Nixon Urged Double Force Anti-Rackets

NEW YORK (AP) — The House Republican Task Force on Crime has urged President-elect Nixon to double the number of Justice Department lawyers assigned to fighting organized crime, the New York Times reported today.

In a Washington dispatch by Fred P. Graham, the newspaper said Nixon's most comprehensive advisers on crime also urged him to use electronic surveillance "on an extremely selective and carefully controlled basis."

The report recommended: —Increasing the number of lawyers in the Justice Department's Organized Crime Division from about 50 to at least 100 by June 30, 1970. —Working out guidelines for using electronic surveillance against racketeers. —Quickly replacing the U.S. attorneys in Brooklyn, Newark, Chicago, Detroit, Philadelphia, Las Vegas, Nev. and Columbus, Ohio.

By federal law, Hoover would have been forced to retire in 1964 at age 70 except for an exemption granted him by President John F. Kennedy. Nixon will continue to honor the exemption.

It was not certain, however, that Hoover would remain at the helm of the FBI throughout the conference—Ray Bliss, chairman of the GOP National Committee.

Once in office, presidents normally do not invite their party chairman to such sessions.

But at this preinaugural meeting it was apparent that Nixon and Hoover were meeting with him would have to give particular attention to partisan strategy in the coming congressional session, where Democrats will outnumber Republicans in both houses.

Czechs Keep Dubcek; Plan Some Reform

By FRED COLEMAN Associated Press Writer PRAGUE (AP) — Plans of a political upheaval in Czechoslovakia subsided today with the news that the Communist party will keep Alexander Dubcek as its chief and will go ahead with a limited program of economic reforms.

The party central committee, which met last week, gave Dubcek, National Assembly Chairman Josef Smrkovsky and other reformers in the party leadership more time to amend party policy.

Workers and students met throughout the weekend preparing strikes and other protests as rich more liberal laws were proposed. Instead, there was no mention of any leadership changes in the committee resolutions published today, and informed sources said there were none.

One resolution said, "The party takes the main line in the continuation of economic reforms which have been started since the 1960s."

But the resolution made clear that the economic program would be a delayed, water-tight son of the plan made before the Soviet invasion Aug. 20. It said the party would lay down a mandatory schedule for the reforms so that the committee might discuss the documents by mid-1969. In effect this shelved action for some time.

There was no mention of the earlier more ambitious plans for widespread use of profit motives and free market competition of reform by supply and demand. Instead, it said only that some factories and some industries would be freed from some dictates of the central planners.

The resolution promised a law next year that will provide conditions for enterprises and some enterprise groupings with full economic responsibility, and with possibilities to enter into independent activities...

The resolution called for closer economic ties with the capitalist West. Trade with the West was a major feature of the pre-August reform plan. But the resolution put more stress on the stronger cooperation with the Soviets.

