the range of any but the most advanced—and still uncertain—forms of attack, acts as the link between a multitude of decision centers."

"Since one can only guess at the form an emergency might take, crisis planning is almost exclusively a matter of relying on such communications."

NATO Satcom II is being built by the Philco-Ford Corp. at Palo Alto, Calif. Its eventual station will be an orbit 22,000 miles from the earth. Synchronized with the earth's movements, it will remain approximately over the same point on the earth's surface. Drift will be corrected by a motor on board, set going through radio impulses from the ground.

While waiting for Satcom II to be launched, experts from the other NATO countries are being trained on satellites belonging to the United States armed forces. This phase of the work is called NATO Satcom I.

A group of NATO countries is also working on a system of tactical communications which may one day enable compar-

atively small units to keep in touch by satellite. If that succeeds, there could be a different look to such basic military problems as how units are best put together and deployed for action—problems that depend largely on communications.

NATO officials hope the satellite program can serve as a precedent for cooperation on

and West Germany, but it is the only way in which virtually all members of the alliance can be persuaded to work together. It also has the advantage of stimulating the electronics industry in countries where it is just beginning to develop.

Udall Proposes New Mine Safety Legislation

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Frank P. Udall (D-Ariz.) today introduced legislation to set new coal mine safety standards to be included in safety legislation proposed by Interior Secretary Stewart L. Udall.

Udall announced the proposed bill Thursday at a mine safety conference he called in the wake of the mine explosion that killed 78 men in West Virginia last month.

The interior secretary would be empowered to set new safety regulations after an interim period on the basis of advanced technology or finding of new hazards.

The bill also would permit federal inspectors to order evacuation of mines in cases of "imminent danger" and permit investigation of mines for the purpose of developing health and safety standards.

Udall's bill also would set the first mandatory health standards for coal miners and standards to curb "black lung" disease—and broaden personal liability.

Coal dust density would be limited to 1 milligram per cubic meter of air. Mine operators would have to furnish each underground worker with a sterile respirator at the start of each shift, and a chest X ray once a year.

Individual coal miners could be fined \$25 to \$500 for each violation of standards. Mine operators, now subject to a \$1,000 fine for violations, could be fined from \$500 to \$100,000.

Greek Colony Rediscovered Beneath Italy

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — The director of the University of Pennsylvania museum has announced that he and an Italian archaeologist have rediscovered an ancient Greek city which disappeared almost 2,000 years ago.

Dr. Frederick G. Rahey said Thursday night the city, Sybaris, is located in what is now Italy, and lies beneath 15 to 18 feet of earth, below sea level and the water table. He said it is in an area about six miles in circumference and about a mile and a quarter inland from the Gulf of Taranto shoreline.

The announcement, made jointly by Rahey and Fred Giuseppe Foti, superintendent of antiquities of Calabria, Italy, apparently ends a century-old search by scholars of various nations for the ruins of the Greek colony.

Sybaris was conquered and destroyed by its Croton neighbors in 510 B.C. The Crotonians reportedly diverted a river over the city and submerged it.

The archaeologists said Sybaris was the largest and richest Greek city of its time, although they declined to speculate on what buried treasure might lie beneath the soil and water table.

The search, which began in 1960, was carried out by the department of antiquities and supervision of the Italian government.

Excavation was limited to test pits because of flooding threats, which the archaeologists say will present future difficulty in the uncovering process.

The Italians, however, plan a test excavation next spring.

Underground N-Test Announced by AEC

LAS VEGAS, Nev., (AP) — "It is expected all radioactive material produced in the detonation of a test series is to be set off Wednesday in a tunnel 4,000 feet below the Nevada test site.

"Persons up to 250 miles from the detonation may feel a slight earth tremor immediately following the explosion," the Atomic Energy Commission said in making the announcement Thursday.

The AEC placed the force of the explosion at at least one megaton for an antiballistic missile system.

The test is scheduled for 7:30 a.m. EST below Fabius Mesa, a flat-topped mountain that is the site of April's explosion.

Ground motion is expected to approximate that of April's "boxcar test," the AEC said, and it is considered unlikely that there will be any off-site damage to houses or buildings.

The April blast was not outside Nevada. Several persons said they felt it slightly as far away as Los Angeles and Salt Lake City.

In Salt Lake City, Director Robert E. Penland of the University of Utah's radiological health program said he felt the Nevada test site "is not a safe place for detonation." He said a much smaller blast earlier this week raised radioactive fallout over Utah to the highest level since 1962 and "that was a mere fraction of what could be released should misfortune occur in a one-megaton blast."

He also expressed concern over possible water contamination and earthquake triggering.

If the coming test suppresses the April one, it will be the largest ever set off either above or below ground in the western world. If it is one megaton in size—the equivalent of one million tons of TNT—it would be about 50 times as powerful as the bomb dropped at Hiroshima, Japan, during World War II.

Laird Faces Tough Test In Defense

WASHINGTON (AP) — Melvin R. Laird may be tested when he attempts to get into the White House as the defense secretary while he is a congressman.

The Wisconsin Republican will have to reconcile the need for new strategic weapons to stay ahead of the Soviet Union with the need to keep the defense budget from soaring out of sight.

He will have to find a way to firm civilian control in military affairs and still give greater weight and freedom to military judgment.

He will have to find a substitute for former defense chief Robert S. McNamara's "cost-effectiveness" tool, which he criticized severely, and still insure against waste in defense spending.

Laird is unique—he is the first member of Congress to step into the exceedingly tough job of running the gigantic defense establishment and shaping national policy because of economic considerations.

As a ranking GOP member of the House Defense Appropriations subcommittee, he has inherited McNamara's cost-effectiveness tool, which he criticized severely, and still insure against waste in defense spending.

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he will be on the other side of air strikes at the port of Haiphong, which was off-limits to U.S. bombers under the McNamara policy endorsed by President Johnson.

However, during the election year Laird counseled fellow Republicans to ease off on this kind of talk lest the GOP sound like a war party to the voters.

In introducing his cabinet picks to the nation last night, Nixon praised Laird as a man devoted to peace, but at the same time as one who "recognizes that America must be strong."

"I think he will bring to this position a high degree of intelligence, of coolness under fire, and also, the ability to manage people as well as weapons," the president-elect said.

Laird has had no experience as an administrator, but Nixon indicated he will appoint managers from the business world to help the veteran congressman run the Defense Department.

"We will have businessmen at top posts in the Defense Department," Nixon said.