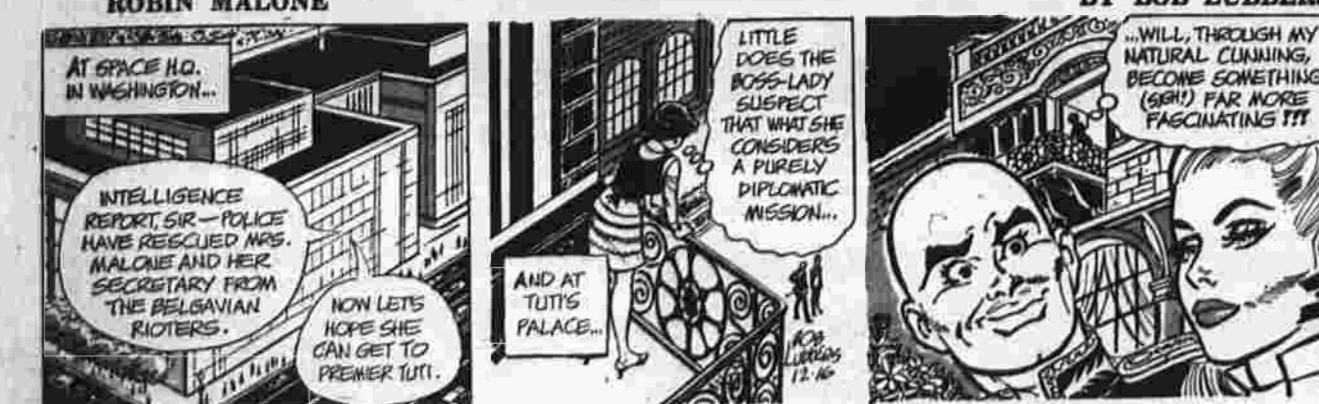

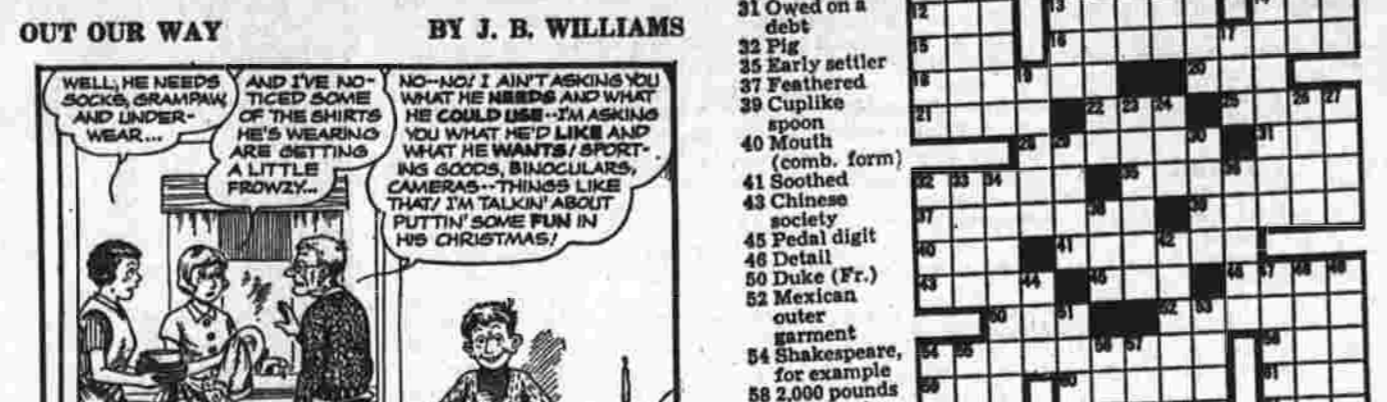

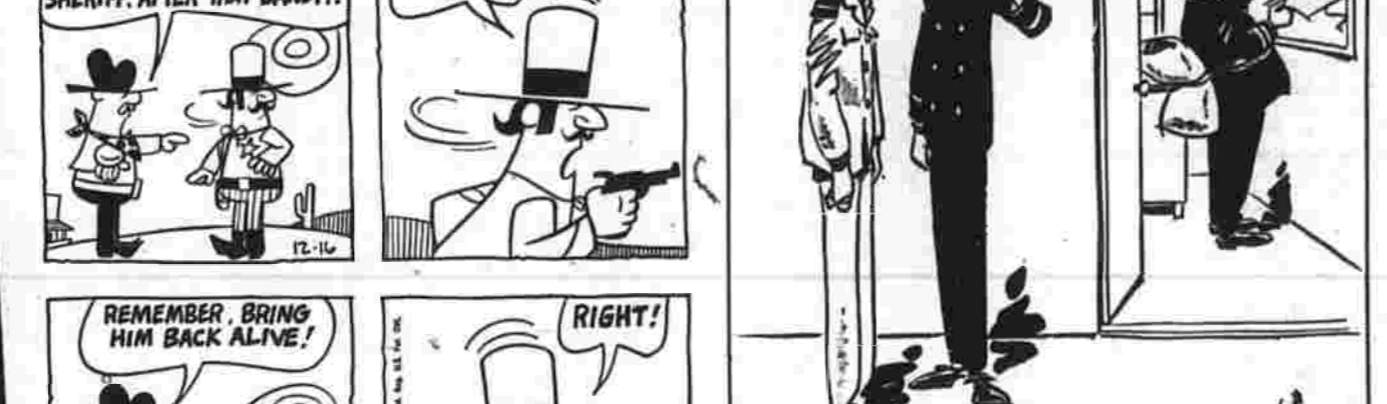
